### Testimony COMMENTING on SB2172 RELATING TO UNDERGROUND FUEL STORAGE TANKS

1 **Fiscal Implications:** The fiscal implications of this measure are unknown at this time.

Department Testimony: The department appreciates and supports the intent of this measure, to
protect the precious freshwater resources of our pae 'āina. We offer amendments below that we
believe realize this intent more effectively without the unintended consequences the current
measure would generate.

Each island is made up entirely of aquifers, which are layers of water-bearing permeable
rock or other material such as sand or silt—"aquifer" essentially refers to the groundwater held
within the land. The bill as currently written would essentially ban all underground storage tanks
(USTs) with a capacity over 100 gallons in 2050, which would mean shutting down every gas
station in the state and would also affect fuel storage for emergency generators at hospitals and
other critical locations, which would likely pose major economic and social challenges.

The individual tanks in a typical UST system range in size from 10,000 to 50,000 gallons with a total system capacity no greater than 100,000 gallons. Focusing a ban on large capacity UST systems (with a total fuel storage capacity over 100,000 gallons) would provide a large measure of protection to human health and the environment while continuing to allow the use of smaller USTs by emergency generators and service stations.

1	In addition, the department believes that large capacity tank systems pose much less risk		
2	to our drinking water resources if located below the underground injection control (UIC) line		
3	defined by the Safe Drinking Water Branch and there are a small number of such systems in		
4	existence. Our offered amendments would allow the continued existence of large capacity		
5	systems only below the UIC line. We suggest aligning the date for a siting restriction on large		
6	capacity tank systems above the UIC line with the existing siting restriction on USTs within 100		
7	yards of the shoreline, which becomes effective on January 1, 2045 (§342L-4.5, HRS).		
8	Offered Amendments: The Department recommends replacing sections 2 to 4 with the		
9	following:		
10	SECTION 2. Section 342L-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding new		
11	definitions, in alphabetical order, to read as follows:		
12	""Mauka" means toward the mountains or the encircled underground source of drinking		
13	water."		
14	""UIC line" means the Underground Injection Control line represented by a dashed line		
15	on the "State of Hawaii Department of Health Underground Injection Control Program" maps,		
16	made effective July 6, 1984, and identified as follows:		
17	(1) For the island of Hawaii, quadrangles H-1 to H-74;		
18	(2) For the island of Kauai, quadrangles K-1 to K-11;		
19	(3) For the island of Lanai, quadrangles L-North and L-South;		
20	(4) For the island of Maui, quadrangles M-1 to M-17;		
21	(5) For the island of Molokai, quadrangles M-East and M-West; and		
22	(6) For the island of Oahu, quadrangles O-1 to O-15."		
23	SECTION 3. Chapter 342L, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new		
24	section to part I to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:		
25	"§342L- Permits for large capacity UST systems above UIC line prohibited. (a)		
26	Beginning July 1, 2022, the department shall not issue a permit for a new underground storage		
27	tank with a capacity greater than 50,000 gallons nor a new underground storage tank system with		
28	a total tank capacity greater than 100,000 gallons located mauka of the UIC line; provided that a		

1	permit may be issued by the department for purposes of repairing or replacing an existing
2	underground storage tank.
3	(b) Beginning January 1, 2045, no person shall operate an underground storage tank with
4	a capacity greater than 50,000 gallons nor an underground storage tank system with a total tank
5	capacity greater than 100,000 gallons located mauka of the UIC line, and no permit shall be
6	renewed for an underground storage tank with a capacity greater than 50,000 gallons nor an
7	underground storage tank system with a total tank capacity greater than 100,000 gallons located
8	mauka of the UIC line."
9	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
10	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

### Subject: Senate Bill 2172: Relating to Underground Fuel Storage Tanks

The Honolulu Board of Water Supply (BWS) supports Senate Bill (SB) 2172 and offers amendments to avoid a similar fuel contamination crisis that occurred last year. This bill and the recommended changes ensure the protection of our environment and underground sources of drinking water from the adverse impacts of leaking underground petroleum fuel tank systems.

The BWS respectfully recommends the following amendments:

- 1. References to "within one-half mile of the outer edge of an aquifer" to "above an aquifer". Keeping this requirement may create unintended consequences that may limit viable sites for above-ground storage tanks.
- Section 2 (a) would allow the Department of Health (DOH) to issue a permit for the purposes of repairing or replacing an existing underground fuel storage tank. Amend language on page 2, line 19-21, to read "provided that a permit may be issued by the department for the purposes of repairing or replacing removing an existing underground fuel storage tank."
- Section 2 (c) "underground fuel storage tank" means any fuel tank with a capacity of one hundred or more gallons 100,000 gallons installed underground.
- 4. Section 2 (b) Beginning January 1, 2050 2024, no person shall . . .

The underground storage tanks at the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility (Red Hill) are approaching the end-of-life and need to be relocated to areas that would not threaten a drinking water aquifer. The DOH Hearings Officer at the evidentiary hearing held in December 2021 stated, "the Red Hill Facility, as currently configured and operated, poses an imminent threat to human health and safety or the environment." Red Hill facility wants to store large volumes of fuel just 100 feet above our aquifer. Red Hill is the state's largest field-constructed UST facility that should be regulated to a level proportional to the extremely large volume of fuel that it stores. The groundwater aquifer underneath the facility is called the Southern Oahu Basal Aquifer and is designated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as a sole source aquifer and principal source of drinking water for Wahiawa, Ewa and portions of Honolulu that if contaminated would create a significant hazard to public health.

The need to preserve and protect groundwater quality and quantity now and into the future outweighs the continued operation of large field-constructed USTs without secondary containment.

Chair Keohokalole, Chair Gabbard, and Members of the Committees:

The Hawaii State Teachers Association <u>strongly supports SB 2172</u>, relating to underground fuel storage tanks. This bill will prohibit the issuance of future underground fuel storage tanks within one-half mile of an aquifer beginning July 1, 2022. It will also prohibit the operation of and renewal of underground fuel storage tank permits located within one-half mile from an aquifer beginning January 1, 2050 [HSTA hope this date changes]. Defines underground fuel storage tanks as any fuel tank with a capacity of one hundred gallons or more.

Delegates to the Hawaii State Teachers Association's annual state convention back in 2008 adopted the following policy statement: The Hawaii State Teachers Association believes that every school's drinking water should meet Environmental Protection Agency requirements for clean drinking water. HSTA further believes that school water should be tested every six months and irregularities should be reported immediately. **More recently, the HSTA Board of Directors unanimously called for the closure and emptying of the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility**. Despite the community coming out in force to support these schools with water

Despite the community coming out in force to support these schools with water donations and school personnel working together to mitigate the impact on students, it has not been easy dealing with this crisis on top of the issues related to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. Below is what one Central district teacher earlier this month had to say about everything going on:

"We are more impacted by the tainted water. I am only able to have students wash their hands twice a day with the bulk water they gave us with a pump. I am spending a lot of time outside pumping the water out of the bulk bottle, or using the individual water bottles to wash their hands. I don't feel comfortable using the spray hand sanitizer we were given to clean their hands. (It doesn't take off food particles, or other dirt and grime from their hands.) They did give

some wipes for their hands, but those will be gone soon. I was washing their hands often, but not anymore. The custodians do not clean our desks. So I use the sanitizing wipes to wipe them down daily. Lots of prep time spent to clean the room. We are still not able to use the AC. We are required to keep windows open. Lots of dirt comes in all day. I also get some stray preschoolers come in the back door. The noise is ridiculous. (Airplanes, lawn mowers, other students at recess.) I don't understand how they think we are supposed to get these students up to grade level with all the distractions."

HSTA held a virtual forum on Monday, January 24<sup>th</sup>, and we hope legislators and other members of the community were able to tune in and listen to speakers from the Board of Water Supply and the Sierra Club of Hawaii followed by educators at impacted schools who told their stories of the impacts that they and their students are experiencing. Aloha Chair Keohokalole, Chair Gabbard, and committee members,

The Hawai'i Public Health Institute<sup>i</sup> is in **support of SB 2172 and offers an amendment.** SB 2172 would protect public health and O'ahu's clean drinking water supply by prohibiting the operation of existing underground storage tanks by a date to be determined as well as the future construction of underground storage tanks within half a mile of an aquifer.

