We are writing in SUPPORT of HB 1414

This bill will serve to hold those who repeatedly abandon vehicles. In our experience, there does appear to be a certain demographic of people who chronically dump vehicles. One group or type of perpetrator that includes amateur or independent mechanics who acquire vehicles for parts and then abandon them after they have removed the parts that are useful to them. We hope that taking a stronger stance and holding them more accountable will deter them from this activity, decreasing the number of vehicles that require response.

We have found that those who repeatedly abandon vehicles generally do so with criminal intent, and should be held accountable. In reference to timing for repeat offenses, **no more than** a **one year** threshold between offenses should be sufficient.
