The Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") offers the following comments for consideration.

COMMENTS:

The Commission appreciates the intent of this resolution to ensure that Hana Highway is properly maintained and is safe for residents and visitors.

The Commission, through its authority in Chapter 271, HRS, investigates complaints surrounding motor carriers, enforces regulations, and assesses penalties as appropriate. The Commission is planning a robust enforcement presence as tourism activity is expected to increase towards pre-pandemic levels this summer.

The Commission has recently partnered with DLNR to ensure that only licensed motor carriers are able to operate at Waianapanapa State Park. This partnership has been successful in reducing the number of unlicensed vehicles operating in the area. The Commission will continue to work with DLNR, other agencies, and local communities to ensure that motor carrier law is properly enforced.

Chair Lee, Vice Chair Inouye and Members of the Committees:

My name is Cheryl Vasconcellos and I am the Executive Director of Hana Health a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) providing essential primary care to patients residing in one of the most remote locations in the state. I am testifying in SUPPORT of this Continuing Resolution.

Hana Health has served the people of Hana, Maui for almost twenty-five years. We are the only primary health care provider in the district requiring that we provide urgent/emergent care 24/7 in addition to routine health, dental and behavioral health services.

The volume of traffic on the Hana Highway has increased substantially over the past several years primarily due to the promotion of the Hana Highway and Hana District as a visitor destination. The impacts to the Hana community are numerous and far reaching particularly with regards to the resident population's ability to access needed services on the "other side" of the island. What used to be a four hour round trip, has become a five and a half hour round trip due to the amount of traffic on the Highway during certain hours of each and every day.

For Hana Health patients accessing specialty care not available in Hana, or for women about to go into labor, traveling the highway has become particularly burdensome. For emergency vehicles transporting Hana Health patients to Maui Memorial Medical Center, this additional delay can also be life threatening. Hana has only one ambulance serving the district. The longer the ambulance is on the road, the longer Hana Health and the Hana community is without emergency medical support.

A holistic management plan for the care and maintenance of the Hana Highway is important to the safety of visitors and residents alike. We urge your support of this important resolution. Thank you.
