SB2056

RELATING TO HEALTH.

Establishes provisions relating to default beverages offered with children's meals. Provides that a restaurant that sells a children's meal that includes a beverage shall make the default beverage offered to include water, sparkling water, or flavored water, with no added natural or artificial sweeteners or milk or non dairy milk alternatives. Provides that nothing in this provision shall prohibit a restaurant's ability to sell, or a customer's ability to purchase, a substitute or alternative beverage instead of the default beverage offered with a children's meal, if requested by the purchaser of the children's meal. Requires all restaurants to complete an initial self certification certifying whether they offer children's meals, and if so, certifying that they comply with the provisions and annually self certification, certifying that they comply with the provisions. -- Establishes provision relating to enforcement. Establishes that violations shall be enforceable by the department of health. Establishes fine. -- SB2056

RELATING TO THE GENERAL EXCISE TAX.

Provides a general excise tax exemption for amount received from the sales of prescription drugs sold pursuant to a doctor's prescription; diabetic supplies; prosthetic devices; medical oxygen; human blood and its derivatives; durable medical equipment for home use; mobility enhancing equipment sold by prescription; and repair and replacement parts for any of the foregoing exempt devices and equipment.

SB2214

RELATING TO RENTAL HOUSING ON GOVERNMENT LANDS IN PROPOSED TRANSIT ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT COMMUNITY DISTRICTS.

Introduced by: Espero W, Harimoto B, Green J, English J

Amends provisions relating to the Hawaii community development authority law. Allows the authority to enter into a partnership agreement with any private investor for the leasing of public infrastructure to the private investor. Requires the partnership agreement to require the authority to lease the infrastructure facility to the private investor, who shall renovate, improve, or construct for the authority public infrastructure, pursuant to a ground lease or easement, and to maintain the facility; and lease back the public infrastructure to the authority, pursuant to a lease or easement. Requires that the land upon which the public infrastructure rests to be sold to the private investor; provided that the land to be leased at a nominal rate to the private investor for a term that would, at a minimum, allow the private investor to recover the capital investment that has been made to the public infrastructure, including depreciation; and that the authority shall have the option of purchasing the public infrastructure from the private investor for the remaining balance of the debt service costs incurred by the private investor at any time; provides that the lease shall terminate concurrently. -- Establishes provisions relating to transit oriented development community district; purposes. Requires the authority to plan a mixed use district whereby industrial, commercial, residential, and public uses may coexist compatibly within the same area in coordinating community development at each of the transit oriented development district.

Levies a monthly rental motor vehicle road improvement surcharge of 4.50 dollars per day on the lessor to be deposited into the state highway fund. Requires the moneys generated to be deposited into the state highway fund to be used for road improvements, maintenance, and repair in the county in which the moneys are generated. -- SB2301

SB2333 RELATING TO RETIREMENT SAVINGS.
Introduced by: Thielen L, English J, Ruderman R, Kim D
Establishes provisions relating to Hawaii retirement savings plan law. Establishes within the department of budget and finance for administrative purposes the Hawaii retirement savings board to implement and maintain the Hawaii retirement savings plan; adopt rules for the general administration of the plan; direct the investment of the funds contribute to accounts in the plan consistent with the investment restrictions established by the board; provided that the restrictions to be consistent with the objectives of the plan and the board to exercise the judgement and create then prevailing that persons of prudence, discretion, and intelligence exercise in the management of their own affairs with due regard to the probable income and level of risk from certain types of investments of money; in accordance with the policies established by the board; collect application, account, or administrative fees to assist the costs of administering the plan; make and enter into contracts, agreements, or arrangements, and retain, employ, and contract for any of the following considered necessary or desirable. Annual report to the legislature. Establishes the Hawaii retirement savings plan, the Hawaii retirement savings board to conduct a market analysis to determine the feasibility of the plan; and whether and to what extent plans with the Hawaii revised statutes, currently exist in the private market; obtain legal advice regarding the applicability of the employee retirement income security act of 1974, as amended, and the internal revenue code of 1986, as amended, to the plan; investigate whether employers that are not required to participate in the plan can make the plan available to their employees; investigate how to allow individuals who are not automatically enrolled in the plan to opt in to the plan and make contributions to an account, either through payroll contributions or another method of contribution; conduct an analysis of the potential costs to employers, including administrative costs, and costs associated with providing automatic payroll deductions for participation in the plan, as well as recommendations on how to eliminate or reduce those costs through incentives, tax credits, or other means; prepare a timeline for implementation of the Hawaii retirement savings plan; and make recommendations to the legislature regarding ways to increase financial literacy in the State. Requires this act to take effect on July 1, 2018; provided that the Hawaii retirement savings board established; and the Hawaii retirement savings plan all individual to begin making contributions to the plan no later than July 1, 2020; provided further that if the board determines that the plan would qualify as an employee benefit plan under the employee retirement income security act of 1974, as amended, the

Prohibits policy issued or renewed in this State to impose any preexisting condition exclusion or pay a premium or contribution based on the individual's gender. -- SB2340

Establishes provisions relating to state educational programs and activities; discrimination prohibited. Prohibits a person in the State, on the basis of sex, including gender identity or expression, or sexual orientation, to be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any state educational program or activity; or any educational program or activity that receives state financial assistance. Provides that nothing shall preclude any student of a state educational program or activity, or an educational program or activity that receives state financial assistance, from bringing a civil action for sexual harassment or sexual assault and infliction of emotional distress or invasion of privacy. Requires the civil rights commission to issue a notice of right to sue on a complaint filed with the commission if it determines that a civil action alleging similar facts has been filed in circuit court. -- SB2353

Establishes the paid sick leave law. Requires 1 hour of paid sick leave for every 40 hours worked. Allows unused accrued paid sick leave to carryover with limitations. Prohibits sick leave to be payable for employees entitled to temporary total or partial disability benefits or temporary disability insurance benefits. Provides that the employers shall not be required to provide reimbursement for accrued paid sick leave that the employee has not used. Allows the employee to use paid sick leave for themselves or family members when they are ill or injured or receiving medical care, treatment, or diagnosis or closure of the employees place of business by order of a public official due to a public health emergency, a child whose school or place of care has been closed by order of a public official due to a public health emergency or the family member's presence in the community would jeopardize the health of others because of the member's exposure to a communicable disease. Establishes confidentiality and nondisclosure of an employee's medical condition. Exempts an employer who adopts or retains a paid sick leave policy that provides more paid sick leave than required; pays employee ____ more than the minimum wage; or employs less than ____ employees. Allows employers and employees subject to collective bargaining to waive by the parties under the terms and conditions of the agreement. -- SB2359

RELATING TO THE MINIMUM WAGE.

Amends provisions relating to special minimum wages for learners; apprentices; full time students; paroled wards of Hawaii youth correctional facility; handicapped workers. Repeals provisions that allows the director of department of labor and industrial relations to provide for employment to individuals whose earning capacity is impaired by old age or physical or mental deficiency or injury at wages lower than the applicable minimum wage. -- SB2362

RELATING TO JOB TRAINING.

Requires the department of human resources development to establish and implement a supervisory job shadowing pilot project to enable existing state employees who are candidates for promotion to supervisory positions, for which the incumbents are close to retirement, to train for those positions by shadowing the incumbents. Requires the director of human services to select a department to implement the pilot project. Allows the department to establish temporary part time positions that may be necessary when any current state employee shadows any incumbent of a supervisory position. Pilot project to terminate on June 30, 2022 (sunset). Report to the legislature. Appropriation for the project. (\$\$) -- SB2363

RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

Amends provisions relating to medical examination by employer's physician by changing it to requested mutual examination.
