Aloha Chair Luke, Vice Chair Yamashita, and members of the Committee:

The Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL) supports this bill establishing a cesspool compliance pilot grant project to assist low- and moderate-income property owners, including lessees on Hawaiian home lands, with the costs of upgrading, converting, or connecting a cesspool identified as failing by the Department of Health.

DHHL is especially supportive of the inclusion of low- and moderate-income lessees on Hawaiian Home Lands to access funding through this pilot grant project. Lessees are experiencing increased costs because of septic system requirements and given limited financing options on Hawaiian Home Lands, this measure provides a much needed resource. The Hawaiian Homes Commission in the past two years approved a measure establishing a low-interest loan program to offer financial assistance for lessees on Hawaiian Home Lands with cesspools to be ungraded or converted to septic systems or aerobic treatment unit systems or connected to existing sewer systems or any other wastewater treatment systems approved by the Department of Health, but DHHL hasn't been able to design the appropriate mechanism to accomplish the result.

Fiscal Implications: The Department of Health (Department) would need at least one full-time 1 2 temporary position to implement the proposed cesspool compliance pilot project. This measure may impact the priorities identified in the Governor's Executive Budget Request for the

Department's appropriations and personnel priorities. 4

Department Testimony: The Department supports this measure as long as it does not impact 5 the priorities requested in the Executive Budget. The Department would also prefer that a tax 6 7 credit is offered instead of a grant. The Department is unsure how we would be able to administer a grant program to the general public if this measure is passed. 8

Cesspools are a major source of pollution to Hawaii's waters. There are approximately 9 88,000 cesspools in the State, discharging millions of gallons of untreated sewage into the 10 groundwater every day. The sewage polluted groundwater flows into drinking water sources, 11 streams and the ocean, harming public health and the environment, including beaches and coral 12 reefs. Ninety-five percent of all drinking water in Hawaii comes from groundwater sources. 13 Cesspools should be phased out to eliminate threats to drinking water and recreational waters. 14

The Department believes the pilot project should focus on low and moderate-income 15 homeowners. The 2017 legislature report should not be referenced because the Department is 16 working on updating the report. 17

Offered Amendments: Revise measure to implement a tax credit program similar to HB1805 18 19 HD1 instead of a grant program.

RELATING TO CESSPOOLS

The Department of Budget and Finance (B&F) offers comments on this bill.

House Bill No. 2195, H.D. 2:

- Establishes the cesspool compliance pilot grant project (CCPGP) in the Department of Health (DOH) to assist property owners, including lessees on Hawaiian home lands, with upgrading, converting, or connecting a cesspool that DOH has identified as failing.
- Requires DOH to adopt rules as necessary to carry out the CCPGP, provided that the rules shall include a method of calculating a sliding scale grant amount based upon the federal adjusted gross income of the owner of the property with a failing cesspool.
- Appropriates an unspecified amount of general funds in FY 23 to DOH to implement the CCPGP.

B&F notes that, with respect to the general fund appropriation in this bill, the federal Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act requires that

states receiving Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) II funds and Governor's Emergency Education Relief II funds must maintain state support for:

- Elementary and secondary education in FY 22 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for elementary and secondary education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19; and
- Higher education in FY 22 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for higher education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19.

Further, the federal American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act requires that states receiving ARP ESSER funds must maintain state support for:

- Elementary and secondary education in FY 22 and FY 23 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for elementary and secondary education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19; and
- Higher education in FY 22 and FY 23 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for higher education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19.

The U.S. Department of Education has issued rules governing how these maintenance of effort (MOE) requirements are to be administered. B&F will be working with the money committees of the Legislature to ensure that the State of Hawai'i complies with these ESSER MOE requirements.

I thank you for the opportunity to testify in SUPPORT of HB 2195 HD2.

The requirement to upgrade or convert a cesspool imposes a financial burden on low- and moderate-income families, therefore the purpose of this Act is to assist low- and moderate-income property owners, including lessees on Hawaiian home lands, with upgrading, converting, or connecting their failing cesspools to more environmentally appropriate systems or sewerage systems by creating a pilot grant project to assist with conversion costs.

Failing cesspools are contaminating the State's ground water, streams, and coastal ecosystems.
