I am Major General Kenneth Hara, Adjutant General, Director of the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency and Homeland Security Advisor.

The Department of Defense (DOD) provides written testimony in **SUPPORT** of HB2117 HD1.

The Hawaii Code of Military Justice (HCMJ) was originally enacted in 1982. This measure if passed will update the HCMJ into the 21st Century. This update is needed to give commanders the tools they need to maintain good order and discipline within the State Military Forces while simultaneously protecting the due process rights of the accused. These changes were based on a model provided by the National Guard Bureau, and also brings non-judicial punishment and court-martial procedures further in line with the Uniform Code of Military Justice as contained in title 10 United States Code.

In addition, this update was coordinated with the Judiciary and the department has no issues with the comments they have submitted in prior testimony. Finally, this revision will further develop confidence in an independent military justice system.