HIPHI is alarmed by the recent events surrounding Red Hill and the confirmation of petroleum in our water supply. Fresh, clean drinking water is a precious resource, with access to clean drinking water being a basic human right that is "essential for the enjoyment of life and all human rights."<sup>ii</sup>

For years, advocates and organizations like the Sierra Club have warned about the need to protect our drinking water, as the Red Hill Fuel Tank facility sits only 100 feet above the aquifer that supplies water to over 400,000 people, from Hālawa to Hawai'i Kai. The Red Hill facility has a long history of leaking fuel into the surrounding environment and has already contaminated O'ahu's primary drinking water aquifer. Ending operations of the Red Hill facility immediately and preventing future underground storage tanks from being constructed near aquifers is the only way to guarantee the safety of our water and our people. **HIPHI respectfully requests the committees to amend this measure** by: 1) removing reference to the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility in the preamble, to avoid potential federal preemption challenges; 2) amending the proposed new definition of "underground fuel storage tank" to apply to facilities with field-constructed tanks, or with a capacity over 100,000 gallons; and 3) ensuring that no permit may be issued or renewed for an underground fuel storage tank, and that no underground fuel storage tank may be operated after the end of this year, for a facility located mauka of the underground injection control line.

This public health crisis was preventable, and we urge the Navy and the State to take swift action to protect our water supply. Clean water is essential for life, and access to clean, safe drinking water is a basic human right.

### CONCERNS ON SB 2172 RELATING TO UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANKS AND AQUIFERS

Aloha Committee Chairs and Vice Chairs:

I am Eric Wright, president of the Hawaii Petroleum Marketers Association (HPMA). HPMA is a nonprofit trade association comprised of members who market motor fuel products across Hawaii. Our membership includes individuals and companies that operate as independent marketers, jobbers or distributors who buy motor fuel products at the wholesale level and sell or distribute products to retail customers, other wholesalers, and bulk consumers.

Senate Bill 2172 would prohibit the Hawaii Department of Health from issuing permits to install new underground storage tanks of 100 gallons or more within a half-mile from an aquifer by July 1, 2022, and prohibit renewal of permits of underground storage tanks that meet the same criteria by July 1, 2050.

### HPMA has concerns that Senate Bill 2172 will have unintended consequences on member retail stations and convenience stores as well as the public.

While HPMA members realize there is currently heightened concern about the impact of underground storage tanks, underground storage tanks used at retail stations and convenience stores are safe and have protection for our environment.

First, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) requires all underground storage tanks at retail stations and convenience stores have a double wall to serve as secondary containment. This is a built-in environmental protective device that includes an alarm in the event the primary wall fails. A typical retail station and convenience store underground storage tank in Hawaii contains about 10,000 to 20,000 gallons of fuel. (By contrast, each of the Red Hill fuel storage tanks holds 2.5 million gallons.) As currently drafted, the bill may



impose unnecessary prohibitions which will adversely impact many of Hawaii's retail stations and convenience stores.

All underground storage tanks used at retail stations and convenience stores are already subject to existing state laws. Under Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR) 11-280.1, the Hawaii Department of Health stipulates the requirements for the design, construction, installation, operation, release detection and response, closure, financial responsibility, operator training and permitting of underground storage tanks. The latest version of these rules was revised and issued effective July 8, 2021 and is as stringent as Title 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 280. This oversight adds another dimension of assurance and safety for the public and the environment.

Second, according to the Commission on Water Resource Management of the Hawaii Department of Land and Natural Resources, aquifers are located under all of the islands; however, it will be difficult for retail stations and convenience stores to ascertain the distance their underground storage tanks are located from these aquifers. Detailed information on aquifers will be necessary to know which underground storage tanks, if any, would be affected by this measure.

Finally, as the state shifts away from petroleum products and adopts clean energy products by 2045 to meet the objectives of the Hawaii Clean Energy Initiative, this measure would inadvertently and adversely impact our state's decarbonization efforts. For instance, underground storage tanks containing clean or biofuels would also be prohibited under this measure. Alternatively, HEMA members would have to consider relocating their underground storage tanks to above ground, which could potentially result in devastating public safety issues as a result of vandalism or terrorism.

Thank you for allowing HPMA the opportunity to submit written testimony and offer our concerns.

My name is Bronson Azama I am the current Chair of the Honolulu Youth Commission, I would like to remind our Senators which sit upon these committees that our Commission has a vested interest to advocate for a better future for the youth of O'ahu, and as you all know we have passed a resolution HYC 21-003 which was provided to all members of the Hawai'i State Legislature on November 29, 2021. This resolution places ourselves in a position to support the decommissioning of the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage, which we believe this Bill can accomplish.

I would like to note my personal observations and concerns for lines 19-21 on page 2, specifically the section which states, "provided that a permit may be issued by the department for purposes of repairing or replacing an existing underground fuel storage tank." I would like to see this section removed as it could create a loophole around the intended action of this measure. Facilities such as the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facilities or similar need to be decommissioned, we cannot have repeats from Red Hill nor any other facility that threatens our water. Whether they were built prior to this law should not be relevant, the time provided in section (b) should be more than adequate to conduct a phased process to shut down facilities.

In the mana'o'i'o, the truth, of our kÅ «puna, we are taught that water is not a resource, but the SOURCE of life. The cost to remove these facilities and decommission them will be great, but the equation is not hard. For facilities such as the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility, the argument is the need for fuel to protect life, but to simply argue this point:

Water = Life, No water, no life

Fuel needed to protect said life

No life, no need for fuel.

This is not a hard equation. We need immediate action and not prolonged processes, all of us must move from this accounting mindset to one of accountability. Right now we are accountable to the future of our children's, children's, children, for all the generations to come. I implore you to understand that our decisions do not just impact now, but all of time. So please remove the language I requested above in lines 19-21 on page 2, and let us pass something that protects and recognize water not as a resource but THE SOURCE!

Aloha, Chairs Keohokalole and Gabbard, Vice Chairs Baker and Nishihara, and Members of the Committee on Health and the Committee on Agriculture and Environment:

The Environmental Caucus of the Democratic Party of Hawai'i stands in support of SB 2172 with amendments This measure would prohibit issuance of future underground fuel storage tanks within one-half mile of an aquifer beginning July 1, 2022. It would also prohibit the operation of and renewal of underground fuel storage tank permits for tanks located within one-half mile from an aquifer beginning January 1, 2050. This measure also defines underground fuel storage tanks as any fuel tank with a capacity of one hundred gallons or more.

In 2018, nearly four years ago, the O'ahu County Democrats, out of dire concern over the risk to the Moanalua-Waimalu Aquifer, our major drinking water source for Moanalua to Hawai'i Kai, affecting hundreds of thousands of residents, businesses and visitors of the Honolulu District, adopted a resolution, OC 2018-11, urging the Navy to retrofit its tanks or move them away from the aquifer. The Navy has taken no such action, and the situation has now become, in the words of your former colleague, U.S. Rep. Kai Kahele, "a crisis of astronomical proportions."

What might have been adequate measures four years ago are no longer enough. As the Hearings Officer in the Docket 19-UST-EA-02 Emergency Proceedings between the Navy and the Hawai'i Department of Health concluded last month, the Navy is not capable of competently managing and operating this vast mega-facility. That's why the Navy claims "human error" every time there's a spill. Because Navy staff, who rotate into Hawai'i and then out again in two or three years, and who have inadequate plans and data to work from, there is a pattern of repeated errors that result in spills that can't be avoided under the Navy's way of doing things.

But the Hearings Officer's decision, affirmed by the State Department of Health, requires gives the Navy to defuel the tanks for "corrective action," but eventually will result in refilling the tanks for an indefinite period. These administrative proceedings will result in no real eventual progress after a brief period of hoped-for "corrective action."

