ENVIRONMENT

SB2571 SD2 HD2 CD1:

Bans the sale, offer of sale, or distribution in the State of any sunscreen that contains oxybenzone or octinoxate, or both, without a prescription.

SB3095 SD1 HD1 CD1:

- Prohibits the use of pesticide containing chloropyrifos as an active ingredient, active January 1, 2019.
- Prohibits the application of restricted use pesticides within 100 feet of school during school hours

HB2182 HD2 SD2 CD1:

Expands the mission of the greenhouse gas sequestration task force to establish short and long term benchmarks and policies to achieve a zero carbon footprint by 2045.

SB2567 SD2 HD2 CD1:

Establishes a Cesspool Working Group to develop a comprehensive plan for conversion of all statewide cesspools by 2045.

PUBLIC SAFETY SB2046 SD1 HD1:

Prohibits manufacture, importation, sale, transfer, and possession of bump fire stocks, multiburst trigger activators, and trigger cranks.

SB2087 SD2 HD2 CD1:

Amends Hawaii's Good Samaritan Law to provide civil liability exemption for persons who in good faith, without remuneration or expectation of remuneration, attempt to rescue a person with a recue tube.

HB2442 HD2 SD2 CD1:

Requires the counties to take into custody any abandoned vehicle on a public road within ten business days.

SB 2791 SD2 HD1 CD1:

Enables juvenile justice reform through the establishment of a Youth and Family Wellness Center that provides assessment services and programs to prevent juvenile delinquency and recidivism and support rehabilitation.

Governor's deadline for action: June 25th - Notice of intent to veto; July 10th - Veto deadline
