I am offering this testimony in strong support of the confirmation of the Governor's nomination of Kerrie Urosevich to serve a term on the Early Learning Board (ELB) to expire on 06-30-2025.

Kerrie Urosevch currently serves as the representative from the Hawaii Early Intervention Coordinating Council (HEICC), established as required by state law (HRS 321-353) and federal law Part C of IIDEA. ## **EXECUTIVE OFFICE ON EARLY LEARNING'S POSITION: Support**

Aloha. I am Coleen Momohara, Interim Director of the Executive Office on Early Learning (EOEL). EOEL supports the nomination and confirmation of Kerrie Urosevich to the Early Learning Board (ELB).

EOEL is statutorily responsible for the development of the State's early childhood system that shall ensure a spectrum of high-quality development and learning opportunities for children throughout the state, from prenatal care until the time they enter kindergarten, with priority given to underserved or at-risk children.

Kerrie Urosevich currently services as the representative from the Hawaii Early Intervention Coordinating Council (HEICC) on the ELB. HEICC, established by HRS Chapter 321-353, advises and assists the HIDOE regarding the transition of toddlers with special needs to preschool and other appropriate services. With her experience and knowledge, Mrs. Urosevich satisfies the requirement of §302 L-1.6 and would be an asset as a member to the ELB.