For these reasons, the Environmental Caucus of the Democratic Party of Hawai'i has concluded that we must demand <u>permanent defueling and closure of the facility</u>. Accordingly, the Environmental Caucus supports SB 2172 with the following amendments:

- (1) At page 2, line 18, increase the distance of the placement of a new underground fuel storage tank from one-half mile to one mile of the outer edge of the aquifer;
- (2) At page 2, lines 19-21, delete the language, "provided that a permit may be issued by the department for purposes of repairing or replacing an existing underground fuel storage tank." Unless this provision is amended, it would allow the Red Hill Underground Fuel Storage Tanks to be refueled after corrective action has been completed. As noted, the Environmental Caucus seeks decommissioning of the Facility; therefore, allowing for a permit to be issued would be inconsistent with the objective of decommissioning the Facility.
- (3) At page 3, lines 1-2, 4, advance the date of January 1, 2050 to July 1, 2022, and modify the operation and permitting process to require the distance from the outer edge of an aquifer from one-half mile to one mile of the outer edge of an aquifer.
- (4) Add an additional section to HRS Chapter 342L stating as follows: "It is the policy of the State of Hawaii to seek by all lawful means the immediate defueling of the Red Hill Underground Bulk Fuel Storage Facility, permanent decommissioning of the facility, and an environmentally safe and permanent closure of the facility as soon as reasonably possible."
- (5) Add a severability provision to the bill.

The passage of this measure with amendments would provide the people of the State of Hawai`i, particularly those residing, working, and visiting the county of Honolulu, a reduced sense of fear of further risk of petroleum contamination in its major drinking water aquifer for generations to come.

In SUPPORT of SB2172: Relating to Underground Fuel Storage Tanks

Aloha Chairs Keohokalole and Gabbard, Vice Chairs Baker and Nishihara, and members of the Health and Agriculture and Environment Committees,

The Sierra Club of Hawai'i **supports** SB2172, and offers friendly **amendments** to ensure that this measure fulfills its purpose of protecting our islands' most precious resource from potentially catastrophic contamination.

As this measure recognizes, the concept of "ola i ka wai" – that water is life – has been understood by the people of Hawai'i since time immemorial. Unfortunately, this concept has not been fully appreciated in historical decisions that have allowed for the installation of large underground storage tank facilities in close proximity to the groundwater aquifers that our environment and people have always depended upon – leading to the contamination of our islands' precious wai. Accordingly, the Sierra Club appreciates and supports this bill as a means to ensure that future state decisionmaking does not repeat the mistakes of the past in allowing for the installation and operation of underground fuel storage tanks and facilities where they may contaminate our water sources.

# To better ensure that this measure can fully protect our islands' most precious resource from facilities like the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility, the Sierra Club respectfully urges the following amendments:

- 1. In an abundance of caution, to prevent this measure from being preempted by federal laws prohibiting state legislation targeting specific federal facilities, removing the reference to the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility in the preamble,
- 2. To prevent unintended impacts on underground fuel tank operators using modern, doublewalled and factory-constructed tanks such as those in vehicle gas stations, amending the definition of "underground fuel storage tank" to mean "any fuel tank or tank faciliity and associated infrastructure that is or includes field constructed tanks, or that has a capacity of over 100,000 gallons"; and
- 3. To eliminate the imminent existential threat that may be posed by underground fuel storage tank facilities as defined above:
  - a. amending references to "within one-half mile of the outer limit of the outer edge of an aquifer" to "above an aquifer or within one-half mile of the outer edge of the aquifer as defined by the department pursuant to chapter 342E," or to "mauka of

the underground injection control line as defined by the department pursuant to chapter 342E";

- b. removing the proposed permitting authority for repairs and replacement of an existing underground fuel storage tank in 342L- (a);
- c. prohibiting the operation of underground fuel storage tanks beginning January 1, 2023 in 342L- (b).

A proposed senate draft incorporating the above recommendations can be found below. Thank you very much for this opportunity to provide testimony in **support of SB2712.**

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO UNDERGROUND FUEL STORAGE TANKS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAI'I:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that fresh water and 2 streams have been among the most important natural resources to Hawai'i's people. Dating back to ancient Hawai'i, the sanctity 3 4 of fresh water, or wai, is reflected in the way water permeates 5 throughout 'olelo Hawai'i, the Hawaiian spoken language. For 6 example, the Hawaiian word for "law" is kānāwai, which literally 7 translates to the "equal sharing of water". The Hawaiian word waiwai, water repeated twice, means abundance and 8 prosperity. In Native Hawaiian culture, to have water is to 9 10 have wealth.

11 The legislature further finds that the purity and safety of 12 the State's fresh water may be in jeopardy of contamination from 13 large-scale and field-constructed underground fuel storage tanks 14 and tank facilities and associated infrastructure, if they are 15 allowed to be permitted or operated near drinking water sources. 16 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to:

### DISCUSSION ITEM A. PRESENTATION ON RED HILL WATER CONTAMINATION EFFECTS ON DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SCHOOLS, STAFF, STUDENTS, AND COMMUNITY

### (1) Aloha,

My name is Michele Sasaki and I am a Kindergarten Teacher at Hickam Elementary School. I would like to submit my testimony regarding the following item for the General Meeting to be held on January 20, 2022.

Discussion Item V.A

Presentation on Red Hill water contamination effects on Department of Education schools, staff, students, and community.

As mentioned, I teach at Hickam Elementary, one of the schools affected by the water crisis. The situation with the water is an ongoing concern with widespread impact on school expenditures, learning conditions, and the well-being of everyone in the schools.

When the news of contaminated water first broke, it was a complete surprise and shock for everyone, especially our school administration. Our Principal, being a problem solver, jumped into action to close off use of faucets, fountains, and water for cafeteria use. Please note that at the time, these decisions were made without guidance from any other leadership entity, including the military and DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. What felt like déjà vu in comparison to the COVID situation was the fact that important health decisions were being left to the discretion of school administration. Rather than worry about curriculum and students' social/emotional health, our Principal was once again forced to become a public health decision maker. So as to ensure the health and safety of everyone at school, bottles of water, wipes, and sanitizer had to immediately be purchased with a run to Costco. And since that first day, we may have received donation of bottled water, but costs from our school's budget remained. The water crisis has extended which meant a better solution to water access was needed. Thus, renting hand washing stations. The Navy may be footing the bill now, but what about all those days since the start? The school had to spend money. It was costing the school about \$1000 a week to deal with the water crisis. When and how will that money be paid back? In the meantime, our school must tighten the budget belt in other areas such as technology, curriculum, and materials. But those should be the items to spend on for student learning! While I appreciate the concern and efforts to problem solve, the school, students, and staff should not have to sacrifice along the way. The water crisis was not the fault of the school, and the school's budget should not be negatively affected.

Understanding the serious conditions our families were facing, teachers and staff understood the need for students to spend their days in an environment that felt safe and secure. So while the extremely limited access of water existed at the school, rather than call for closure, we knew we had to do what we could to stay open. However, that meant questionable hand cleanliness in the middle of a pandemic and balancing water access with learning time. With a limited number of hand washing stations placed around the school for all 500 students to use, the alternative was using baby wipes to clean hands along with hand sanitizer. Perhaps this method may be acceptable for a day or two, but weeks? Long term? That is questionable and should be unacceptable when one of the mitigating strategies to deter COVID infection touted by both the Department of Health and Department of Education is hand washing. In order for young students to access the hand washing station, an adult is required. There is a difficult

foot pump in order to run the water at the station and a teacher would need to pump the water for a class of 20 students. This could take up to 30 minutes or more to get through a class, and this only considers the washing portion. What about the wait time and management of students while the one teacher is trying to address hand washing and the remainder of the class is having to wait? And 30 minutes of class time is a lot of precious learning time that is gone. As a teacher, do I use the 30 minutes to wash hands and maintain the utmost health or do I go with just wipes and hope that it will be enough to clean? Why are teachers being placed in that position to make such decisions? It should not be a question of health OR learning. We need to ensure that our students receive health AND learning. The Red Hill water crisis is ongoing. It is UNLIKELY to end any time soon. While my administrator and the teachers at school have been doing our best to offer grace to families as they have to commute back and forth to hotels, as we extend our sympathies and understanding regarding the difficulties of their home life, what are we as a Department, as a State, going to do help? My school and all the schools on the list should have clear and equal guidance and assistance from the DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION regarding water access. LONG TERM solutions need to be made. When families are leaving due to water concerns, school personnel and staff projections and budgets should not be negatively affected. Schools that spent money to ensure safety at the start of the crisis should be reimbursed. The Department of Education and BOARD OF EDUCATION have been silent on this issue despite the toll it is taking on a number of schools. Please recognize the strain we are under, including multiple concerns with COVID and the water, and SPEAK UP, LEAD! Take the initiative to find out what our affected schools are dealing with. Help with arrangements or red tape. ADVOCATE STRONGLY to the Navy. TAKE A PUBLIC STAND TO DRAIN THE TANKS!

