The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) strongly supports Governor's Message 683 nominating Aimee Keli'i Barnes to the Board of Land and Natural Resources (Board) for a term to expire on June 30, 2025.

Ms. Barnes brings nearly 20 years of experience working at the intersection of climate, energy and environmental issues in California, Hawai'i and internationally. Her educational background, business and entrepreneurial knowledge will serve the Board well as it faces the challenges of managing Hawai'i's land and natural resources amidst global climate change resulting in locally rising seas, warming oceans and coral bleaching, storms, fire, and drought.

Barnes is currently the principal of Hua Nani Partners, a small, woman-owned consulting practice that provides policy and strategy advice to nonprofit and philanthropic organizations focusing on climate change. She also serves as the Director of the Policy Lab at Elemental Excelerator, a non-profit that supports equitable climate innovation founded in Hawai'i in 2009.

Barnes is a nationally recognized expert on climate change. Previously, she was appointed by former California Gov. Jerry Brown as a member of his senior staff, leading implementation of his climate and environmental policy agenda. In this role she was responsible for California's carbon neutrality executive order, described as "history's most ambitious climate target" at its launch.

Barnes earned her B.A. in Environmental Studies from Dartmouth College, where she was awarded a Mellon-Mays Fellowship to study Hawaiian environmentalism and cultural identity.

I am writing to express my strong support for the confirmation of Aimee Barnes to the Board of Land and Natural Resources, representing the 3rd Land District.

I am the founder and Executive Director of Women Organizing for Change in Agriculture and Natural Resource Management (WOCAN), an international membership network of 1400+ professionals and women's associations from 114 countries. Established in 2004, our goal is to advance the role of women and gender in agricultural and natural resource management. Like Ms. Barnes, I am based in Kailua Kona, where I am engaged in supporting climate resilience and agricultural innovation for women farmers of Hawai'i County in addition to leading gender equality and climate work around the globe.

Aimee is a nationally recognized climate expert who brings nearly 20 years' experience working on climate and sustainability issues across the public, private and non-profit sectors. She understands the imperative to act on climate, and the important role BLNR has to play in helping the state meet its ambitious climate goals, including through conservation of our natural and working lands, which serve as a significant carbon sink.

<u>She</u> is a collaborative leader who sees Hawaii as a beacon of climate and sustainability leadership for the world. She is able to tackle complex challenges, build strong relationships, respect and trust, and is committed to ensuring that all stakeholders have an equal voice and seat at the table.

<u>Climate Expertise</u> – Aimee's professional experience makes her well prepared to serve on the Land Board. She currently serves as Director of the Policy Lab at Elemental Excelerator and runs a small consulting practice, Hua Nani Partners. Previously, as senior advisor on climate change to California Governor Jerry Brown, she built coalitions to advance climate ambition, including helping to launch the US Climate Alliance – a bipartisan group of 25 states committed to the Paris Agreement. Aimee was also responsible for the Executive Order committing California to carbon neutrality by 2045 – one of the most ambitious targets of its kind, which was inspired by Hawai'i's Executive Order to achieve negative emissions by 2045. From this experience she has developed a deep understanding of effective climate policy, as well as the capacity to work with diverse communities to find common ground even on issues rife with challenges and conflict.

<u>Background in Public Service</u> - In addition to Aimee's climate policy experience, she has a strong background in public policy and public service more broadly – from the local to national level. She has served on and managed boards and commissions and understands board procedures and requirements for transparency, impartiality, and the importance of being able to impartially represent the public interest. Her work has spanned from city level Commissions, to diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) committee work, to national organizations. Currently she serves on the board of Dartmouth's Irving Institute and Independent Diplomat. A cancer survivor, Aimee also founded and runs a non-profit, Bright Spot Network, which supports young families facing cancer while raising small children.

<u>Understanding of climate-related economic development and diversification opportunities</u> – Aimee currently serves as the Director of Elemental Excelerator's Policy Lab and runs a small consulting practice, Hua Nani Partners. In both roles, she has built a solid understanding of what it takes to build a strong and sustainable economy, not only at the policy level, but also in practice. Aimee also founded Powerwomen, which supports getting more women into the climate workforce, and she works with FoundHer, a mentorship program for women entrepreneurs in Hawai'i, where she is partnered with Polipoli Farms, a Hawaiian-run farm in the Waiehu foothills of Maui.

<u>Rooted in Hawai'i</u> – Aimee's commitment to improving our environment and the human condition is rooted in her Native Hawaiian culture. Born and raised in California, she was called home to serve the people of Hawaii and our 'āina. She and her husband are raising their children, ages 3 and 7, in Kailua.

