RELATING TO THE SAND ISLAND STATE RECREATION AREA

The Department of Budget and Finance (B&F) offers comments on this bill.

House Bill No. 2016, H.D. 1, requires the Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) to prepare a master plan for the Sand Island State Recreation Area and appropriates an unspecified amount of general funds for FY 23 for the DLNR to prepare a park master plan.

B&F notes that, with respect to the general fund appropriation in this bill, the federal Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act requires that states receiving Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) II funds and Governor's Emergency Education Relief II funds must maintain state support for:

- Elementary and secondary education in FY 22 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for elementary and secondary education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19; and
- Higher education in FY 22 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for higher education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19.

Further, the federal American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act requires that states receiving ARP ESSER funds must maintain state support for:

- Elementary and secondary education in FY 22 and FY 23 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for elementary and secondary education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19; and
- Higher education in FY 22 and FY 23 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for higher education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19.

The U.S. Department of Education has issued rules governing how these maintenance of effort (MOE) requirements are to be administered. B&F will be working with the money committees of the Legislature to ensure that the State of Hawai'i complies with these ESSER MOE requirements.

In consideration of **HOUSE BILL 2016, HOUSE DRAFT 1** RELATING TO THE SAND ISLAND STATE RECREATION AREA

House Bill 2016, House Draft 1 proposes to appropriate moneys to the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) to prepare a master plan for the Sand Island State Recreation Area. The Department supports this measure provided that its passage does not replace or adversely impact priorities indicated in the Executive Supplemental Budget request.

The Department recognizes the importance of providing outdoor recreational opportunities, safe and well-maintained park infrastructure and facilities, and the protection of cultural and historic resources. The previous Sand Island State Recreation Area plan was completed in 1973 but never fully implemented – the focus was on water sports at that time and comprehensive development of shoreline pathways and passive recreational sites. Since then, the Sand Island State Recreation Area has become a diverse use park unit, and provides opportunities for day use, camping, fishing, surfing, softball play, canoe paddling, non-motorized BMX bicycle use with additional areas of open grass fields that can accommodate a variety of passive recreation and general open space for picnic and family gatherings.

However, the Park is in a deleterious condition with aging infrastructure, irrigation deficiencies, and is currently undergoing a new sewer line repair. Other challenges include constant homelessness, invasive kiawe in the undeveloped area, an entrenched feral cat population and the shoreline is now subject to the impacts of climate change and sea level rise (SLR). Most of the Sand Island State Recreation Area is dredged material from the adjacent sea lanes and has been impacted by the recent King Tides that are now eroding the shoreline. The shoreline itself has

remnants of wartime materials and object and there is a current CIP to identify and clean up these unnatural features that are now more exposed due to SLR impacts.

The Sand Island State Recreation Area's location in the urban core and adjacent a densely populated resident community makes the demand and popularity of developing an urban flagship park more optimized as a "People's Park" warrant another funded planning effort. An updated master plan for the Sand Island State Recreation Area would help to address the weathered and antiquated facilities, create increased outdoor recreation opportunities, plans for underutilized spaces of the Park and guide the Department in adaptive management and resilience to the impact of SLR on coastal recreational land.

Dear Chair Luke and members of the Committee on Finance,

Sand Island Business Association (SIBA) is pleased to testify on House Bill 2016 HD 1 Relating to the Sand Island State Recreation Area. In 1992, DLNR entered into a 55-year lease with SIBA for the Sand Island Industrial Park which is adjacent to the Sand Island Recreation Area and covers approximately 74 acres divided into 112 lots. SIBA is a non-profit entity that was formed by the lessees of the park for the purpose of providing a single master lease to the DLNR. All of the small business users of the lots became sub-lessees of SIBA, and also its members. SIBA is the representative and master lessee and is the voice of its members.

House Bill 2016 HD 1 stated purpose is to require the department of land and natural resources to prepare a master plan for the Sand Island state recreation area that develops the concept of a "people's park", and appropriates moneys for the preparation of the master plan. SIBA respectfully requests that the primary focus of any park planning has to address the issue of safety in the park due to the homeless population that inhabits this park and the surrounding area. SIBA has received numerous complaints from tenants over the years related to thieves cutting and/or climbing our fences from the park to our lots and leaving through the park with stolen goods. In addition, there are many homeless individuals living in vehicles illegally parked in a bicycle lane on Sand Island Parkway near the entrance to the park. SIBA remembers when Harbor Police used to chase people and vehicles out with bullhorns - now the gate is just closed and whoever is inside stays overnight.

Planning efforts need to create public spaces that are safe, comfortable, and welcoming for people of all ages, abilities, incomes and social identities. The pandemic has highlighted that Hawaii's parks are essential places for individual and community health and wellbeing.