The water crisis is affecting your schools, your staff, your teachers, your students, your families. We are part of the education community you serve. Please take a stand and help us in all ways possible.

### (2) Board Chair Payne and Members of the Board,

Thank you for including this item on your agenda. While at the surface it may not appear to be an issue that has a major impact on our schools, but after working in this situation since the beginning of December, I can say that it has caused a disruption in our schools. I provide intervention instruction to students at Nimitz Elementary. I am in and out of classrooms and work with students one-on-one or in small groups thoughout the day. Not having a reliable source of running water makes it difficult to wash your hands throughout the day and meant **that for weeks we served pizza for lunch**. To the point where the **students did not want to eat pizza anymore**. Despite the disruption and inconveniences, our school community stepped up to provide our students with a sense of normalcy at school when they were in a crisis at home.

Although the U.S. Army and Navy have provided resources and personnel to assist with distribution of water on campus, I ask you to urge them to reimburse the schools what they spent out of their budgets to pay for mitigating the health and safety issues caused by the contamination. Schools had to react to the contamination quickly rather than waiting for resources to be determined and distributed. Without

the purchases schools made to provide safe water on campuses, schools should have been closed until a solution could be determined.

(4). More recently, the HSTA Board of Directors unanimously called for the closure and emptying of the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility.

Despite the community coming out in force to support these schools with water donations and school personnel working together to mitigate the impact on students, it has not been easy dealing with this crisis on top of the issues related to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. Below is what one Central district teacher earlier this month had to say about everything going on:

We are more impacted by the tainted water. I am only able to have students wash their hands twice a day with the bulk water they gave us with a pump. I am spending a lot of time outside pumping the water out of the bulk bottle or using the individual water bottles to wash their hands. I don't feel comfortable using the spray hand sanitizer we were given to clean their hands. (Department of Education: It doesn't take off food particles, or other dirt and grime from their hands.) They did give some wipes for their hands, but those will be gone soon.

I was washing their hands often, but not anymore. The custodians do not clean our desks. So I use the sanitizing wipes to wipe them down daily. Lots of prep time spent to clean the room. We are still not able to use the AC. We are required to keep windows open. Lots of dirt comes in all day. I also get some stray pre-schoolers come in the back door. The noise is ridiculous. (Airplanes, lawn mowers, other students at recess.) I don't understand how they think we are supposed to get these students up to grade level with all the distractions.

(5) I am a Honolulu resident who attended O'ahu public schools from elementary through high school. Much of who I am today can be attributed to my education and experiences as a student in the Hawai'i public school system.

I'd like to express my support for the shutting down of the Red Hill fuel tanks and encourage you, as the Hawaii State BOARD OF EDUCATION, to take a position on this issue to firmly express your solidarity with the residents of O'ahu, many of whom are connected to your schools as former or current students, faculty members, or their families.

Your very mission, "to promote excellence and equity in Hawaii's public schools and enable all students to meet their own unique and varied potentials," depends on the people who make up Hawai'i's public schools being cared for, which requires clean water at the very least.

Unless the Red Hill bulk fuel storage facility is shut down for good, clean water cannot be ensured. As students in Hawai'i, we learn of mālama 'āina which reminds us of our connection to the land, the reciprocal relationship we have with the land that sustains us. If our land and water is affected, we are directly impacted as we belong to the same ecosystem—something I learned in Biology class, a very basic concept that should guide our way of life.

The Hawaii State BOARD OF EDUCATION should be committed to this place, this 'āina, that serves as the best teacher and classroom for students of today and tomorrow. I hope you will consider boldly supporting the shutting down of the Red Hill fuel tanks for good. Mahalo nui loa, Kristen Young

As described in this agenda item, the current water contamination crisis arising out of the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility has had a tremendous detrimental impact on school funding, operations, staff, students, and families, with additional unknown health and learning impacts. The Sierra Club of Hawai'i fully supports immediately providing affected schools with the resources necessary to mitigate these impacts to the fullest extent possible, as well as pursuing remedies, including but not limited to reimbursement of costs, from the U.S. Navy as the party responsible for this crisis. (7) To whom it may concern,

As the father of 6 children who were born here in Hawaii; grew up here and benefited from our public school system ... As a retired US Naval serviceman ... As a retired physician ... I am beyond appalled / I have no words that are able to adequately express my upset and concern about the Red Hill water contamination issue.

The inappropriate and insincere response and inaction from the Navy is embarrassing. The Navy / the men and women that I served with for 4 1/2 years in demanding and stressful times could, would and did rise to every challenge on every occasion ... and we always did the 'right thing'. We cared about each other.

We always worked together.

There was nothing that we could not do.

There was no situation that we could not handle.

The delays ...

The lack of proper allocation of urgency and acuity here is inexcusable ... I hesitated ... to make this statement because we are dealing with what we have / where we are in the serious situation ... Yet, I am upset.

We need to close the Red Hill storage facility.

We need the 'best of the best' from the Navy and from Hawaii working together now!

### (8) Aloha,

My name is Isabella Dearaujo and this is my testimony of my experience at work since the Red Hill leak. I work at Hickam Elementary School on Hickam Base. For the past month the school has been completely turned upside down by the water crisis.

I am an RBT that provides services to children with autism. My client depends on regularity in their day. My client struggled with the changes as this was outside of the routine. Many students including my client were moved to hotels. School uniforms are no longer required because families can't do laundry consistently. Some of my clients friends developed rashes from the water.

When we first received news of the water crisis all of the hand washing stations were unavailable. Parents and teachers were donating water jugs so that students could wash their hands. All restrooms and sinks in the school were taped off.

Kids have been using baby wipes (not ones with antiseptic) to "wash" their hands when the water jugs run out.

**Kids ate the same pizza for 2 weeks for school lunch**. Because there was no clean water, kitchen staff was limited to what they could cook. Kids who depended on the school for lunch slowly ate less and less as they were getting nauseous from pizza day after day. This is also prepackaged pizza, not fresh. The consistency of the cheese was similar to glue.

Many kids moved because of the impact of the water at home. Some of the children in my clients 6th grade classroom lost friends that relocated to different areas. These children had to start at a new school in the last two quarters of 6th grade.

Before winter break there was a huge breakout of COVID, the Omicron variant. Many teachers and students got ill and continue to be sick. While there was a boost in cases all over island I firmly believe the limited resources led to less hand washing by the children which spread the germs from classroom to classroom.

This school is incredibly well funded. This is my 4th Hawaii elementary school I have worked at and the staff have handled this the best they could. The principal is always dropping off water bottles and all the kids recycle. However my past schools have been less funded and I wonder if this school is still struggling with all these resources and staff working constantly to help- how have the other schools with less funding fared?

I personally drank the water alongside many faculty members and students. I see how the teachers have struggled with COVID and the rise in cases on top of struggling with the water crisis. All of these children have a family member in the military. These kids are already sacrificing so much with deployed parents and constant moving. They deserve justice and clean water.

I am here to state my opposition to Bill 48 Requiring a Permit for facilities like the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility. I oppose this issue because for eighty years these massive underground tanks have existed with little oversight to see if these tanks are safe and secure. We know now that these tanks were leaking and have contaminated the drinking water. I am a senior in high school and have lived here all my life. My community hasn't been severely affected but our land and a lot of the people of this island have due to this contamination. I am asking the Honolulu City Council Committee on Transportation, Sustainability and Health to break down and stop using the Red Hill tanks for jet fuel. Lastly I hope these tanks will be taken down and the people can safely use the water again.

Sincerely, Dylyn Burns-Joseph James B. Castle High School % 2022 (11) My name is Lindsay. I have two children enrolled at Red hill elementary school. My home on AMR is among those impacted by the Red Hill water contamination. One of my greatest concerns is the vapors we've observed in my home (as a result of running the tap and the flushing that occurred in close proximity to my front door). We've experienced symptoms such as headaches, dizziness, stomachs aches, loss of concentration, dropping of items, altered and double vision. These vapors remain a constant in our home despite not using any of the water and as a result we are unable to remain in our home at all.

On November 30, I was called to pick up my child from school due to not feeling well. During this time I witnessed a government vehicle parked alongside a fire hydrant. This fire hydrant was opened up and water was being flushed from it into the parking lot, on the side walk and down the storm drain. When I picked up my child I could smell the chemicals from the water inside the office building through the closed double doors.

