#### HOUSE BILL 2066 RELATING TO JOINT CONTRACTOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR LISTING

Chair McKelvey, Vice Chair Wildberger, and members of the committee, thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony on HB2066. The State Procurement Office's (SPO) comments are a minor clarification to the proposed bill.

The Contractor License Board, Professional and Vocational Licensing Division, Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs (DCCA), has brought to SPO's attention that under Chapter 444, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), and Chapter 66-77, Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR), the term "joint contractor" is not used.

However, there is a type of contracting entity, "joint venture," that may be used and is provided under Section 3-120, HAR, Definitions:

"Bidder" means any individual, partnership, firm, corporation, joint venture, or other legal entity submitting, directly or through a duly authorized representative or agent, a bid for the good, service, or construction contemplated.

# RELATING TO JOINT CONTRACTOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR LISTING

Chair McKelvey, Vice Chair Wildberger, and Members of the Committee, thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony on H.B. 2066. The Department of Accounting and General Services (DAGS) strongly supports this bill which we believe will reduce delays in construction awards due to misinterpretation of the statutorial requirement which can force the State to eliminate responsive bids and pay more for construction without any benefit.

Recently, bidders have begun to use the current language as a means to protest bids which failed to list subcontractors who are not required to be licensed under chapter 444, HRS, contrary to long-standing interpretation and practice. These protests cause delays in the construction procurements process and may result in award to the protestor at a higher price. One of the protests was appealed to the circuit court and to the intermediate court of appeals before the parties agreed to dismiss the appeal. It has become abundantly clear that clarification of the requirements of 103D-302(b) is necessary to prevent further confusion as to its meaning.
