The Department of Transportation (DOT) **supports** the nomination of Jacqueline Boland to the State Highway Safety Council (SHSC).

Chapter 286-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, establishes the SHSC which advises the Governor on matters relating to the programs and activities of the state in the field of highway safety. The state has adjusted the makeup of the committee from a group that was primarily government officials and safety advocates, to one that includes cross sections of all users of the highway system in our community. HIPHI is a statewide nonprofit organization dedicated to advancing the health and wellness of the people and islands of Hawai'i. HIPHI strives to be a bridge between community and partners from government and healthcare so that all relevant stakeholders throughout the Hawai'i are involved in decisions related to public health policy, programs, and investments. We believe we can play a significant role in the shift of public health from being primarily about treating disease to the promotion of preventing it. Our work includes food and agriculture, transportation and public safety, oral health, healthy eating + active living (HEAL), drug and alcohol prevention, tobacco prevention and control, COVID-19 response efforts and workforce development.

Ms. Boland has been an integral founding member of the Kūpuna Food Security Coalition, where she served as a Steering Committee member and helped to support emergency kūpuna needs throughout the COVID-19 pandemic and the building of long-term, sustainable age-empowered community-based food systems. As a result of Ms. Boland's efforts, over 1.2 million meals were distributed and over 30,000 health and social services were provided to kūpuna who were disproportionately affected by the pandemic. Over 8,000 kūpuna each week were connected to critical care because of Ms. Boland's exceptional leadership, community engagement, and advocacy.

Ms. Boland is highly qualified to serve on the Highway Safety Council with her extensive knowledge and experience on transportation and pedestrian safety as AARP's Outreach and Educational Associate State Director. She has led and organized many educational and community projects, including walk audits, to assess our streets and intersections. She brings valuable insights

which will help guide the Council in making our streets and highways safer, and ensure equitable transportation for all.

I wish to submit my strong support for the confirmation of **Jacqueline Boland** as a State Governor's representative to the Hawaii State Highway Safety Council.

I have worked with Jackie for several years in my role at Biki, as AARP has been a very good partner for promoting active transportation in our work to get more seniors on bicycles as daily transportation. As an aside, the 'silver seniors' are a large untapped demographic for getting back on bikes for Hawaii and in many ways much easier than the youngest adults. Much of this can be attributed to a more independent childhood riding daily of bikes (back when Hawaii's roadways were often safer: had less traffic and lower 85th percentile speeds, etc.).

She will bring an important viewpoint and skills set relating to the programs and activities of the State in the area of 'highway' safety especially as it supports active transportation and an older active state population.

These are all important as our nation's Departments of Transportation broadens their institutional view for the highway network to effectively serve the mobility of the '8 to 80' population versus the 16 to 65 population of peak hour commuters of the past.