My children have experienced headaches, stomaches, bloody noses, loss of concentration, stuffy noses, and coughs while attending school and I have been called to pick them up numerous times out of COVID precautions. They were not COVID positive this fall. I have since learned during the evidentiary hearings that high levels of hydrocarbons such as jp5 were in the water from may 2021-the present. I am very concerned that the communication from the Department of Education, Department of Health and the navy lacked with regard to keeping both students and staff safe while attending this school. I asked to be notified when the flushing of the school was to be done so that staff and students would be safe from the vapors. Beyond the hazards that consuming or being exposed to contaminated fresh water poses to students, teachers, staff at our schools, the hardships being encountered at schools such as no running water for washing hands or drinking, the challenges that some keiki have to pump or access potable water from tanks located on campuses, and the displacement some from homes that some keiki are experiencing have created a situation that hampers learning for these students. The Board's mission to "promote excellence and equity in Hawaii's public schools and enable all students to meet their own unique and varied potential" is jeopardized by the Red Hill fuel tank leaks and this will continue to happen until the Navy shuts down their storage facilities and relocates it permanently.

Therefore, we humbly ask the BOARD OF EDUCATION to clearly and strongly condemn the US Navy's spill and its impacts on public education and ensure Hawai'i's families that the BOARD OF EDUCATION and the Department of Education will advocate on their behalf to protect the health, well-being, and optimal learning of its students.

We have had zero communication from Department of Health, EPA, Department of Education, John Erickson (our superintendent), regarding the safety of the school with regard to the vapors, needing more water, worrying about the difficulty of kids having not being able to reach the hand washing station if the stations are even present anymore.

Why didn't Department of Health or Department of Education know the levels of diesel and gasoline were high all summer and this fall. Who is monitoring our schools water? Who is protecting staff and students.

As a result of not hearing from these entities and the high COVID cases I was concerned about sending my kids into an unsafe environment the first week back to school. We missed school for a few days the first week, I sent my kids back to school 1/7/2022, then the kids and our family got COVID. I have asked for alternative learning methods. I have been told I can homeschool by the admin. I have not been given any other options. My children are dyslexic and need good education and a safe physical environment. I think the interim superintendent is detached from what is actually going on with regard to the struggles the teachers and families and students are having.

As a parent, it's been almost traumatizing worrying since the 2014 fuel leaks if my keiki's development will be stunted or disabled like children in Flint, Michigan due to governmental failure to prioritize the protection of public water. We live about a mile from the Red Hill Naval Underground Fuel Tanks at Kapūkaki.

As a former tenured DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION teacher, I feel the BOARD OF EDUCATION is obligated to address this issue, as one of our general learner outcomes, specifically GLO 6 "the ethical use of technology" is a standard the Navy has continually failed with all its misleading of the public. If this outcome is part of DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION mission, than we should hold this standard to institutions that threaten the well-being of our students to do so.

Prior to the recent pandemic, I was a PTT at a DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION Hawaiian Immersion school, my daughter's school; it makes me nauseous reflecting on one of my daily duties: monitoring and encouraging elementary students to drink water after recesses from school drinking fountain. As you know, we have many communities across Hawai'i where bottled water is not an affordable, practical option for the purposes of maintaining hydration for optimum learning.

It is the BOARD OF EDUCATION kuleana to protect the welfare of our youth from harm they could incur at schools. Discussion is a good start: but it must be followed up with action, such as a resolution at minimum supporting decommission of the Red Hill Fuel Tanks, as the Board of Water Supply, HSTA and other state agencies have agreed that any such fuel tanks above our sole source aquifer is reckless and short-sighted.

As a military veteran, I am appalled by the Pentagon's position that so-called "national security" trumps the public health and safety of our citizens. I insist the BOARD OF EDUCATION pursues its mission of public education and not kowtow to military pressure, given the Constitution clearly specifies civilian control of armed forces and not the other way around. Veterans for Peace hopes that the inclusion of a military liaison on the board of our education administration Department of Educations not incur bias or double standards for the DoD, as this is the kind of collusion we see in authoritarian governments in Burma, Sudan, N. Korea, etc.

The BOARD OF EDUCATION needs to keep facts straight: This was NOT just an ' isolated or unfortunate situation,' but rather an on-going systematic problem of military base operations worldwide that was forewarned but ignored creating illnesses for some of our communities — please do not make same mistake and put our keiki in jeopardy. The Navy's own studies confirms past and future annual leakage that civil society cannot find acceptable. It is imperative that the DoD reimburse the DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION for all expenses incurred by this latest crisis.

As a part of O`ahu Water Protectors and the Wai Ola Alliance, I underscore that talk is not enough and must be translated into policy. Please affirm your commitment to the well-being of our students and teachers, and join the growing chorus of concerned agencies and institutions calling for permanent decommission so we do not have to live continuously with this catastrophic threat.

If we value the lives of our students and school staff, we must join the UN General Assembly in recognizing water as a basic human right. We must come together as a community on this. (note: the call-in system for televised meetings Department of Educations not work. When I was called for oral testimony my presence was not recognized ("off-line") and I was not able to speak despite being unmuted. I had to rush home to a computer to testify in BOARD OF EDUCATION meeting.)

Dear Chair Keohokalole, Chair Gabbard, Vice Chair Baker, Vice Chair Nishihara, and members of the Senate Health and Agriculture and Environment Committees,

I am Colonel Ann Wright. I served 29 years in the U.S. Army/Army Reserves. I also was a U.S. diplomat and served in U.S. Embassies in Nicaragua, Grenada, Somalia, Uzbekistan, Kyrgyzstan, Sierra Leone, Mongolia, Afghanistan and Mongolia.

I have lived in Honolulu for twenty years.

I have been researching and writing about the dangers from the Red Hill jet fuel tanks for the past decade.

With my long employment with the federal government, both in the U.S. military and the U.S. diplomatic corps, I am well aware of the Department of Defense argument that the massive underground jet fuel tanks are a national security necessity.

However, when the health and welfare of the persons that the U.S. military is organized to protect is endangered by the military facilities used for their "protection," then the facilities must be taken out of use. The leaking 80-year-old World War II jet fuel storage tanks located only 100 feet above our drinking water aquifer have frequently leaked.

The November leak has contaminated the drinking water for over 93,000 residents, ironically, many of the families of the U.S. military itself. The U.S. Navy has stated that it has already spent \$250 million on the damage done by the leak into one of its drinking water wells.

The City of Honolulu has closed down two of its drinking water wells near the contaminated well.

If the jet fuel contamination had spread further in the aquifer, there is no plan, nor sufficient resources for any plan, to take care of the 400,000 persons whose drinking water would be contaminated.

The only way to ensure the health and safety of the population of Oahu is to close down permanently the Red Hill jet fuel storage tanks.

Thank you for initiating Senate Bill SB2172. However, I agree with the Sierra Club analysis of the bill and urge you amend the legislation by:

1) removing reference to the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility in the preamble, to avoid potential federal preemption challenges;

2) amending the proposed new definition of "underground fuel storage tank" to apply to facilities with field-constructed tanks, or with a capacity over 100,000 gallons;

and 3) ensuring that no permit may be issued or renewed for an underground fuel storage tank, and that no underground fuel storage tank may be operated after the end of this year, for a facility located mauka of the underground injection control line.

The Council for Native Hawaiian Advancement (CNHA), a member-based 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization with a mission to enhance the cultural, economic, political, and community development of Native Hawaiians, **STRONGLY SUPPORTS** SB2172. This bill would prohibit the Department of Health from issuing and renewing permits for underground fuel storage tanks within one-half mile from an aquifer. SB2172 represents a significant step forward in addressing the Red Hill Crisis that currently threatens an aquifer that supplies fresh drinking water to nearly half of O'ahu's residents.

The Navy's Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility has leaked 180,000 gallons of fuel since 1940, including recent leaks that have contaminated the Southern O'ahu Basal Aquifer. After the November 2021 leaks, the Honolulu Board of Water Supply (HBWS) was forced to shut down its Hālawa Shaft, Hālawa Well and 'Aiea Well as a precautionary measure to prevent the fuel contamination from migrating to the public water system. An extended or permanent shutdown of these three critical HBWS wells could trigger mandatory water conservation measures during dry periods. Moreover, the unknown levels of fuel contamination in the Southern O'ahu Basal Aquifer could have potentially devastating impacts on Hawai'i's economy, especially if the contamination is so great that the HBWS is unable to approve new wells to support new affordable housing developments.

