The 2019 legislative session is over and now we are in our first full month of the interim. The interim provides time to assess issues that were taken up during the session that were unable to advance through the legislative process. The interim allows respective parties and stakeholders to come together and refine any disagreements that were raised during the committee hearings so that the measure can be re-introduced next session with less controversy or push back.

I will keep you updated on matters that may surface during the interim as details unfold.

Lastly, I want to assure you that even though the Legislature is in interim, my staff and I work daily, and I remain committed to representing my constituents and the people of Hawaii to impact change and accountability where it is needed. I will continue to work diligently to make our community a better place to live and work.

LEGISLATIVE DEADLINES



June 24: Governor's intent to veto

Last day for the governor to inform the Legislature of his intent to veto. If the bill is vetoed, it will not become law unless:

(1) the Legislature amends the bill in special session to address the Governor's objections and the Governor signs the amended bill within 10 days of receipt, or

(2) the Legislature successfully overrides the veto in special session by a 2/3 vote of all members in each chamber.

The Legislature must convene in special session at or before noon on July 9th to act upon the Governor's veto.

July 9: Governor's signing and veto

Last day for a bill to become law with or without the governor's signature.
