In consideration of

HB 2034, HD1 RELATING TO THE HAWAII COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY.

Chair Nakashima, Vice Chair Matayoshi, and members of the Committee. The Hawaii Community Development Authority (HCDA), **supports HB 2034, HD1 with amendments**.

The bill removes the county council as the nominating authority for the HCDA community development district boards.

We respectfully request the committee to delete some extraneous language in Section 3 on page 9, lines 9 through 13, as this language could conflict with the effective date of the bill:

provided that the existing representatives of the Heeia community development district, Kalaeloa community development district, and Kakaako community development district shall continue to serve until the expiration of their respective terms.