This measure, should it pass, would be a long-overdue step in the right direction toward the establishment of necessary governing frameworks that effectively work toward protecting Hawai'i's finite natural resources for the betterment of future generations. Native Hawaiian traditions have reflected the importance of fresh water for survival on this isolated archipelago in the middle of the vast Pacific Ocean. What Native Hawaiians, of the time before, knew of



sustainability and self-sufficiency in the Hawaiian Islands, through centuries of struggle-turnedinto-prosperity, is often taken for granted until an existential threat arises. We are presently faced with such a threat and it is evidently imperative that measures, like this, are needed to address the existing crisis and to mitigate the potential for future crises.

CNHA urges the Legislature to pass SB2172 to better protect O'ahu's life-giving waters. Mahalo nui loa for this opportunity to provide testimony on this measure.

We welcome legislation that will lead to the **permanent defueling and closure of the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility** that currently threatens Oahu's primary drinking water supply.

To better ensure that this measure can fulfill its purpose and protect our precious water, we respectfully offer some amendments for your consideration.

Please amend this measure by: 1) removing reference to the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility in the preamble, to avoid potential federal preemption challenges; 2) removing the proposed permitting authority for repairs and replacement of an existing underground fuel storage tank; 3) amending the proposed new definition of "underground fuel storage tank" to apply to facilities with field-constructed tanks, or with a capacity over 100,000 gallons; and 4) ensuring that no permit may be issued or renewed for an underground fuel storage tank, and that no underground fuel storage tank may be operated after July 1 of this year, for a facility located mauka of the underground injection control line.

Please **PASS** SB2172 with the above amendments.

#### Hawai'i Alliance for Progressive Action Supports: SB 2172 with amendments

Aloha Chair Keohokalole & Chair Gabbard, Vice Chair Baker and Vice Chair Nishihara and Members of the Committees,

On behalf of the Hawai'i Alliance for Progressive Action (HAPA) I am submitting testimony in <u>support of SB 2172 with amendments</u>. HAPA is a state-wide organization that engages approximately 10,000 local residents annually.

The presence of leaky fuel tanks at Red Hill and the Navy's mismanagement of this crisis directly impacts the health and quality of life of Oahu's residents, and will continue to for generations to come. Some of our staff and many of our supporters are directly affected by this crisis. Our water is precious and we all have a duty to protect our islands' source of life for present and future generations.

Mahalo for introducing SB 2172 to prohibit the operation of existing underground storage tanks, as well as the future construction of underground storage tanks within half a mile of an aquifer. SB 2172 seeks to protect our precious drinking water resources and this is of critical importance to our survival.

O'ahu's residents are facing a serious crisis which will continue for years. Board of Water Supply's Ernie Lau said that the Hālawa shaft – which was shut down as a precaution following the Navy's Red Hill well contamination – could be shut down for years, even permanently.

HAPA supports SB 2172, with the following amendments:

1) Please remove reference to the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility in the preamble, to avoid potential federal preemption challenges;

2) Please amend the proposed new definition of "underground fuel storage tank" to apply to facilities with field-constructed tanks, or with a capacity over 100,000 gallons; and

3) Please ensure that no permit may be issued or renewed for an underground fuel storage tank, and that no underground fuel storage tank may be operated after the end of this year, for a facility located mauka of the underground injection control line.

We cannot allow 80-year-old underground storage tanks that store up to 187 million gallons of fuel per day and that pose such an immense threat of leaking and contaminating our environment and water supply to operate 100 feet above O'ahu's sole-source drinking water aquifer.

Navy officials cannot be trusted to protect our water. They have lied time and time again. The following reasons explain why the legislature must act since the Navy has failed to:

- The Navy lied about an active leak at Pearl Harbor for months, discovering the leak in January 2021 but not informing Health Department officials until May. This was revealed in whistleblower emails and documents in October.
- A whistleblower also told the Department of Health in September that Navy officials provided false testimony and withheld information about the full extent of the Facility's infrastructure, including connected pipelines, as well as "historical records of corrosion issues, including holes in tanks" at its Red Hill fuel facility during legal proceedings.
- The Navy suspended use of its Red Hill water shaft on November 28, but the public only found out on December 1. The Navy continues to confuse and gaslight community members.
- Hundreds of community members reported chemical smells in their water on November 28 and then health issues on November 29, which the Navy refused to acknowledge as a potential health concern until the state Department of Health advised residents to not drink the clearly contaminated water.
- A day after the Navy said it had detected diesel in its 'Aiea Hālawa well at levels more than double the DOH safety limit, the military backtracked, saying the contaminated sample "did not come directly" from the well and the Navy does not believe the result proves the well is contaminated.
- They continue to not be transparent despite agreeing to the Administrative Order of Consent, which requires them to be more forthcoming about operations at the Red Hill facility.
- The BWS Hālawa shaft will be shut down until fuel is removed from the tanks and may not reopen for years to come. This shaft was a source of water for South O'ahu from Hālawa to Maunalua. The BWS has advised that mandatory water conservation measures will now need to be in place in the summer of 2022.
- The Navy "flushed" Red Hill contaminants for days in violation of Department of Health requirements despite repeated warnings. This risked long-lasting effects on birds, plants, fish, and other aquatic life from petroleum contamination

The Department of Health has agreed that the situation is inherently dangerous. DOH said that a water sample taken from the Red Hill drinking water shaft on December 5 confirmed the water is contaminated with "high levels" of petroleum and gasoline. The sample detected total petroleum hydrocarbons diesel range organics levels 350 times above the DOH Environmental Action Level (EAL) for drinking water, and gasoline range organics more than 66 times the DOH EAL.

The Red Hill facility – the fragile, antiquated fuel tanks and supporting systems – has a long history of leaking fuel into the surrounding environment and has already contaminated O'ahu's primary drinking water aquifer. Shutting down Red Hill immediately and entirely is the only way to guarantee the safety of our water and our people.

The Facility's tanks, each with a 12.5 million-gallon capacity, had a quarter-inch thick steel liner when first constructed nearly 80 years ago. They are encased in aging concrete and the steel liners have been corroding to the point where many through-wall holes have been found and in some areas they are one-third of their original thickness.

The Hawai'i Alliance for Progressive Action (HAPA) is a public non-profit organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. HAPA's mission is to catalyze community empowerment and systemic change towards valuing 'aina (environment) and people ahead of corporate profit.

These tanks have leaked 180,000 gallons of fuel since they were constructed and the Navy's own risk assessment from 2018 concluded that the probability of an acute leak of between 1,000 and 30,000 gallons (independent of any earthquake risk) over the next ten years is 96%. The Navy cannot prove that the tank or tank system will not leak regulated substances into the environment.

Approximately 93,000 people living in military housing have been unable to use their water for over two months. If the Navy water system is further compromised, our housing crisis will mushroom.

Lower levels of petroleum products were also found in samples collected from the Aliamanu Child Development Center as well as homes located on the Navy's water system.

It's absolutely critical that the State Legislature take action immediately to address this major threat to Honolulu's water supply.

Please PASS SB2172 with the above amendments.

Chairs Keohokalole and Gabbard, Vice Chairs Baker and Nishihara, and Members of the Committees:

The Hawaii Military Affairs Council ("MAC") offers comments on Senate Bill 2172 which:

- 1) Prohibits issuance of future underground fuel storage tanks within one-half mile of an aquifer beginning July 1, 2022;
- 2) Prohibits operation of and renewal of underground fuel storage tank permits located within one-half mile from an aquifer beginning January 1, 2050; and
- 3) Defines underground fuel storage tanks as any fuel tank with a capacity of one hundred gallons or more.

The Hawaii Military Affairs Council (MAC) was established in 1985 when the Chamber was appointed by the State to serve as the liaison to the military. The MAC advocates on behalf of Hawaii's military, and is comprised of business leaders, academic institutions, State and County officials, members of the CODEL, community leaders, labor unions and organizations and retired U.S. flag and general officers. The MAC works to support Hawaii's location as a strategic U.S. headquarters in the Indo-Asia-Pacific region which is crucial for U.S. national and homeland security.

