## TRAFFIC UPDATE - Farrington Highway

### Week of Nov. 3, 2013

#### **Daytime Activities:**

- Maintenance crews will work along sections of Farrington Highway conducting maintenance work and relocating utilities where Kiewit vehicles may be temporarily parked in the highway lanes, causing a slight slowdown in traffic flow.
  - **Monday, Nov. 4 to Friday, Nov. 8 from 8:30 a.m.- 3 p.m.**
    - Inside lane closure in both directions of Farrington Highway between Kahualii Street and Waiawa Road.
- Workers will be installing traffic flow cameras at the intersection of Kamehameha Highway and Waipahu Street.
  - **Monday, Nov. 4 from 8:30 a.m.-3 p.m.**
    - One of two northbound lanes on Kamehameha Highway will be closed and traffic will proceed as usual in the second northbound lane.
    - Drivers can still turn left onto Waipahu Street.

#### **Evening Activities:**

- Utility location and relocation work will be conducted along Farrington Highway in Waipahu.
  - **Sunday, Nov. 3 to Thursday, Nov. 7 from 7 p.m.-6 a.m.**
    - East and westbound lane closure of the inside and outside lanes between Old Fort Weaver Road and Mokuola Street.
    - One lane in each direction of Farrington Highway will remain open at all times.

#### **Road Closure:**

There will be a full closure of the west-bound lanes of Old Farrington Highway between Kualakai Parkway (North-South Road) and Old Fort Weaver Road Loop **24 hours a day, 7 days a week.**

- Traffic in the west-bound direction of Old Farrington Highway will be detoured to either the H-1 Freeway or other nearby roadways.

- Drivers will be able to access the Farrington Highway in Ewa from the east-bound direction, and will be detoured onto the Old Fort Weaver Road intersection near the Kahi Mohala Behavioral Center.

Shoulder and median work signage/cones along the side of the road will mark the work area. Motorists are advised to drive with caution and provide a safe distance between themselves, the construction workers and vehicles.

## TRAFFIC UPDATE - Kamehameha Highway

### Week of Nov. 3, 2013

#### **Daytime Activities:**

- Maintenance and test shaft work will be conducted near the H-1 Moanalua Freeway On-Ramp
  - **Monday, Nov. 4 to Friday, Nov. 8 from 8:30 a.m.-3 p.m.**
    - Closure of the inside lane of the H-1 Moanalua Freeway On-Ramp on Kamehameha Highway near Aloha Stadium.

#### **Evening Activities:**

- Crews will be re-striping lanes and will alternate the closure throughout the week between outside and inside lanes nearby the HECO Waiau Power Plant and Waiau Center.
  - **Sunday, Nov. 3 to Thursday Nov. 7**
    - Left turns onto and from Kuleana Road will be restricted and detoured to Kaahumanu Street or Puu Poni Street.
    - Eastbound lane closures from 7:30 p.m.-5:30 a.m.
    - Westbound lane closures from 10 p.m.-7 a.m.
  - **Monday, Nov. 4 to Thursday Dec. 12**
    - Inside eastbound lane closure near HECO Waiau Power Plant 24 hours a day, seven days a week.
    - West left-turn from Kuleana Road will be restricted and detoured to Puu Poni Street
    - Three westbound and two eastbound lanes will be open near the HECO Waiau Power Plant and Waiau Center.
- Please check [www.thebus.org](http://www.thebus.org) for temporary bus stop relocation on Kamehameha Highway for the following stops: H-1 Freeway, Waiau Power Plant, Kuleana Road and Hila Place.
- One lane in each direction of Kamehameha Highway will remain open at all times.

Shoulder and median work signage/cones along the side of the road will mark the work area. Motorists are advised to drive with caution and provide a safe distance between themselves, the construction workers and vehicles.
