Dear Chair Woodson and Members of the House Committee on Education:

My name is Chieko Higuchi, MHS Class of 1966, and I am testifying in favor of HB64 and HCR71. I am in favor of these 2 resolutions to urge the Superintendent of Education to request the Board of Education to honor McKinley High School's 132 fallen soldiers by safeguarding and preserving the name of McKinley High School.

McKinley High School is one oldest secondary school in the Hawaiian Islands, founded in 1865, known then as Fort Street English Day School. It was known as McKinley High School since 1905 and is now going on it's 117<sup>th</sup> year being known as President McKinley High School, known as McKinley High School (MHS). Several of the buildings on McKinley High School's campus are listed on the National Register of Historic Places since 1980. The architect most involved in the design of its Spanish Colonial Revival buildings was Louis E. Davis. The buildings of McKinley High School were chosen as being historically significant by contributing to a major part of American History; with a "person" (Pres. William McKinley) associated with America's history; and design and construction of the buildings having great artistic value and the work of a master designer, Louis Davis.

The history of the students at McKinley High School is admirable and really depicts their sense of "Pride" and "Code of Honor" which was written in 1927 by student: Mun Chee Chun which MHS students have tried to display and maintain. During World War II the MHS students volunteered at Red Cross Stations, supported selling war bond drives, and raised enough funds to purchase a B-24 Liberator bomber, named Madame Pele for the United States Air Force.

During World War II, there were 132 fallen U.S. soldiers who attended McKinley High School who valiantly fought for our country, the United States of America. Their valor and commitment to our country will never be forgotten, and I'm sure that they were proud to be alumni of McKinley High School. Wah Kau Kong, attended McKinley High School and he is listed on McKinley High School's "Hall of Honor", as he was the first Chinese American fighter pilot in World War II. One of members who graduated from McKinley High School and served in World War II was late Senator Daniel Inouye (1924-2012), who was part of the U.S. Army's 442<sup>nd</sup> Combat Team; Medal of Honor Recipient; U.S. Representative (1959-1962); U.S. Senator (1962-2012); President pro tempore of the United States Senate, 4th highest-ranking member of the U.S. government. He is one of many of those outstanding citizens from McKinley High School who are listed in MHS's "Hall of Honor".

There are other noteworthy people who have graduated from McKinley High School who have valiantly fought for our Country. Tammy Duckworth, Class of MHS 1985, was a U.S. Army Major, and Iraq War Veteran. She was a Democratic member of the U.S. House of Representatives from the eight districts of Illinois from 2013-2017 and is the U.S. Senator from the State of Illinois since 2017. She is one of the many people listed in McKinley High School's "Hall of Honor". McKinley High School has a long history of producing leaders in reputable and a variety of vocations that have contributed to the success of our State and of our nation. If you visit McKinley High School, their pictures are hung in the Administration Building as our "Hall of Honor" awardee recipients.

In conclusion, all the above examples of valor and honor that McKinley High School students who have fought in World War II or in other fields of battle for the United States of America, has brought pride and gratitude to McKinley High School, our community, and to our State of Hawaii. I am urging the Superintendent of Education to request the Board of Education to honor McKinley High School's 132 fallen soldiers by safeguarding and preserving the name of McKinley High School.

#### IN OPPOSITION

Chair Woodson, Vice Chair Kapela, and members of the House Committee on Education,

My name is Keala Campbell; I am a Native Hawaiian resident of Hawai'i Island.

I am testifying **in opposition** of bill HR64 / HCR71 which urges the Superintendent of Education to request the Board of Education to safeguard and preserve the name of McKinley High School.

The points outlined below should be carefully considered (https://www.hsta.org/news/recent-stories/mckinley-high-school-deserves-a-name-that-honors-its-true -spirit-community-legacy/):

- 1. The school's name glorifies a man who illegally annexed a country against the will of her queen and people.
- 2. The name reflects an indoctrination of Hawaiian students and a movement that obliterated Native Hawaiian identity in favor of American patriotism.
- 3. Names have great significance to us. A school's name should honor its greatness.
- 4. McKinley High is an incredible school with impressive accomplishments and prominent alumni. It serves and supports our community. Its halls are steeped in spirit, honor, and pride. It's important that we recognize the true source of this excellence: the students, the educators, the community, the 'āina.
- 5. McKinley High School is located in the ahupua'a of Honolulu, in the moku of Kona, on the mokupuni of O'ahu. Changing the school's name back to Honolulu High School honors its life source, the land that feeds it.

Restoring the name to Honolulu High School will not diminish the sacrifice of the 132 soldiers named in this bill; in fact, it would be a step toward restitution for some. A way to make pono and reverse the "methodical plan of Americanization" that "sought to obliterate the national consciousness of the Hawaiian Kingdom in the minds of the school children throughout the islands". It is time.
