Fiscal Implications: Funding estimated at \$100,000 would be needed for the Department of 1 2 Health to implement this measure including, medical records system changes, training and data analysis and reporting. The Department requests that passage of any appropriations in this 3 measure does not replace or adversely impact priorities indicated in the Department's 4 5 supplemental budget request. **Department Testimony:** The Department of Health supports the intent of H.B. 1903 H.D. 1 6 7 that requires first responders to record in the incident report for each water rescue event the type of snorkel and mask, if any, worn by the person who was rescued or recovered. The Department 8 9 is providing comments in regard to emergency medical services only.

10 Every year an average of 66 Hawaii residents and visitors experience snorkel related drowning

events. Approximately twenty are fatal. Understanding snorkel use can lead to better public

12 health messaging and improvements in snorkel design.

13 For data to be collected, analyzed, and reported, changes need to be made to our existing pre-

14 hospital emergency medical services (EMS) record system to collect the additional data.

15 Providing EMS personnel a convenient way to document in the pre-hospital medical record is

16 preferred.

Aloha Chair Johanson, Vice Chair Kitagawa, and House Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce,

Mālama Pūpūkea-Waimea (MPW) is a Hawai'i non-profit organization founded on the North Shore of O'ahu in 2005. Our mission is "working to replenish and sustain the natural and cultural resources of the Pūpūkea and Waimea ahupua'a for present and future generations through active community stewardship, education, and partnerships." For eighteen years, we have focused our stewardship and education efforts on the Pūpūkea Marine Life Conservation District (MLCD), one of only three MLCDs on O'ahu and eleven statewide.

Due to the Pūpūkea MLCD's extreme popularity as a premier snorkeling destination and our constant presence there, we see first-hand the unfortunate number of snorkeling-related rescues conducted by our City and County lifeguards. Often, in the moment of an in-water emergency, whatever mask a victim was wearing is tossed aside as resuscitation measures are taking place and there is no documentation of gear type.

We **support HB1903 SD1** to require first responders to document which type of mask a victim was wearing when the emergency occurred because we indeed notice that far more in-water snorkeling emergencies happen with people wearing full-face masks in comparison to the traditional two-piece mask and snorkel. Collecting this data would allow the Hawai'i Department of Health to assess the risk of certain equipment, and ultimately take action to inform and protect the thousands of people who snorkel throughout Hawai'i each day.

Voting in favor of HB1903 SD1 would enable updates to the Hawaii Department of Health's system to allow for much-needed snorkeling equipment data collection and analysis.

This Bill is very important to help save lives.

My name is Julie Urbon. I *strongly* support HB1903 which would require first responders to document what type of snorkel equipment is used during rescue and recovery incidents. It is my understanding that this information is not currently collected in a consistent or standardized manner which cripples the Dept. of Health's understanding of the true risks of full-face snorkel masks.

This bill was introduced in honor of David Loasby, who died while using a full-face snorkel mask in December 2021. I was there with his family just before the incident occurred. I see daily the pain this has caused his family.....Not just that Dave lost his life, but the added anger and guilt because it very well could have been prevented. Since the tragedy, we have done digging and found, through studies on these masks, that carbon dioxide can build up and can render the user unconscious. But apparently no one is willing to *definitively* say that there is a direct link to increased drowning? I think it is safe to say that going unconscious while in the water will increases your risk of drowning. This seems like such a basic request.... when a snorkeler dies, document what type of equipment the victim was using. Studies, like those that have been done, can only go so far. The studies show that there are concerns. Once the product is on the market, any "additional data" is unfortunately gathered after an incident occurs. We cannot let this valuable information go uncollected. Those incidents can be deadly.

Many tourists who come to the islands only snorkel a few times a year and don't know a great deal about the differences in the types of masks that are sold. There are snorkel tours on Maui that ban those masks on their boats. Why would they do that if they didn't see the connection? They are the ones most familiar with the equipment. If THEY are nervous about the masks... we should all take notice and listen. There should be a heightened awareness to locals and visitors alike. That awareness wont happen until they definitively link the mask to an increased risk of drowning. And that cant happen if we don't collect the information! Had we gone on a snorkeling tour, we might have heard about the risk through the tour operator, but instead we snorkeled at the beach near our accommodations. A beautiful vacation turned into a horrific nightmare because "not enough information! It is simply one more question for first responders to ask or determine if possible. In a car accident, isn't it documented whether the passengers were wearing seat belts? It harms no one to collect this information. I think it sends a horrible message if the state is unwilling to take a simple step to be more thorough in the investigations into these drownings to safeguard its residents <u>and</u> the tourists that are such a part of the local economy. I appreciate your time. Imagine it was a member of your family....
