HURRICANE SEASON HAS BEGUN

Hurricane season is from June 1 to November 30. A hurricane is a tropical cyclone with maximum sustained winds of 74 mph or higher. Though high winds and flying debris are extremely dangerous, it is storm surge that presents the greatest threat to life and property along the coast. The Central Pacific Hurricane Center is forecasting a 70% above normal season with potentially 5-8 tropical cyclones. The Hawaii Emergency Management Agency suggests being prepared for at least 14 days. Are you 2 weeks ready?

Make a Plan Now

- Make an Emergency Kit: Have at least 14 days of food and water and all necessary emergency items
- **Family communication:** Identify a family member who lives out-of-state who everyone can notify when they're safe
- Meeting place: Choose a physical location to meet if communication between family is down
- Plan escape routes: Map out two escape routes for each room of your home and do drills with family members
