The SFA takes no position on the proposed transfer, but notes that the SFA is in its first six months of operations and is currently in the process of promulgating administrative rules on practice and procedure. In addition, the SFA is initiating the process to recruit its first executive director and hire three staff positions. The SFA respectfully requests your committee defer consideration of part IV of the bill until such time that the SFA is well established and fully operational as the operations over the next year can better inform future decisions on the appropriate placement of the authority.

Chair Luke, Vice Chair Yamashita, and Members of the Committee, thank you for the opportunity to testify on H.B. 2470, H.D. 1. The Department of Accounting and General Services (DAGS) support the overall intent of this bill and offers the following comments and concerns .

DAGS appreciates the legislature's overall support of the New Aloha Stadium Entertainment District (NASED) and the additional \$180,000,000 in general obligation funding. We are concerned, however, that the proposed language in Section 11 may not achieve the desired intent to support seamless progress on the Stadium Development District's progress for the following reasons:

 Revising the expending authority for the previously appropriated funds may negate the transactions undertaken for funds already delegated by the Stadium Authority to DAGS that are encumbered, especially where encumbered to existing contracts. Instead, DAGS recommends keeping the Stadium Authority as the expending agency, as this designation will be retained wherever they are administratively attached.

Further, increasing the authorization to issue general obligation bonds from \$170,000,000 to \$350,000,000 by amending Act 268, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019, section 6, as amended by section 5 of Act 4, Session Laws of Hawaii 2020, as amended by section 18 of Act 146, Session Laws of Hawaii 2021, may not allow for assigning a new funds lapse date of June 30, 2024, as we understand that the lapse date is determined by the project authorization date, not the funds appropriation date. Therefore, merely amending the acts related back to Act 268, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019, may lock the funds lapse date at June 30, 2022. Instead, DAGS recommends that a new project appropriation be established in this bill for the Stadium Development District in the differential amount of \$180,000,000 comprised of \$130,000,000 in general obligation bonds for necessary design and construction costs, and \$50,000,000 in general funds to support the interim operations of the Stadium Authority and the Stadium Development District.

DAGS also concurs with, supports, and defers to the Stadium Authority for consideration to address their additional valid concerns as enumerated in their testimony. At this infancy stage of the New Aloha Stadium Entertainment District, the utmost care must be given to ensure the best, most professional opportunities for success are established.

DAGS will continue to coordinate closely with the Stadium Authority and stakeholders to ensure our on-going project efforts coincide with the future goals to bring benefit in the best interests of the State and its people.

Chair Luke, Vice Chair Yamashita, and members of the committee, thank you for the opportunity to submit this testimony with comments on H.B. 2470, H.D.1.

With much recognition and appreciation, the Stadium Authority (Authority) would like to take this opportunity to thank the legislature and the Department of Accounting and General Services (DAGS) for its many years of continuous support toward building a New Aloha Stadium Entertainment District (NASED) that includes redevelopment of its surrounding land into a vibrant and robust entertainment district. We would not be at this stage of development if not for the collective and coordinated support from these entities working together to reach project completion. Thank you for your continued support.

From a macro perspective, the Authority understands the intent of the legislature in aggregating enterprise agencies as well as centralizing land development expertise and functions under the Department of Economic Development and Tourism (DBEDT). The Authority is supportive of all efforts to continue the positive progress and momentum that has been established that will drive this project's development through completion.

The Authority greatly appreciates the \$350,000,000 in general obligation bond funding required to support the completion of the State of Hawaii's new sports and entertainment facility.

The Authority also appreciates the clarity provided in Section 7 of HB 2470, <u>H.D.1</u> pertaining to Section 109-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The language in this draft will allow the Stadium Authority Board to move forward with a clear understanding of Legislative intent.

