NO VOTES AT THE CAPITOL

RANKED CHOICE VOTING - HB 210, HD1 - This bill would allow ranked choice voting in primary elections, which would likely eliminate Republican contenders from the ballot.

APPLIANCE EFFICIENCY STANDARDS - HB 556, HD1 -This bill would create state appliance efficiency standards on computers and monitors, faucets, certain fluorescent lamps, showerheads, and sprinklers. This bill is duplicative of federal law, and would restrict the number of products available to the consumer in Hawai'i.

SOLAR ON AG LANDS - HB 593, HD1 - This bill would permit the construction of large utility-scale solar projects on our already limited agricultural lands. Agricultural lands should be used for agricultural purposes.

FEE INCREASES - HB 1048 - This bill would increase fees related to the collection of the fuel tax, liquor tax, and cigarette and tobacco tax. The language in the bill was vague and left the authority to increase the increase via rulemaking, to the state Director of Taxation.

DECRIMINALIZATION OF MARIJUANA - HB 1383, HD2 -The current draft of this controversial bill decriminalizes the possession of 3 grams or less of marijuana, making the new penalty similar to obtaining a traffic infraction with a fine of \$200.
