In consideration of GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE 704 SUBMITTING FOR THE CONSIDERATION AND CONFIRMATION TO THE ISLAND BURIAL COUNCIL, ISLANDS OF MAUI AND LĀNA'I, GUBERNATORIAL NOMINEE, VERNON KALANIKAU FOR A TERM TO EXPIRE 6-30-23

The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports Governor's Message 704, nominating Mr. Vernon Kalanikau to the Island Burial Council, Islands of Maui and Lāna'i expiring June 30, 2023.

The Island Burial Councils are established under Section 6E-43.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The councils determine whether to preserve or relocate previously identified native Hawaiian burial sites, recognize lineal and cultural descendants, and provide counsel and advice to the Department.

Mr. Vernon Kalanikau was born and raised on the island of Maui. He is a graduate of Baldwin High School. While Vernon may not have received a post-secondary education in Hawaiian Studies like many other council members, Vernon's knowledge of the Hawaiian culture was passed to him by his parents and grandparents. In addition, Mr. Kalanikau has been participating (last four years) in the process of determining the final treatment of native Hawaiian skeletal remains discovered inadvertently. As a recognized cultural descendant, he has provided cultural consultation to landowners, the Maui Lana'i Islands Burial Council, as well as County, State, and Federal agencies. This involvement provided him the opportunity to learn the discipline of dealing with native Hawaiian skeletal remains.

Senate confirmation will ensure that Mr. Kalanikau's knowledge and perspective informs the deliberations of the Maui Lāna'i Islands Burial Council until June 30, 2023.

Participants in the Hawaii State Aha Moku (Aha Moku) Moku O Pi'ilani (Island of Maui) and Nana'i Kaula (Island of Lana'i)supports this submittal.

The Hawaii State Aha Moku works with participants of all twelve Moku of Maui – Hamakuapoko, Hamakualoa, Ko'olau, Hana, Kipahulu, Kaupo, Kahikinui, Honuaula, Kula, Lahaina, Ka'anapali, and Wailuku as well as many of the one hundred and forty (140) ahupua'a encompassed within these moku. We also work with the native Hawaiian families and the different communities on the Moku of Lana'i – Kona and Ko'olau. Although most of the residents of Lana'i live in Lana'i City in the Kona Moku, there are still generational kuleana in the eleven (11) ahupua'a on the island.

Mr. Kalanikau is a native Hawaiian who is a strong supporter of his culture. We believe he will be an asset to the Maui Burial Council.

Aha Moku supports Vernon Kalanikau as a member of the Maui and Lana'i Island Burial Council and ask that this Committee Advise and Consent Governor Message 704.
