H.B. No. 1732, Proposed H.D. 1 RELATING TO ELECTRIC GUNS

SUBJECT: House Bill No. 1732, H.D. 1 Proposed, Relating to Electric Guns

I am Joseph Trinidad, Major of the Records and Identification Division of the Honolulu Police Department (HPD), City and County of Honolulu.

The HPD opposes House Bill No. 1732, H.D. 1 Proposed, Relating to Electric Guns.

This bill proposes that it shall be unlawful for any person to carry or possess an electric gun in or near an airport passenger transportation terminal, commuter operations area, state or county government building, or any meeting place required to be open to the public pursuant to Chapter 92. This is too vague. "In or near" would impact the operational aspects of the HPD, as it would be subject to various interpretations.

A measurable distance needs to be clearly stated such as in Hawaii Revised Statutes §712-1249.6, Distributes or possesses with intent to distribute a controlled substance in any amount within seven hundred and fifty feet of the real property...

The HPD submits this testimony in its role as an integral part of the law enforcement community and respectfully requests the opposition of this bill.

Hawaii Firearms Coalition OPPOSES this bill.

The attorney general in the lawsuit Roberts vs Connors, to which I am the plaintiff, said "The primary limitation on the use of electric guns is that they must be used for self-defense, defense of another person, or protection of property, which can occur anywhere." Using them in any other means is a misdemeanor and using them for a crime is a felony.

A person willing to use a taser for a crime or an unintended purpose has already made the decision that the law doesn't matter. This law serves no purpose except to disarm the populace and prevent them from having a safe and effective tool for self dense.

First, I must clarify that electric arms are single-use weapons incapable of causing mass casualties. They are a nonlethal tool used in self-defense and, when used correctly, are unlikely to cause death or serious bodily injury. In all but a few states, they are readily available in many stores and can be purchased with no training or licensing.

Tasers and stun guns are extremely common, with millions of units in private possession, yet they are very rarely used in crime. This is due to the nature of how they work. Once deployed, the taser module becomes effectively useless and is incapable of firing at another person without lengthy reloading procure. Knives and blunt instruments such as bats and sticks are more often used in attacks and robberies.

Although Hawaii made a choice to call them electric guns, they are not guns. Other than the ergonomic shape, they have absolutely nothing in common with firearms.

-Should this list of prohibited places be put into effect, it would disproportionately affect government workers, some of the very people the bill implies it wants to protect. 29% of Hawaii's adult residents work for the city, county, or state governments. Each of these people would be prohibited from traveling to work or carrying after work an electric arm for self-defense.

-Parents taking their children to school would be prohibited from carrying a taser for self-defense as such; this leaves them vulnerable to predators who often target young families because of the ease with which they can do so.

-Taxi drivers, tour bus operators, employees, and other staff who work at or around the airport would be left defenseless before, during, and after work. Often these employees start early in the morning and end late at night, and a vast majority of airport employees rely on public transport to get to work. Carrying past the checkpoints of airports is already illegal under federal law.

-This bill also appears to vastly target those of lower economic stature. Those that rely on public transport to get to and from work, who use government services, and live in less desirable areas. Public transport is rampant with crime, with passengers and drivers being attacked and sexually assaulted on an almost daily basis.

Hawaii firearms coalition strongly opposes this bill for the above reasons.

I strongly oppose this bill.

When I and two children were attacked near a bus stop two years ago by a man experiencing a violent psychotic episode, verbal de-escalation did not work, and although I was physically capable of outrunning him, I could not abandon the children I was with. I don't know if he had any weapons on him, but I didn't want to wait to find out. Before he was able to get within arm's reach, the pepper spray I was carrying on my person diminished him greatly and he immediately wanted nothing to do with me or the kids. Had tasers been legal when this attack occurred, I could have used one to achieve a similar outcome. Thankfully, the pepper spray I had worked and I didn't have to go hands on with the man or use any other tools I had with me or any of my martial arts training to make him stop. I was unharmed, the kids were unharmed, and the man was in a world of pain, but ultimately, he was unharmed as well.

