H.B. 1692 RELATING TO MOBILE ELECTRONIC DEVICES

House Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs

The Department of Transportation (DOT) **supports** H.B. 1692 relating to Mobile Electronic Devices. This bill requires every driver that violates this section be subject to a fine, with drivers paying a higher fine if they violate this section in a school zone or construction area. In addition, the fines shall be deposited into the state highway safety fund.

Fatality Analysis Reporting System statistics indicate that 25 (or 23.1 percent) of Hawaii's 108 traffic fatalities involved distracted drivers in 2019. Although preliminary state data shows a decrease for 2020, 14 (or 16.5 percent) of Hawaii's 85 traffic fatalities involved distracted drivers.

The DOT urges your committee to pass H.B. 1692 as a deterrent for drivers to use their cell phones while driving. More importantly, we believe the bill will reduce motor vehicle fatalities and injuries on Hawaii's roadways.
