1 **Department Position:** The Department of Health ("Department") **SUPPORTS** the nomination

2 and confirmation of Margaret "Jackie" Jackson to the Mental Health and Substance Abuse,

3 Oahu Service Area Board.

4 **Department Testimony:** The role of the Mental Health and Substance Abuse, Oahu Service 5 Area Board is to advise, monitor, review and evaluate the provision of mental health services 6 within the City and County of Honolulu. Her passion for 6 Hawaii youth and their 'ohana is fueled by being around family members who struggle with 7 mental health and substance abuse. She has a keen understanding about the positive impact of 8 proactive behavioral health resources and the need for services to be available and accessible 9 at the time they are needed.

Ms. Jackson has been an active member of the Oahu Service Area Board since 2019. She finds her volunteer work with the Oahu Service Area Board rewarding and enjoys learning about the various ways that the board can effect positive change in Hawaii. We are pleased that she is willing to continue as a volunteer member of the Oahu Service Area Board and desires to expand her role by dually serving as the Oahu Service Area Board representative to the Hawaii State Council on Mental Health (GM644).