The Authority also offers the following vital comments on various Sections of this measure and would respectfully appreciate the legislature's consideration of these recommendations:

<u>Regarding Section 5.</u>: The Authority respectfully asks for the legislature's support in exempting the Stadium Development Special Fund from its pro-rata share of the departmental administrative assessment. As the NASED project continues on course through project completion, the Authority will require operating resources to address costs directly related to transitioning from its current stadium operating model to an interim operating model during its demolition/ construction phase, and finally transitioning to a fully implemented NASED operating model.

During this multi-year, multi-phase process, the Authority understands its responsibility to continue to maximize revenue generation while decreasing fees and expenses through implementation of lean, practical operating procedures and prudent financial decision making. The Authority also understands the critical value in being exempted from the departmental administrative assessment towards supporting and ensuring financial solvency. An exemption from the administrative assessment fee will undoubtedly help reduce the need for the Authority to seek additional funding to address project transition requirements as well as support continued financial solvency of the operation.

<u>**Regarding Section 11.</u>**: Act 146, SLH 2021 designated the Authority as the expending authority for capital improvement projects authorized by this Act. Further, with the approval of the Governor, it allows for delegation of this expending authority to other State agencies. This provision has allowed the Authority to delegate the transfer and expenditure of funds and project implementation to the subject matter expert – DAGS.</u>

In HB 2470, H.D. 1, we continue to have concern that the proposed language in Section 11 to replace the Authority as the expending agency and transfer this responsibility to DBEDT may be problematic, specific to funds already appropriated, delegated to, and encumbered by DAGS. We respectfully request that the Authority remain as the expending agency, to include the option to delegate implementation and transfer of funds to facilitate project completion. We believe this will allow the process to continue seamlessly, and efficiently and minimize the likelihood of delays in sorting out technical issues of a new process.

The Authority defers to DAGS and the Legislature on the appropriate language that will allow the Authority to receive the additional combination of funding necessary to ensure project completion. HB 2470, H.D.1 (FIN) February 28, 2022 Page 3

Chair Luke, Vice Chair Yamashita and members of the Committee.

The Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism (DBEDT) supports the intent of HB2470, HD1, which establishes the DBEDT director as an ex-officio voting member of the Hawaii Tourism Authority and the School Facilities Authority Boards and transfers the Stadium Authority and the School Facilities Authority to DBEDT.

DBEDT agrees with centralizing state functions to gain efficiencies and expertise and will continue discussions to evaluate the current state of personnel, funding, and contracts of the Stadium Authority and the School Facilities Authority to ensure proper transfer of these agencies to DBEDT without operational interruption should these transfers occur.

For consistency, we ask that the committee revise Part III, Section 7 (Page 15, Lines 1-6) to reflect that the director of DBEDT or the designee be an ex-officio <u>voting</u> member of the stadium authority as well.

Title of Bill: HB 2470, HD1 RELATING TO GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS.

Purpose of Bill: Establishes the director of business, economic development, and tourism, or a designee of the director, as an ex-officio, voting member of the Hawaii tourism authority and the school facilities authority board. Transfers the stadium authority and school facilities authority from the department of accounting and general services and department of education, respectively, to the department of business, economic development, and tourism. Amends the composition of the stadium authority. Requires that administrative expenses incurred for the stadium development special fund be deducted. Increases the amount of general obligation bonds that may be issued for the stadium development district. Effective 10/18/2050. (HD1)

The Department of Budget and Finance (B&F) offers comments on Section 11 of this bill. B&F defers to the appropriate departments and agencies on the remainder of

this bill.

B&F notes that Section 11 of this bill further amends Section 6 of Act 268,

SLH 2019, as amended, to increase the general obligation (G.O.) bond appropriation for

the Stadium Development District from \$170,000,000 to \$350,000,000 in FY 20.

However, a FY 20 G.O. bond appropriation will lapse on June 30, 2022. If the

Committee intends to move this appropriation forward, B&F suggests lapsing the

appropriation made in Act 268 and making a new G.O. bond appropriation for the

desired amount in FY 23.
