SUPPORT of H.B. 138, Requiring Mandatory Lobbyist Training

Aloha Chair Tarnas, Vice Chair Takayama, and Committee Members:

The Hawai'i State Ethics Commission ("Commission") **strongly supports** H.B. 138, which requires mandatory training for all lobbyists who are required to register under the Hawai'i Lobbyists Law, Hawai'i Revised Statutes ("HRS") chapter 97.

Education is one of the core functions of the Commission. In addition to providing ethics training for state elected officials, employees, and members of state boards and commissions, Commission staff conducts annual trainings for registered lobbyists and organizations engaged in lobbying activities at the state level.

This bill would require lobbyists to complete a lobbyists training course prior to registering with the Commission, and repeat the training at least once every two years. Twenty other jurisdictions currently have a similar type of training requirement, including Washington, Oregon, and California.

The measure will help educate organizations and lobbyists about the state lobbyists laws and rules, and ensure greater compliance with the lobbyist registration laws. The Commission strongly believes that a mandatory lobbyist training requirement will help strengthen its overall ability to administer and enforce the state lobbying laws.
