Comments:

Aloha. I'm submitting testimony in support of HB775 renaming Airport Access Way to Mayor Elmer Cravalho Way. Cravalho was the first Speaker of the House post-Statehood and the first Mayor of the County of Maui.

Cravalho accomplished a lot for the State of Hawaii and the County of Maui, especially in creating Maui as a premier destination for visitors. As Mayor, he limited tourism on Maui to the Kaanapali and Wailea areas and always emphasized Maui should go after the F.I.T.--the free independent traveler--instead of the large tour groups.

Renaming Airport Access Way would be a fitting tribute. At the end of Airport Access Way, it connects with Puunene Avenue and Kuihelani Highway. Kuihelani Highway to the front leads to the Kaanapali and Wailea areas. Puunene Avenue on the left leads to the old H.C.&.S. Sugar Mill while on the right leads to the initial increments of Kahului-known as Dream City--where plantation workers received deeds to homes with the phase out of the plantations. A little past the old H.C.&.S. Sugar Mill is the Maui Veterans Highway which was renamed from Mokulele Highway by the Legislatue in 2017 and became Act 11 with Governor Ige's signature.

Mayor Cravalho was always concerned about providing opportunities for locals and immigrants. He was instrumental in hiring many Filipinos to work for the County and to be the "First Filipino" in that capacity--whether it was Managing Director (Claro Capili) or Executive Assistant (Patrick Constantino).

Mayor Cravalho continued to be active in the community after retirement from elective office. He was on the Board of Water Supply and served as CEO of Kula Credit Union, which he co-founded.

He loved to share his man`ao and contributed greatly to the success of the State of Hawaii and the County of Maui.
