HB1519	RELATING TO SUNSCREEN.
11D1313	RELATING TO SUNSCREEN.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Beginning January 1, 2023, prohibits the sale, offer for sale, or distribution in the State of any sunscreen that contains active ingredients that are not generally recognized as safe and effective by the Food and Drug Administration, without a prescription issued by a licensed health care provider.

HB1697 RELATING TO SEXUAL HEALTH EDUCATION.

EDN, FIN

Requires DOE to provide comprehensive training for teachers and educational officers on sexual health topics that include positive and accurate representations of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer or questioning, intersex, asexual, and other sexual orientations and gender identities and persons of color communities, to destignatize and promote sexual health. Requires sexual health programs to include similar sexual health topics to destigmatize and promote sexual health.

HB1839 RELATING TO TRANSIENT ACCOMMODATIONS TAX.

LAT, CPC, FIN

Makes camper vans a type of transient accommodation, the rental

of which is subject to the transient accommodations tax.

HB1995 RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS.

AGR, FIN

Amends the definition of "capital investment costs" to include the planting of trees having an expected lifespan of at least 15 years.

HB2019 RELATING TO BONDS.

HSG, FIN

Specifies that the allocation of the state bond ceiling to the State shall be used entirely for housing related projects. Requires counties that elect to receive their allocation to do so by resolution and specify the allocation amount requested. Removes the authorization for counties or issuers to request additional allocations of the state bond ceiling. Prioritizes projects of counties that assign their allocation back to the State over projects of counties with their own private activity bond issuance program. Requires counties or issuers that retain their allocation to submit quarterly reports on the status or use of any allocation. Requires a project to first apply to the county in which the project is located, if the county has a private activity bond issuance program, before applying to the State. Changes the dates for reverted or remaining allocations and requires certain reverted or remaining allocations to be used for housing related projects. Sunsets on 12/31/2027.

HB2024 RELATING TO MAUNA KEA.

WAL/JHA/FIN

Establishes the Mauna Kea stewardship authority as the sole authority for management of state-managed lands on Mauna Kea. Requires the authority to develop a single plan that dictates the management of land uses; human activities, uses, and access; stewardship, education; research, disposition; and overall operations. Requires the authority to develop a framework to limit astronomy development on Mauna Kea. Prohibits certain commercial use and activities on Mauna Kea. Requires an application and fee for all recreational users of Mauna Kea. Establishes Mauna Kea management special fund. Repeals Mauna Kea lands management special fund. Appropriates funds.

<u>HB2069</u> RELATING TO GIFTS.

GVR, JHA

Defines the reporting and disposition requirements for gift received by members of the legislature or employees of the State.

RELATING TO DISPOSITION OF WATER LICENSES BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES. Clarifies the conditions and manner in which the Board of Land

and Natural Resources may dispose of water by license.

HB2174 RELATING TO THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION LAW.

Amends the title of chapter 386, part V, subpart C, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), to add reserve public safety law enforcement officers, and amends section 386-181, HRS, to include reserve public safety law enforcement officers to the list of volunteer occupations covered under the workers' compensation law. Allows reserve public safety law enforcement officers who are injured under the conditions specified in section 386-3, HRS, to receive workers' compensation. Adds reserve public safety law enforcement officers to the list of volunteers who are covered under the conditions for computing average weekly wages.

<u>HB2249</u> RELATING TO MENSTRUAL EQUALITY.

Requires the Department of Education to provide hygiene products that support public health, such as toilet paper, menstrual products, and hand soap free of charge to all students on all public school campuses. Requires the State Public Charter School Commission to provide hygiene products that support public health, such as toilet paper, menstrual products, and hand soap free of charge to all students on all public charter school campuses. Makes appropriations.

<u>HB2355</u> MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT LAT, FIN

COST ITEMS.

Makes an appropriation for the public employment cost items and cost adjustments for employees of the Senate, House of Representatives, and various legislative agencies who are excluded from collective bargaining.

HB2433 RELATING TO PUBLIC LAND TRUST REVENUES.

Requires that all moneys in the pro rata portion of the Public Land Trust be transferred to the Office of Hawaiian Affairs.

HB2450 RELATING TO PUBLIC LAND TRUST REVENUES.

Requires that all funds in the administratively established carry-forward trust holding account in excess of \$15,100,000 be transferred to the Office of Hawaiian Affairs each year.
