The State of Hawai'i Environmental Advisory Council (EAC) is in strong **SUPPORT** OF GM 601 appointing Ms. Moanaoio Bjur. to the EAC for a term to expire on June 30, 2023.

The EAC is established by HRS § 341-5.5, which also directs membership "to ensure a broad and balanced representation of educational, business, and environmentally pertinent disciplines and professions, such as the natural and social sciences, the humanities, architecture, engineering, environmental consulting, public health, and planning; educational and research institutions with environmental competence; agriculture, real estate, visitor industry, construction, and media; and voluntary community and environmental groups."

The functions of the EAC are to serve as a liaison between the Office of Planning and Sustainable Development (OPSD) Director and the general public, to make recommendations concerning ecology and environmental quality, and to monitor the progress of the State, county, and federal agencies in achieving the State's environmental goals and policies. The EAC also worked on and promulgated the administrative rules for implementing Chapter 343, HRS and now serves an advisory capacity in that respect.

Ms. Bjur's experience working in cultural preservation, program management, and extensively with the community will contribute to the EAC's broad and balanced representation of different perspectives in support of the EAC's roles. With respect to the EAC's functions, duties, and powers, and in consideration of Ms. Bjur's experience as demonstrated on her resume, the EAC strongly supports her nomination. The EAC respectfully requests that this Committee vote in favor of her confirmation to serve on the EAC.

On behalf of our 20,000 members and supporters, the Sierra Club of Hawai'i offers the following testimony in **STRONG SUPPORT** of the nomination of Moana Bjur to the Environmental Advisory Council ("EAC").

The EAC plays a critical role in guiding and facilitating the meaningful implementation of our environmental laws and policies. Accordingly, it is critical that the council possesses members who understand the critical importance of our native Hawaiian species and ecosystems, which not only define our islands' ecological and cultural identity, but that also may be critical to our socioeconomic stability and environmental resiliency in the era of climate destabilization. In addition, council members should also demonstrate the community connections and insight necessary to facilitate a broader public understanding of, and engagement in, the development and implementation of our environmental laws, policies, and processes.

Ms. Bjur's substantial experience with and demonstrated commitment to both community service and the protection of our native species and ecosystems make her a highly appropriate and valued member of the EAC. The Sierra Club is confident that she will provide the needed insight on management needs and advocacy efforts for the restoration and protection of our native flora and fauna, and that she will continue to uplift the importance of community participation in project planning and government decisionmaking that may impact the native species that are the foundation of our islands' identity and ways of life.

Accordingly, the Sierra Club respectfully urges the Committee to recommend that the Senate **ADVISE AND CONSENT** to the nomination of Moana Bjur to the EAC.