After that attack, I applied for a Hawaii concealed carry permit. I am in an vulnerable population making me statistically more likely to be attacked, and had just experienced an attack. Despite that, and despite being highly trained with firearms (I am a NRA firearms instructor, NRA Range Safety Officer, NRA Chief Range Safety Officer, MAGDFI Deadly Force Instructor, and I work full-time for a firearms training company that specializes in legal and moral self defense) my application was denied (just like all other applications have been denied for decades). My denial letter from the Chief of Police told me, "If you or any of those around you are placed in danger of bodily injury by word or deed, the police department should be contacted immediately so that proper action may be initiated."

When I pepper sprayed the man trying to attack me and the children, the entire attack from when he started charging at us to the time I pepper sprayed him was only about 5-7 seconds. There was no one else close by, I did not have time to call 911, and I could not retreat. No one was coming to save me. I was the primary agent in our rescue. I alone was the only person there who was prepared and able to ensure our safety.

I love, appreciate, and support HPD very much, but if my pepper spray incident (and so many other attacks like them) teaches Hawaii's residents and our legislators anything, it should be that the police cannot save you and that YOU are your own first responder. YOU are the primary agent in your own response to crisis. It's time for our self defense laws in Hawaii to change to reflect that truth. Allow the good, sane, sober, moral, prudent, law-abiding citizens of Hawaii to protect themselves wherever they go. Tasers "...must be used for self-defense, defense of another

person, or protection of property, WHICH CAN OCCUR ANYWHERE." -Hawaii Attorney General

When our legislative representatives are protected daily with armed security, prohibiting Hawaii's people from carrying a less lethal tool on government property reeks of hypocracy and an attitude that government officials are worth protecting, but that Hawaii's people are not. "Sucks to be you!" is the message that that sends, and frankly, it is infuriating.

My husband is a firefighter, our oldest son catches the bus to work, and I drop our middle son off at school every morning. None of us would be able to carry a taser with us daily if this bill is passed.

This bill will affect people of lower-incomes the most. They are already statistically more likely to be victimized, and are also the ones most likely to be walking and catching the bus and going to and from the government buildings and properties where carrying a taser would be prohibited if this bill is passed. If anyone should be carrying a taser, it should be them, but they would have nowhere to store their electric gun while at these prohibited places and therefore couldn't carry a taser with them. One of the teenage girls in my church was attacked on the bus recently on her way home from UH. A taser would have been a great less lethal distance tool that she could have used to protect herself. This bill will ensure that she will remain vulnerable to and from school.

Tasers are not known to cause death or great bodily harm, yet this bill seeks to create "taser free zones" akin to "gun free zones" but tasers simply cannot be used to harm, incapacitate, or kill multiple people like a firearm in a mass shooting. That's not how tasers work. Besides that, using a taser in a manner other than for protection of self, others, or property is already a crime. Passing this bill will only make Hawaii's people more vulnerable and help criminals because they will know exactly where to go to find a defenseless victim.

I, Edward L. Howard, am the President and CEO of Pax Bello Security Solutions Hawaii (PBSSH), a Security Consultant Firm licensed and operating within the State of Hawaii. As a citizen and business owner/operator in the State of Hawaii, and speaking on behalf of all PBSSH clients, I am submitting the following testimony regarding the above referenced House Bill. Although the prohibition of carrying in certain locations concept of protecting the general public is reasonably sound, the Honorable members of the State of Hawaii Legislature are grossly misguided with respect to the prohibitive language contained in and comprised of H.B. No. 1732.

In its current written form H.B. 1732 is unreasonable, overly burdensome, and perhaps unconstitutional because it restricts carrying of non-lethal designed/engineered Electric Guns for self-protection, protection of others and/or protection of property as to most if not all public places wherein crimes against persons are plausible, if not increasing in number of instances. While it is reasonable for the government to establish prohibitions of carrying these devices in certain and specific public places, it is not at all reasonable to do so in a manner that essentially renders the laws permitting the carrying of Electric Guns null and void, and more so in areas known to be subject to high rates of crimes against persons.

Some of these areas include, but are not limited to: University of Hawaii campus areas, such as parking lots and other secluded locations in and around the entire campus; parking structures and lots adjacent to and within the jurisdiction of Hawaii's airport terminals, ports and harbors; on mass transit buses and soon to be rail system; beaches and all facilities as well as grounds in and around beaches; and, public schools (jurisdiction of school property) particularly in high crime rate areas.

