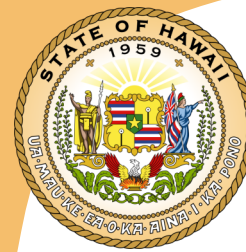
## Nānākuli & Ma'ili Beach Clean-Ups

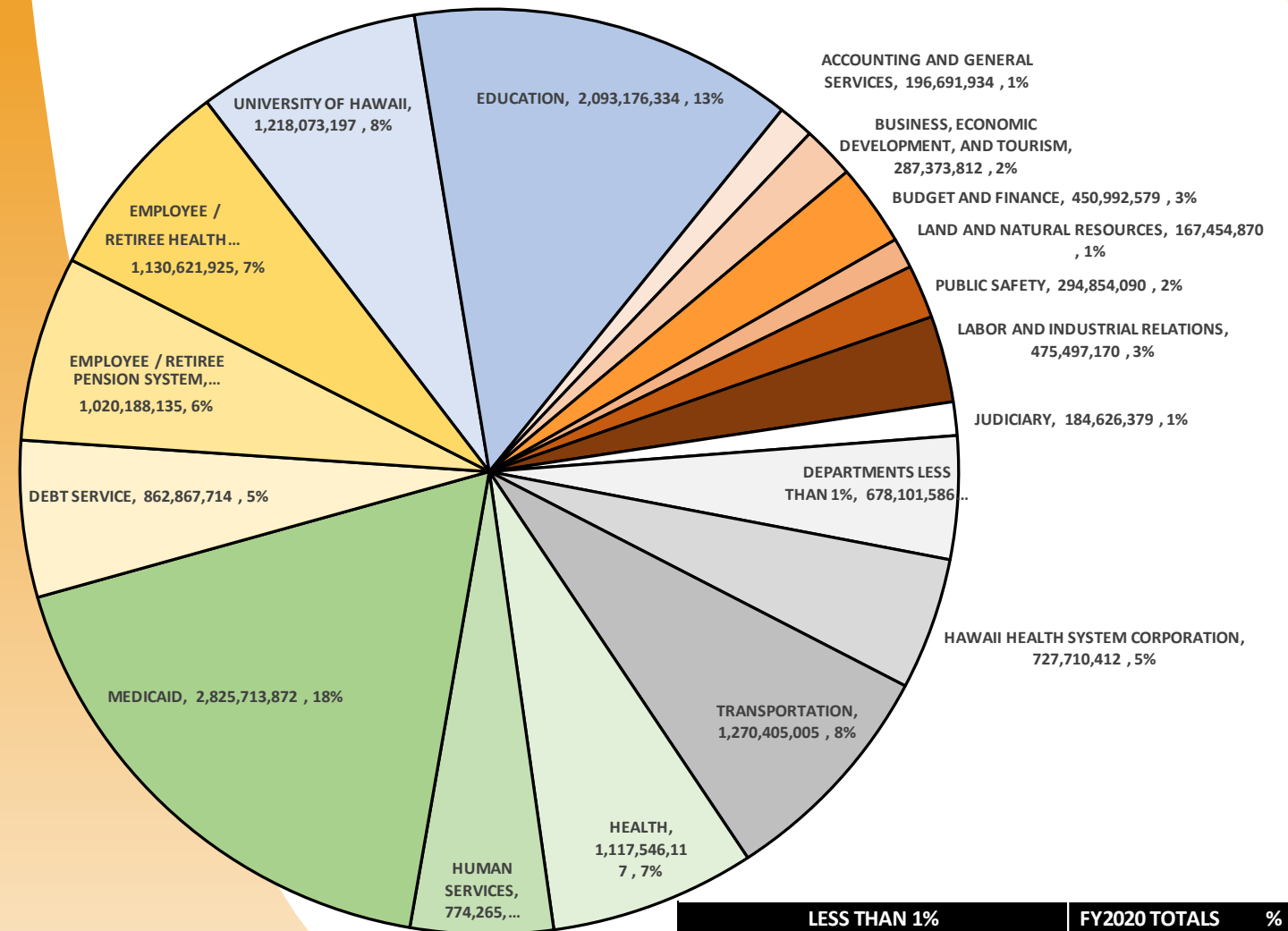
# CIP FUNDING FOR THE 2020-2021 FISCAL YEAR
