A Message From Gil

Dear Neighbors:

We are now about a third of the way through this legislative session. This year 1388 bills were introduced in the State Senate including 474 bills from the Abercrombie Administration.

As Vice-Chair of the Senate Committee on Tourism and Hawaiian Affairs and a member of the Senate Committees on Higher Education, Transportation and International Affairs, and Ways and Means, I have had the opportunity to hear and provide input on legislation impacting a wide range of issues.

MEET OUR 2013 STAFF

Among the measures still alive for consideration is a bill for better identification of genetically engineered products, and one proposing a task force to recommend food safety guidelines for locally grown products. Also under consideration: whether the State should invest more heavily in early childhood education, recognition of grandparents' visitation rights in child custody cases, and clarification of the Island Burial Council law to address quorum issues.

The Senate has started its Neighbor Island Video Conferencing (SVC) pilot project. This technology will allow neighbor island government representatives and citizens to testify remotely during standing committee hearings of two Committees: Education (EDU) and Technology and the Arts (TEC). We hope this will provide more opportunity for Maui residents and officials to participate in the legislative process without the lost time and expense of traveling to Honolulu. In the months ahead, I will continue working with my colleagues, Senator Rosalyn Baker and Senator J. Kalani English, to ensure that the voices of the people of Maui are heard and that our concerns are properly addressed in the Hawaii State Senate.



COMMITTEE ADVISED AND CONSENTED TO THE NOMINATIONS

SB 1360

CONDO COMMON EXPENSES - GET EXEMPTIONS Makes permanent the general excise tax exemptions for condominium common expenses paid by managers, sub-managers, and sub-operators and for hotel employee expenses paid by hotel operators and timeshare projects.

REFERRED TO WAYS AND MEANS

SB 407

ISLAND BURIAL COUNCILS

Clarifies statutory provisions relating to composition and quorum of island burial councils.

RECOMMENDED THE MEASURE BE PASSED WITH AMENDMENTS

BILLS INTRODUCED BY GIL

Requires the department of health to classify and recognize qualified hospitals and health care centers that provide care to stroke patients.

Allows hospitals and health care centers to publicly advertise their status as stroke facilities. Requires hospitals and health care centers to report data to the department. Requires the department to create guidelines

SB 1348

Stroke Facility Legislation for pre-hospital stroke-triage assessment and maintain a statewide stroke database. Requires the department to provide an annual report to the governor and legislature. Takes effect on 7/1/15.

HEALTH COMMITTEE RECOMMENDED THE MEASURE BE PASSED WITH AMENDMENTS

Makes driving a motor vehicle, trailer, or semi-trailer equipped with dangerous wheels a violation. Defines dangerous wheels.

SB 337

Dangerous Wheels

REFERRED TO WAYS AND MEANS

Establishes the offenses of cruelty to a law enforcement animal in the first and second degrees. Adds a definition for "law enforcement animal".

SB 635
Law Enforcement
Animal Cruelty

REFERRED TO JUDICIARY AND LABOR COMMITTEE

OTHER ACTIVE LEGISLATION

SB 615

Genetically Modified Fish, Fish Products

Prohibits the sale of genetically modified fish or genetically modified fish products in the State beginning 1/1/2014 unless appropriately labeled as genetically modified or produced or partially produced with genetic modification methods.

COMMITTEE ON ENERGY AND THE ENVIRONMENT RECOMMENDED THE MEASURE BE PASSED WITH AMENDMENTS

SB 238

Student instructional Hours

Amends the definition of "student instructional hours" for elementary and secondary schools.

COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION RECOMMENDED THE MEASURE BE PASSED UNAMENDED

SB 1095

Early Childhood Education

Establishes the early childhood education program within the early learning system

COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION REFERRED THE MEASURE TO WAYS AND MEANS

SB 707

Repealing the PLDC

Repeals chapter 171C, HRS, relating to the PLDC. Deposits funds appropriated to the DLNR, into the land conservation fund. Deposits proceeds in the stadium facilities special fund and the school facilities special fund into the general fund. Transfers PLDC employees and assets to the DLNR.

PASSED THIRD READING AS AMENDED ON THE SENATE FLOOR.
TRANSMITTED TO THE HOUSE.

SB 326

Good Agricultural Practices

Creates and appropriates funds for a good agricultural practices task force to develop food safety guidelines for locally farmed products.

COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS RECOMMENDED THE MEASURE BE PASSED WITH AMENEDEMENTS

BILLS THAT MISSED FIRST DEADLINE

The first major deadline in the Senate has passed, and some bills identified by the media as hot issues have not reached their final committees for consideration and are technically dead in the Senate.

Recognizes marriages between individuals of the same sex. Extends to same-sex couples the same rights, benefits, protections, and responsibilities of marriage that opposite-sex couples receive. Permits marriage licenses to be issued beginning 12/2/2013 but prohibits solemnizations until 1/1/2014.

SB 1369

Same-Sex Marriage

Grants 20-year license for one stand-alone casino in Waikiki not in a hotel. Establishes Hawaii Gaming Control Commission. Imposes 15% wagering tax on gross receipts. Creates State Gaming Fund and Compulsive Gambler Program. Appropriates funds. Effective 07/01/2013.

SB 769 Waikiki Casino

Legalizes the personal use of marijuana in a specified quantity. It requires licensing to operate marijuana establishments and subjects marijuana establishments to excise taxes and income taxes.

SB 467
Marijuana
Legalization

Creates an income tax exemption on the first \$50,000 of income for family farms, family farm communities, and family farm cooperatives.