NO. 1732 / RELATING TO ELECTRIC GUNS Furthermore, Section 1. of H.B. 1732 states in pertinent part, "*Many states and federal agencies have enacted similar legislation and regulations to place location restrictions on electric guns...,*" which is disingenuous of the Legislature because it does not reflect the truth of the laws enacted in other states relative to stun guns and tasers. Federal promulgated rules and regulations are also mischaracterized by the Legislature's statements. The truth is that most states have adopted reasonable restrictions on carrying of Stun Guns/Tasers (AKA: in Hawaii Electric Guns) in public places, and generally those laws prohibit carrying these devices for example and specifically as follows:

- The secure area of airports, which is beyond the Transportation Safety Administration's Security Gates;
- 2. Passenger Terminals for Ports and Harbors;
- 3. State or local government buildings (all inclusive); and,
- 4. In open public meeting places.

Enactment of laws prohibiting Hawaii citizens from carrying legally obtained Electric Guns in the grossly restrictive manner as intended by the current language in H.B. No. 1732 serves no public service, except perhaps empowering Hawaii's criminal element to focus on would be innocent victims in those specific public places where Electric Guns are prohibited. The Legislature must recognize that in all areas (locations) that are generally restricted in other states by the laws they have enacted regarding the carrying of firearms and electric devices (Electric Guns, etc.), there is presumably sufficient government protection of the public assuming there is compliance of those laws, and reasonable detection/search measures of all persons to ensure and/or compel full compliance.

In closing, it is imperative that this information be taken seriously and considered fully to ensure that Hawaii citizens have all reasonable opportunities to avoid needlessly being victimized by society's present day crime surges. Electric Guns are non-lethal weapons as per manufacturers,

federal agencies, etc. and yet, the State of Hawaii Legislature, Law Enforcement and others appear to desire to treat these devices substantially similar to actual firearms, which Electric Guns simply do not compare. I am willing to work with the Honorable Members of the Legislature to develop/modify and implement language that achieves all reasonable restrictions the State should indeed possess, but also protect the citizens of Hawaii to exercise their rights to purchase, possess, own, and carry (for actual use if necessary to fend off an attacker) without having to endure unreasonable and perhaps unconstitutional government restrictions.

I am writing in opposition of bill HB1732.

I'm 2020, the FBI reported 3,576 violent crimes in Hawaii. The site safewise, reported violent crime had increased 16% in 2021 from the previous year.

This bill limits the right of people to carry a non-lethal defensive weapon. This bill limits defensive options of thousands of citizens in low income area who use mass transit in Hawaii. Just recently a tourist was attacked while waiting for a trolley in Waikiki. The assailant was suspected of being homeless. Roughly 36% of the adults have mental health issues and 31% struggle with substance abuse. Almost a third of the homeless in Hawaii suffer from mental health or substance abuse, and many frequent mass transit stations for shelter. This bill would take away a valuable defensive weapon for thousands. I wonder how many of the people who worked on this bill currently wait at a dark transit center in sketchy neighborhood. I use to ride the bus, I've waited at a bus stop at night worried about the sketchy people around me.

This bill limits citizens right to carry a non-lethal defensive weapon almost anywhere near a state or county buildings, several of which I might add are protected by Sheriffs and Security carrying stun guns and firearms. This bill extends even to the parking lot. Imagine if you will the staffer who works at the capital building, who has plans to meet with friends after work. In Honolulu, parking is limited, people are forced to walk to and from their cars. This staffer would be forced to leave their defensive weapon at home. Now, imagine the citizen who has to go to the court building because the person they have a restraining order against broke the order. This person can't leave their defensive weapon in the car. Limiting these weapons within state and county buildings is logical. This bill however, is shortsighted reaches beyond reasonable limitations.

A few days ago a woman was beaten to death with a tree trunk out front of the Kapolei Police Station, just in front of the building steps. This clearly outlines a huge problem with this bill. Firstly, even out front of a police station this woman was not protected. Secondly, it shows criminals do not care about laws. Thirdly, you don't even need a weapon to commit a violent crime, this assailant just picked up a tree trunk or branch.