In recognizing how critical the U.S. military presence is to Hawaii's economy, the MAC underscores the importance of the military's ability to remain "ready to respond" which is essential for preserving the military's presence in the State and protecting a vital driver of our state's economy as well as deter and defend against would be aggressors in this region and preserve our way of life. In addition to protecting the State's economy, the military employs over 100,000 people in Hawaii. The MAC recognizes that the safety of the people of Hawaii and the community is paramount and will continue to work with the military, state officials and the community on a path forward ensuring the protection and safety of our people and community, transparency, and a viable path forward.

By way of background, Congress passed 2022 National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year on December 15, 2021 which adopts and builds off the Hawaii's Congressional



Delegation's request for independent Inspector General review of Red Hill by requiring an independent American Petroleum Institute certified inspector to examine the facility. Additionally, on January 11, 2022 the Department of the Navy announced their commitment to Hawaii and comply with all six elements of the State Department of Health order.

Given the Department of the Navy's commitment to work with federal, state, and local agencies to suspend operations and empty the underground tanks at the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility, we express and recognize foremost the safety of the people of Hawaii and the protection of our precious natural resources

# To better ensure that this measure can fully protect our islands' most precious resource from facilities like the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility, the NHPI 3R Team respectfully urges the following amendments:

1. In an abundance of caution, to prevent this measure from being preempted by federal laws prohibiting state legislation targeting specific federal facilities, removing the reference to the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility in the preamble,

2. To prevent unintended impacts on underground fuel tank operators using modern, double-walled and factory-constructed tanks such as those in vehicle gas stations, amending the definition of "underground fuel storage tank" to mean "any fuel tank or tank faciliity and associated infrastructure that is or includes field constructed tanks, or that has a capacity of over 100,000 gallons"; and

3. To eliminate the imminent existential threat that may be posed by underground fuel storage tank facilities as defined above:

a. amending references to "within one-half mile of the outer limit of the outer edge of an aquifer" to "above an aquifer or within one-half mile of the outer edge of the aquifer as defined by the department pursuant to chapter 342E," or to "mauka of the underground injection control line as defined by the department pursuant to chapter 342E";

b. removing the proposed permitting authority for repairs and replacement of an existing underground fuel storage tank in 342L- (a);

c. prohibiting the operation of underground fuel storage tanks beginning January 1, 2023 in 342L- (b).

The health of our people, who are descended from dozens of indigenous Pasifika groups, is fundamentally connected to the well-being of natural resources. Fresh water in the future depends on making sound decisions in the present. We urge the committees to examine the proposed amendments and pass SB 2172 as a critical role in preserving the environment and the future of our communities.

#### Statement of the Protect Kahoʻolawe ʻOhana Regarding the Kapūkakī Fuel Storage Tank Facility Calling for the immediate decommissioning and removal of the fuel tanks

E ui aku ana au iā 'oe:	One question I ask of you:
Aia i hea ka wai a Kāne?	Where flows the water of Kane?
Aia i lalo, i ka honua, i ka wai hū,	Deep in the ground, in the gushing spring,
I ka wai kau a Kāne me Kanaloa —	In the ducts of Kāne and Kanaloa,
He wai puna, he wai e inu,	A well-spring of water, to quaff,
He wai e mana, he wai e ola.	A water of magic power, the water of life!
E ola nō, e-a!	Life! O give us this life!

The lines quoted above comprise the last stanza of "He Mele No Kāne," a composition that masterfully describes all of the places that water may be found. From the zenith of the heavens to the depths of the Earth, from the rising to the setting of the sun, water is everywhere. This water is a physical manifestation of the deity Kāne. It is sacred. It is life giving.

In recent weeks, a threat to our life-giving water has reared its menacing head. Officials and activists warned of this potential hazard for years. True to character, the United States Navy is attempting to downplay the seriousness of the issue at hand, just as it did for many years when we fought to stop the bombing of Kaho'olawe. The Navy's lack of integrity and absence of transparency prove that it once again cannot be trusted. The careless abuse of Kaho'olawe and lackadaisical cleanup of the island established precedence of their negligence. We again witness their carelessness and mismanagement of Hawai'i's precious resources.

The fuel storage tanks at Kapūkakī (Red Hill) are a known threat to O'ahu's aquifer. For many years, community groups such as the Sierra Club of Hawai'i and individuals such as Ernest Lau, Board of Water Supply Chief Engineer, cautioned of imminent discharge from the aging fuel tanks that sit over O'ahu's natural volcanic dikes. Yet the Navy continues to deny the
presence of such risk and chooses, instead, to evade the fact that we are on the brink of a devastating environmental disaster. At a December 2, 2021 Facebook Live town hall meeting, 25th Infantry Division Cmdr. Maj. Gen. Joseph Ryan told attendees, "Our readiness posture here in the Pacific is predicated, the foundation of it, is the life, health and safety of our service members and their families." Is that not telling? It's not about the island, the environment, and the people of Hawai'i, it's about the military families and their assets. And, tragically, the service members and families have been the first to be impacted.

The Protect Kaho'olawe 'Ohana supports the efforts of the Sierra Club Hawai'i, the O'ahu Water Protectors, Ka'ohewai, and all other environmental advocacy groups that are calling for the **immediate** shut down and decommissioning of the Kapūkakī (Red Hill) Storage Tank Facility. Our water is too precious a resource to wait any longer to take action.

Of course, this is not the first example of a lack of concern for the source of life, our environment, and our well being. In 1965, the U.S. Navy carried out an "experiment" known as "<u>Operation Sailor Hat</u>" on Kaho'olawe. Three 500-ton blasts of explosives created a crater on Kaho'olawe that, in addition to other long lasting effects, may have cracked the water table, diminishing the island's ability to support flora and fauna for generations. Was that "experiment" a foreshadowing of things to come? This cannot happen again, yet leaking fuel tanks and a possible explosion within the crater are a reality and may be probable should conditions such as this be allowed to continue.

The PKO strongly urges our members and our supporters to call upon Honolulu City Council members, State Senators and Representatives, and Hawai'i's congressional delegation to intervene and call for urgent action regarding the Kapūkakī (Red Hill) Fuel Storage Facility. The U.S. Navy must be held accountable for their blatant disregard for the purity of O'ahu's drinking water resources and the safety of O'ahu's communities. We cannot allow history to repeat itself and let the Navy get away with their reckless actions. E ola ka wai, e ola ka 'āina, e ola kākou. Let the water live so that the land may live and so that we may live.

The PKO stands in support of SB 2172 which seeks to protect our islands' most precious resource from fuel contamination. #### **RE:** SB 2172 – Relating to Underground Fuel Storage Tanks Position: STRONG SUPPORT with amendments

Dear Chairs, Keohokalole and Gabbard, Vice-Chairs Baker and Nishihara, and Members of the Committees on Health and Agriculture and Environment,

Papa Ola Lōkahi supports SB 2172 with amendments. This measure takes action to protect the health and life of our islands and communities through the protection of a precious resource – water.

The traditional Hawaiian perspective placed immense value on water, as demonstrated by the word waiwai, which is commonly translated as "wealth" today. The importance of fresh water is a theme that continues as the threat to our freshwater aquifers are imminent; efforts to protect this resource must be prioritized. The intention of SB 2172 to govern decisionmaking so that the well-being of natural resources and communities is prioritized is critical to Hawai'i's future. Further, it seeks to make changes learned from the past installation and operation of underground fuel tanks and facilities, like the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility.

In addition, Papa Ola Lōkahi respectfully urges the following amendments to strengthen the protection of fresh water resources in the State of Hawai'i:

- 1. In an abundance of caution to prevent this measure from being preempted by federal laws prohibiting state legislation targeting specific federal facilities, removing the reference to the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility in the preamble.
- 2. To prevent unintended impacts on underground fuel tank operators using modern, doublewalled, and factory-constructed tanks such as those in vehicle gas stations, amending the definition of "underground fuel storage tank" to mean "any fuel tank or tank facility and associated infrastructure that is or includes field constructed tanks, or that has a capacity of over 100,000 gallons"; and
- 3. To eliminate the imminent existential threat that may be posed by underground fuel storage tank facilities as defined above:
  - a. amending references to "within one-half mile of the outer limit of the outer edge of an aquifer" to "above an aquifer or within one-half mile of the outer edge of the aquifer as defined by the department pursuant to chapter 342E," or to "mauka of the underground injection control line as defined by the department pursuant to chapter 342E";
  - b. removing the proposed permitting authority for repairs and replacement of an existing underground fuel storage tank in 342L- (a);
  - c. prohibiting the operation of underground fuel storage tanks beginning January 1, 2023 in 342L-(b).

