In consideration of SENATE BILL 1254, SENATE DRAFT 2, HOUSE DRAFT 2 RELATING TO THE KAIWI COAST

Senate Bill 1254, Senate Draft 2, House Draft 2 proposes to require the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) to petition the Board of Land and Natural Resources to designate certain lands as the "Kaiwi Coast State Park" and appropriates funds. **The Department supports this measure.**

The Department deeply appreciates this measure's support for safe public access and sufficient stewardship of the Kaiwi State Scenic Shoreline.

The amount of CIP funding needed to implement the planning, design and construction for the proposed bicycle and pedestrian pathway still need to be determined. The Department is appreciative of the consideration of funds for the establishment, planning, and design of the park and improvements related to implementing a bicycle and pedestrian pathway, and suggests One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) to enact parts of this endeavor.

In SUPPORT of SB1254 SD2 HD2: Relating to the Kaiwi Coast

Aloha Chair Yamashita, Vice Chair Kitagawa, and Members of the Committee,

On behalf of our 20,000 members and supporters, the Sierra Club of Hawai'i **supports SB1254 SD2 HD2**, which will help to facilitate the management and stewardship of O'ahu's long-cherished Kaiwi Coast.

Volunteers and members of the Sierra Club of Hawai'i have endeavored for decades to protect the natural and cultural integrity of the Kaiwi Coastline, helping to control invasive species, protect native species habitat, and maintain trails that allow residents and visitors to enjoy this area safely and with minimal impacts. Most recently, Sierra Club volunteers have successfully advocated for the installation of boulders and a designated parking area to prevent vehicular degradation of the sand dunes and adjacent coastal areas of Wāwāmalu.

By facilitating the consolidation of land use authority under the Department of Land and Natural Resources, and by providing resources needed to steward this special place, SB1254 SD1 HD1 will help to ensure that the ecological and cultural character of our Kaiwi Coast remains intact for current and future generations to steward, appreciate, and enjoy.

The Sierra Club does note that this measure does not contemplate the sale or gift of lands from the state to non-state agencies, and that HRS § 171-64.7 would therefore not be triggered by its provisions. See HRS §171-64.7(a), (f)(1). Accordingly, to avoid unnecessary confusion, the Sierra Club does recommend that the exemption to the requirements of HRS § 171-64.7 on page 2, lines 16-17 be deleted.

Accordingly, we respectfully urge the Committee to **PASS** SB1254 SD2 HD2.

Hawai'i Bicycling League Supports SB 1254 SD2 HD2, relating to the Kaiwi Coast

Aloha Chair Yamashita, Vice Chair Kitagawa, and Committee Members,

My name is Travis Counsell, and I am the Executive Director of the Hawai'i Bicycling League (HBL). We are a non-profit organization founded in 1975 with the mission of enabling more people to ride bicycles for health, recreation, and transportation. We strive to create communities across our islands that have safe, accessible, and inclusive environments for people to bike, walk, and roll.

Hawai'i Bicycling League strongly supports SB1254 SD2 HD2, which requires the department of land and natural resources to petition the board of land and natural resources to designate certain lands as the "Kaiwi coast state park". Also establishes certain conditions for the Kaiwi coast state park and appropriates funds for the Kaiwi coast state park and Maunalua-Makapuu scenic byway improvements.

The Kaiwi Coast Scenic Shoreline, which includes the Maunalua-Makapu'u scenic byway, is a space that deserves additional protection. It is also a very popular destination for recreational activities including biking, walking, hiking, and beach activities. This has resulted in an increase of roadways users, on a highway which lacks adequate infrastructure to safely protect all users. This bill emphasizes the need for roadways improvements that focus on the safety of people who walk and bike.

Hawai'i Bicycling League members participate in multiple weekly group bicycle rides along this area. Additionally, HBL's signature bicycling event, the Honolulu Century Ride, attracts over 2000 participants annually and proceeds along this shoreline with an aid station at Sandy Beach Park.

We strongly urge you to pass this legislation to protect this important shoreline and ultimately create a safer space for all to enjoy. Mahalo for the opportunity to submit this written testimony.
