> NOTICE OF HEARING On HB1411, HD2

The Hawaii County of Mayors supports H. B. 1411, HD2, which requires that both the transferee's and transferor's address be provided on the certificate of ownership when the title to a motor vehicle is transferred. The Bill specifies that providing false or fraudulent information subjects a party to penalties.

HCOM further supports this legislation in recognition that more than eight thousand vehicles are abandoned in Hawaii every year. In 2019, four thousand seven hundred abandoned vehicles were reported on Oahu, one thousand six hundred twenty abandoned vehicles were reported on Maui, one thousand six hundred twenty abandoned vehicles were reported on Hawaii Island, and nine hundred abandoned vehicles were reported on Kauai.

These abandoned vehicles are an eyesore in communities, harmful to the environment, and a financial burden to the counties. Because of fraud occurring at the vehicle title transfer level, there is an ongoing issue with locating the proper owner that has been abandoned.

The Hawaii Council of Mayors urge your support with our efforts to keep our public and environment safe and healthy.

The Hawai'i State Association of Counties (HSAC) strongly supports H.B. 1411, H.D.2,

which:

- Requires a transferee's and transferor's address to be provided on the certificate of ownership when the title to a motor vehicle is transferred;
- Declares that the signatures shall serve as an attestation by the parties that the information is correct; and
- Establishes a fine for providing fraudulent information.

Abandoned and derelict vehicles are a widespread problem on Hawaii's streets, creating safety and health conditions of the State of Hawaii. The ease of abandoning vehicles contributes to this problem. H.B. 1411, H.D.2, proposes a deterrent to this problem by requiring the signature of the transferee and the signature of the transferor on the certificate of ownership.

For these reasons the Hawai'i State Association of Counties strongly supports H.B. 1411, H.D.2, and requests your favorable consideration of this measure.

Honorable Chair Karl Rhoads, Vice Chair Jarrett Keohokalole, and Members of the Committee:

I, Camry Isabel, support HB 1411, which states that both the transferee and the transferor of a vehicle must sign appropriate documentation and provide necessary information in order to complete a vehicle transfer. As noted in the bill, there are thousands of vehicles that are left

abandoned, more than eight thousand vehicles annually. This is indefinitely an eyesore and diminishes the value of our land.

Born and raised in Puna, I have learned to grow fond of the land that we have and the opportunities that we are given. Lately, I have seen more abandoned cars left on the sides of roads, in empty lots, or in parking lots. It sickens me to see the disfigurement of my home town, which I believe was once a pleasant area.

HB 1411 also highlights the possibility for citation upon a fraudulent certificate or false information provided regarding a vehicle transfer. This legislation will likely reduce the amount of fraud committed through vehicle transfers. It is proposed that a citation may range anywhere from \$5 to \$1000. With a recommendation, I would like to suggest a higher fine, as providing false information upon vehicle registration is serious.

I believe that this legislation will reduce the amounts of abandoned cars and will provide responsibility for those who have been fraudulent during the vehicle transder process. It is for these reasons that I support HB 1411.
