# Mililani Recognized as a Tree City USA

Mililani Town and Ohana Military
Communities were both named as 2018 Tree
City USA by the State of Hawai'i and the
Arbor Day Foundation in honor of their
commitment to effective urban forest
management. These communities achieved
Tree City USA status by assembling a tree
board for their community, implementing a
tree-care ordinance, maintaining an annual

community forestry budget of at least \$2 per capita, and by organizing an Arbor Day observance and proclamation.

Mililani Town welcomed its new designation as a Tree City USA by planting the first of many fruit-bearing trees for its growing community fruit forest.

The Tree City USA program is sponsored by the Arbor Day Foundation in partnership with the USDA Forest Service and the National Association of State Foresters. With the guidance of the Kaulunani Urban and Community Forestry Program, the state of Hawai'i has been proudly participating in the Tree City USA program since 1976.

Trees not only help to improve the visual appeal of a neighborhood, they are vital for climate change mitigation, storm management, they increase property values, reduce home cooling costs, remove air pollutants, and provide wildlife habitat among many other benefits.
