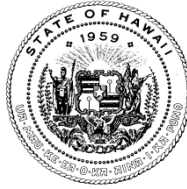

RELATING TO MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION TO THE STATE DRUG
AND ALCOHOL TOXICOLOGY TESTING LABORATORY SPECIAL FUND

House Committee(s) on Health, Human Services, & Homelessness and Transportation

The Department of Transportation (DOT) **supports** H.B. 2339. This measure makes an emergency appropriation from the state highway fund to the Department of Health's (DOH) state drug and alcohol toxicology testing laboratory special fund for fiscal year 2021-2022 and authorizes the DOH to expend funds from the special fund for the establishment of the state drug and alcohol toxicology testing laboratory.

Act 196, which passed into law last legislative session, established the special fund. This bill is needed to appropriate moneys from the state highway fund into the state drug and alcohol testing laboratory special fund and provide spending authority to the DOH to establish the state drug and alcohol, and toxicology testing laboratory.

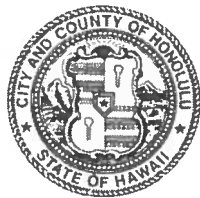

SUBJECT: House Bill No. 2339, Making an Emergency Appropriation to the State Drug and Alcohol Toxicology Testing Laboratory Special Fund

I am Acting Forensic Laboratory Director Hugh Okubo of the Scientific Investigation Section of the Honolulu Police Department (HPD), City and County of Honolulu.

The HPD supports House Bill No. 2339, Making an Emergency Appropriation to the State Drug and Alcohol Toxicology Testing Laboratory Special Fund.

The HPD supports the funding and creation of a State Drug and Alcohol Toxicology Testing Laboratory. Currently drug and alcohol toxicology testing is outsourced to the mainland as there is no local forensic toxicology laboratory. Establishment of a state forensic toxicology laboratory will, over time, save time and money for the required testing of evidence in criminal cases.

The HPD urges you to support House Bill No. 2339, Making an Emergency Appropriation to the State Drug and Alcohol Toxicology Testing Laboratory Special Fund, and thanks you for the opportunity to testify.

I am Kurt Kendro, Chair of MADD Hawaii's Public Policy Committee and retired Major from the Honolulu Police Department speaking on behalf of the members of MADD Hawaii Advisory Board in STRONG SUPPORT of House Bill 2339.

Of the 50 states, Hawaii is the only state that does not have a State Drug and Alcohol Toxicology laboratory. This type of laboratory is absolutely essential in order to successfully prosecute offenders who are arrested for Operating a Vehicle under the Influence of an Intoxicant. Currently, if an offender is believed to be driving under the influence of drugs, a mainland company must test the blood or urine for the presence of drugs. Witnesses must then be brought to Hawaii to testify at trial in order to obtain a conviction. It is an impossible task to successfully prosecute these offenders and keep them off of the highways.

Passage of this bill will allow for an emergency appropriation for fiscal year 2021-2022 for the establishment of the state drug and alcohol toxicology testing laboratory. Passage of this bill will help make our roadways safer for everyone.

MADD Hawaii STRONGLY SUPPORTS House Bill 2339 and ask that this bill be passed.
