RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION

The Department of Budget and Finance (B&F) offers comments on this bill.

House Bill No. 2329, H.D. 1, requires the Department of Land and Natural

Resources (DLNR) to place historical markers in the State in consultation with the

Hawai'i Tourism Authority and State Foundation on Culture and the Arts, to identify

significant sites in the life of President Barack Obama and appropriates an unspecified

amount of general funds for FY 23 to be expended by DLNR's State Historic

Preservation Division for this purpose.

B&F notes that, with respect to the general fund appropriation in this bill, the federal Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act requires that states receiving Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) II funds and Governor's Emergency Education Relief II funds must maintain state support for:

 Elementary and secondary education in FY 22 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for elementary and secondary education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19; and Higher education in FY 22 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for higher education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19.

Further, the federal American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act requires that states receiving ARP ESSER funds must maintain state support for:

- Elementary and secondary education in FY 22 and FY 23 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for elementary and secondary education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19; and
- Higher education in FY 22 and FY 23 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for higher education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19.

The U.S. Department of Education has issued rules governing how these maintenance of effort (MOE) requirements are to be administered. B&F will be working with the money committees of the Legislature to ensure that the State of Hawai'i complies with these ESSER MOE requirements.

In consideration of HOUSE BILL 2329, HOUSE DRAFT 1 RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION

House Bill 2329, House Draft 1 proposes to direct the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) to place markers at locations important to President Barak H. Obama as a youth born in and growing up in Hawaii. **The Department supports this measure.**

House Bill 2329, House Draft 1 proposes to direct the Department to place markers at locations important to President Obama growing up in Hawaii. The measure specifies a list of places where markers are to be placed. In the case of locations that are privately owned, the measure also proposes to require that such markers only be placed with the permission of the property owner. Lastly, House Bill 2329, House Draft 1 proposes to appropriate an unspecified sum to the Department to carry out this activity. The Department believes that it is important and entirely appropriate that the State of Hawaii celebrate and commemorate President Obama's life in Hawaii.

The Department appreciates the appropriation of funds for this activity and notes that this is not funded in the Executive Supplement Budget request. The Department estimates that it will require approximately \$200,000 to complete this task.

RE: HB 2329 HD1 - Relating to Historic Preservation - Comments, request amendment

Aloha Chair Luke, Vice Chair Yamashita and members of the committee:

HB 2329 HD1 requires the department of land and natural resources to place historical markers in the State to indicate significant sites in the life of President Barack Obama identified by the department, in consultation with the Hawaii Tourism Authority and State Foundation on Culture and the Arts, and appropriates funds for this purpose.

In its current form, HB 2329 HD1 provides that if a location identified for a historical marker is the property of a "private business," the marker shall only by placed at the business' property if the private business agrees. If a private business does not agree to have a marker placed on the business' property, the marker shall be placed on public property nearest to that location. HB 2329 HD1 does not address situations where a location identified for a historical marker is a private residence.

Given the security, privacy and other concerns attendant with a private residence, we respectfully request your consideration of the following amendment:

Page 2, add (3) If the location identified for a historical marker is a private residence, the historical marker shall only be placed on private or public property if the private residence owner agrees to have the historical marker placed that identifies the residence.
