On behalf of our 20,000 members and supporters, the Sierra Club of Hawai'i offers the following testimony in **STRONG SUPPORT** of the nomination of Kū'ike Kamakea-'Ōhelo to the Land Use Commission ("LUC").

The LUC has the critical, long-standing responsibility to identify and protect the public interest in Hawai'i's natural and cultural resources, Native Hawaiian traditional and customary rights, climate resiliency, food security, housing security, employment opportunities, and other important areas that may be affected by large-scale land use changes or certain exceptional activities on agricultural and rural lands. The LUC further oversees the designation of important agricultural lands, which may help to ensure the the long-term agricultural security and self-sufficiency of our islands. To properly carry out these responsibilities, the LUC must possess members with expertise in relevant subjects, including Native Hawaiian land use and agricultural practices, and who have demonstrated the strongest personal commitment to the community and the public interest.

The Sierra Club of Hawai'i strongly believes that Mr. Kamakea-'Ōhelo has the expertise, experience, and character to make him an exceptionally well-suited member of the LUC. His extensive background in local and diversified agriculture and Native Hawaiian land management practices will provide the LUC with a depth of knowledge that can ensure that its decisions appropriately uphold and promote the public's interests in Native Hawaiian cultural perpetuation, sustainable land use, and our islands' food self-sufficiency. Moreover, his clear commitment to the Waimānalo and larger communities demonstrates a level of integrity and care for our islands that will be essential to the fulfillment of the LUC's important role, in appropriately balancing developers' interests with the needs and concerns of the public. The Sierra Club of Hawai'i particularly and deeply appreciates Mr. Kamakea-'Ōhelo's years of community service, and can directly attest to the invaluable contributions he has made in protecting the public trust in water,