This bill doesn't stop criminals. This bill only keeps honest people honest, while limiting their ability to defend themselves. This bill doesn't protect the thousands that use public transportation. Good Evening, to quote, "Nothing in Act 183" (now HRS134-8x) "limits the carrying or possession of electric guns in specific locations. The primary limitation on the use of electric guns is that they must be used for self-defense, defense of another person, or protection of property, which can occur anywhere." Hawaii Attorney General in a reply brief to the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals.

I personally oppose HB1732 as it will severely limit law abiding citizens from being able to defend themselves or others. For example, lawful electric gun owners will be prohibited from carrying a taser in the following places: a public mass transit vehicle (bus); a nonresidential building owned, leased, or controlled by the State or county; an office owned or leased by the State or county. As outlined in the current statute, HRS 134-81 thru HRS 134-90, the people of Hawaii finally have an avenue to defend themselves. The specifics of the statute are very clear and I consider this piece of legislation to be well written.

As a current federal law enforcment officer in corrections, and as a fomer military police officer in the Hawaii Army National Guard, I received training on the Taser, specifically the Launched Electrode Stun Device, X26E, Train the Trainer Course (8 hours). I can state that this specific electric gun was very effective at incapacitiating me when I was "tased" during the course. They are an effective tool, and when used in accordance with HRS 134-81 thru HRS 134-90, they will give a level of safety to the general public.

I urge you to not support this bill. If you do you will be severely restricing a right that was just given to the people of Hawaii.

This bill would deny the right to self-defense, especially the right to use a non-lethal method to defend oneself, to many of those who might need it most: the hotel worker, the nurse, the Uber or Lyft driver, anyone who takes public transport, or drops off their children at school, or has to visit a government office, medical clinic, or anywhere else on the broad list of prohibited places. This turns what is a right, as recognized by the US Supreme Court in *Caetano*, into a privilege that few people can access.

I am a firearms instructor who teaches, among other disciplines, concealed carry firearms courses recognized by 39 states. I have had numerous students who told me that they wished for a less-lethal means to defend him- or her-self. I know of a nurse whose abusive ex-boyfriend repeatedly threatened her life. While she was trained in firearm skills and safety, she couldn't bring herself to carry a gun, even if that were a legal option for her. She wanted something that would stop her ex- should he try to fulfill his threat, but electric guns and Tasers were not legally available to her, so the doctors at her hospital bought her a very loud rape whistle. It wasn't nearly enough defense for her, although it did attract numerous witnesses who later testified at her ex-boyfriend's murder trial.

Prohibiting defensive tools on public transit is one of the very worst aspects of this bill because it tells every predator that those riding the bus or train is pretty defenseless against attack. I can picture a housekeeper, a nurse, or a cook, getting off shift after dark, waiting alone at a bus stop... easy pickings for a predator, knowing that they are disarmed by law.

Extending that prohibition to schools, public buildings, and events, will mean that anyone who needs to go to one of those any time during a day will have to leave their protection at home, no matter where else they travel to during the day.

OPPOSE HB1732.

I work as an armed Protective Security Officer at the Federal properties in Hawaii. I secure the entrances to the buildings and perform security screenings using metal detectors and x-ray machines. Federal policy is to not allow pepper spray, electric guns, and other instruments into the buildings or properties.

I feel ashamed for doing this as I leave the visitors defenseless against criminals outside. Many of them are low-income, elderly, disabled, and live in high crime areas. Many of them catch the bus or walk there. They either leave their defensive tools at home or discard them in the bushes and trashcans for someone else to pickup. There are homeless, drug addicts, crazy people, and criminals everywhere and these people have to walk the gauntlet undefended. I do the same by walking a half mile to my car late at night or catching the bus home.

Unlike the Federal properties, nearly all State and County properties are not secure. Crime can happen anywhere to anyone even in front of a police station or at the Capitol. There are no metal detectors or secured entrances, so criminals are free to bring contraband in since they don't obey laws. Good people cannot because we follow laws. If a violent incident occurs, there's usually no armed security to immediately respond.

This is a "feel good" law and creates a false sense of security since criminals are unaffected by this law. The government employees could be given permission to carry electric guns to protect themselves, but the public cannot. It seems like the safety of the public is not a concern, is out of sight…out of mind, and a "not my responsibility" attitude.

Do not pass HB1732. Allow the people to protect themselves.