Ms. Barnes understands the critical role agriculture and natural resource management plays in the State. Her experience demonstrates a strong understanding of the contributions of natural and working lands to addressing the climate crisis in Hawai'i. Likewise, she understands the importance of lifting up, engaging, and convening with diverse stakeholders including those representing agriculture, conservation, women and gender issues, environmental justice, native Hawaiian issues, and others.

As a Native Hawaiian woman, Ms. Barnes brings the lived experience of Hawai'i's environment to her work. In both a personal and professional context, she is deeply engaged in the community here. She will bring a critical perspective to help the BLNR more effectively serve the needs of all

communities, including and especially minority and historically underserved communities, women, and those working in agriculture and natural resource management.

I believe that Aimee's experience, deep climate expertise, commitment to Hawai'i, and values will position her to be a great fit to serve on the Board of Land and Natural Resources. I strongly recommend Ms. Barnes to the Board of BLNR and hope you will fully support her confirmation.

Aloha Chair Inouye, Vice Chair Keith-Agaran, and Members of the Senate Committee on Water and Land,

On behalf of our 20,000 members and supporters, the Sierra Club of Hawai'i offers the following **COMMENTS** on the nominees to the Board of Land and Natural Resources ("BLNR").

The Sierra Club appreciates the willingness of the nominated individuals to provide their time and expertise in service to the BLNR's important mission. The Sierra Club does emphasize the critical role of the BLNR in overseeing the management and protection of the lands and resources that provide the foundation of our islands' identity, social fabric, and ways of life. Accordingly, Sierra Club believes that this hearing provides a critical opportunity for the Committee, the nominees, and the general public to reflect on the nominees' knowledge, views, and commitment to make what may be difficult but necessary decisions to uphold their fiduciary and legal obligations under the constitution, statutes, and other laws of the state, with regards to our natural and cultural public trust resources and sites.

To assist in this process of reflection and assessment, the Sierra Club respectfully offers the following questions for the nominees before you today:

- 1) What expertise, knowledge, or skills do you possess that may be relevant to fulfilling the BLNR's fiduciary and legal obligations with respect to the conservation, protection, and use of our public lands and natural and cultural resources and sites?
- 2) Should stream diverters be allowed to dewater entire streams and waste millions of gallons of water per day, due to aging and leaky irrigation and reservoirinfrastructure?
- 3) Do you believe it is appropriate to issue long-term leases of ecologically or culturally significant lands and waters before DLNR staff can demonstrate sufficient expertise and capacity to provide consistent and timely oversight over lease terms and conditions?

- 4) What is your position on community-based fisheries management approaches, and should greater weight be given to the testimonies of Native Hawaiian traditional and customary practitioners and subsistence community members than outsiders who do not have a daily connection with the resources of their place?
- 5) What steps should the DLNR take to address the recommendations of the 2019 Audit of the Land Division's Special Land and Development Fund, which found a lack of an overarching plan for the Land Division's public land inventory, a lack of staff expertise and capacity to administer industrial and commercial leases, an overreliance on ground leases rather than more lucrative space leases in disposing of revenue-generating lands, and a lack of transparency and accountability, among other deficiencies, leading to significant opportunity costs to the DLNR and its mission?
- 6) Do you believe that the aquarium collection industry should be subject to stricter regulations based on evolving science regarding climate change impacts on our coral reef ecosystem, and the application of the precautionary principle?
- 7) What strategies should the BLNR employ to discourage shoreline hardening and encourage strategic retreat to mitigate the loss of our beaches and coastal areas?

The Sierra Club hopes and strongly believes that these questions will provide a much-needed understanding of the value that the nominees may bring to the BLNR, as it carries out its kuleana concerning matters of critical importance over the next several years.

Honorable Chair Inouye, Vice Chair Keith-Agaran and Members of the Senate Committee on Water and Land,

I am pleased to offer my strong support for the confirmation of Aimee Barnes to the Board of Land and Natural Resources. I first became aware of Aimee's considerable skills and leadership shortly after I joined the Hawaii Natural Energy Institute when she helped establish the US Climate Alliance as a senior advisor on climate change to California Governor Jerry Brown. The US Climate Alliance was an extremely important bipartisan coalition of states committed to the Paris Agreement in 2017, showing resolve when many in the nation and world were concerned over the future of climate actions in the face of the unfortunate federal policy at the time.

I witnessed her considerable skills firsthand when she helped coordinate the Climate Governance subcommittee of an Energy and Environment Committee that was formed to explore and develop day-one and 100-day actions under a prospective Biden Administration.