Without these proposed amendments, one of Hawai'i's most valuable assets are threatened with irreversible contamination. Thank you for the opportunity to testify in strong support with amendments of this important legislation.

My name is Sabrina Cohan. I am a sixteen year old student living in Honolulu, and I am writing to you today to express my strong support of SB2172.

Clean drinking water is a human right, and the operation of the Red Hill fuel tanks puts this right in jeopardy. The recent leakage of the tanks was not sudden, and there have been many warning signs throughout the years as to the tanks' structural instability. If the tanks are allowed to continue holding fuel 100 feet above Oahu's main aquifer, there is no guarantee that they will not leak again. I acknowledge that the Navy views the tanks as a national security asset, but the health of Oahu's residents cannot be compromised upon. The tanks must be decommissioned before the state of our aquifer deteriorates.

SB2172 would prevent future crises of this sort before they begin, and would help to protect the right to clean water for the residents of Oahu for generations. This bill is vital to the continued health of the island, and to the protection of Oahu's environmental integrity. Our islands are beautiful, and should be protected, not exploited as a military asset.

As a young person living on Oahu, I am extremely passionate about environmental issues and protecting the natural beauty of this island for future generations. I also believe firmly in finding equitable solutions to environmental problems, and lifting up the minority communities affected most by environmental crises. The contamination of our aquifer is an issue of environmental justice, and poses serious threats to those communities that would not have the means to access fresh water should our groundwater be irreversibly harmed.

My name is Jeannine Johnson and I live on the Kona side of Oʻahu and my drinking water and the water for my family, friends and neighbors, are all impacted by the Navy's leaking, antiquated fuel tanks at the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility. The Navy's dangerous fuel tanks not only threaten our public health, they are detrimental to the environment and desecrate one of the most sacred wahi pana in Moanalua, Leilono, once located along the upper rim of the Ä€liamanu crater and was an entrance to PÅ•, or the "otherworld." Samuel Kamakau published several versions of this moʻolelo. The following is a translation of his writings from Kuokoa in August 11, 1899:

## â€<sup>—</sup>

It was a place said to be the opening, on the island of Oahu, for mankind to enter eternal night. This place is on the northern side of the famous hill of Kapukaki (now Red Hill), at the boundary of Kona and Ewa, right in line with the burial hill of Aliamanu, on the upper side of the old road. It is said that this place [Leilono] is round, about two feet or more in circumference. This is the hole through which the ghosts of people slipped through to go down and this was the strata of Papa-ia-Laka. Through this opening appeared the supernatural branches of the breadfruit of Leiwalo. If a ghost who lacked an aumakua to save him climbed on a branch of the western side of the breadfruit tree, the branch withered at once and broke off, thus plunging the ghost down to the pit of darkness. The boundaries of this place, so the ancients said, were these: Papa-kolea which was guarded by a plover; Koleana whose guard was a big caterpillar and Napeha, the western boundary which was guarded by a lizard. (Sterling and Summers 1978:9) (brackets added)†Kumu Pono Associated LLC Study No. 131 (April 21, 2012)

I am a resident of East Honolulu, and I have worked as an environmental engineering consultant for over 20 years. I support with amendments SB2172.

I have conducted hundreds of environmental site assessments (ESAs) on the mainland. Underground storage tanks (USTs) were always a major concern during these ESAs. Older, single-walled containers more often than not corroded and leaked, causing significant environmental damage. If a single-walled UST was found during the ESA, it was assumed that it had leaked, and testing was conducted to determine the extent of the damage before removing the tank or filling it with concrete and closing it in place.

It is with this first-hand knowledge of leaking USTs that I became deeply concerned about the Navy's single-walled fuel storage tanks sitting on top of the aquifer that supplies water to me and so many of my fellow Oahu neighbors and residents. For the past three years, I have sent letters to Hawaii's Congressional Delegation expressing my concern regarding these tanks. All my letters and those of my fellow concerned citizens fell on deaf ears. It is deeply troubling that they waited until people were poisoned by fuel leaking into their water supply before expressing outrage at this situation. We are counting on you to do the right thing by passing SB2172 with amendments.

As an environmental consultant, we often conduct risk assessments for our clients to help determine whether an action should be taken. The assessments use a probability scale ranging from low to high and impacts ranging from minor to catastrophic. If we allow the Navy to continue its use of the Red Hill fuel tanks, we are looking at a high probability of a catastrophic impact – a situation that would be much worse that what we have already experienced. It is simply unjustifiable that these fuel tanks are allowed to continue operating above our drinking water supplies. The Navy has replaced similar tanks with aboveground tanks in other areas; the same must be done in Hawai'i.

Pollution of an aquifer damages not only human health, but environmental health as well. Not only are we seeing and will we continue to see countless children born with birth defects and an epidemic of older adults with terminal illnesses, we will invariably see a major collapse in the health of all affected aquatic ecosystems.

Beyond the obvious health, human rights and ecological implications of this impending and continuing crisis, the financial toll will be extreme. The Department of Transportation Services (DTS) and the Department of Facility Maintenance (DFM) of the City and County of Honolulu (City), offers the following comments on Senate Bill 2172 (SB 2172), relating to underground fuel storage tanks.

While we support the implementation of protective measures for our fresh water sources, as operational City departments, we own and operate large-scale infrastructure related to fueling light and heavy duty vehicles (passenger cars, utility trucks, and transit buses) which serve the entire island of O'ahu. Underground fuel storage for fueling and emergency resilience is important to the day-to-day operations of municipal resources and essential during emergency operations.

In addition to DTS and DFM, other City departments also own, operate, and maintain fuel storage tanks. These departments are a diverse representation of City services, from our first responders (Police, Fire, and Emergency Services), Department of Emergency Management, Department of Enterprise Services, Department of Parks and Recreation, and the Medical Examiner's Office.

DTS and DFM highlight the definition of "underground fuel storage tank" as "any fuel tank with a capacity of one hundred or more gallons installed underground" and requests further clarification and consideration of increasing the capacity to a greater extent congruent with common commercial and industrial uses. Comparatively, DTS' Kalihi-Pālama Bus Facility and Pearl City Bus Facility each have four 12,000 gallon fuel storage tanks to support over 700 transit and support vehicles.

Mahalo for your commitment to environmental protection and for the opportunity to comment on SB 2172.

### In consideration of SENATE BILL 2172 RELATING TO UNDERGROUND FUEL STORAGE TANKS

Senate Bill 2172 proposes to add a new section to Chapter 342L, Hawai'i Revised Statutes (HRS), prohibiting the Department of Health from issuing new permits or renewing permits for underground fuel storage tanks whin one half mile from an aquifer, and creating a new definition of "fuel storage tanks." The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports this measure and offers the following comments.

The Department is concerned about the risks of underground fuel storage tanks and their related plumbing leaking and contaminating potable drinking water aquifers. The Department and its Commission on Water Resource Management stands united alongside Hawai'i's Congressional delegation and the Hawai'i Department of Health calling on the Navy to immediately suspend operations at the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility and fully comply with the Emergency Order to begin the process of planning and executing the safe removal of fuel that continues to pose a threat to O'ahu's drinking water.

Prohibiting the installation or continuance of underground fuel storage tanks <u>above</u> and near the edge of aquifers would mitigate this risk. Subsurface geologic formations and aquifer properties may affect the direction and rate of transport of leaked fuel within any given aquifer as well as the extent of contamination. The Department defers to the Department of Health on the specific distance from an aquifer that underground fuel storage tanks should be prohibited, the appropriate capacity of fuel storage tanks in the new definition of fuel storage tanks, and any other proposed amendments to this measure.

Position: Support, with friendly amendments

Me ke Aloha, Chairs Kehohokalole and Gabbard, Vice-Chairs Baker and Nishihara, and Members of the Health and Agriculture and Environment Committees:

Mahalo, Senators, for hearing this important bill, which captures the nearly unanimous sense of the general public: it is time to decommission the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility, despite the Navy's preference for its own timetable and recognizance, both of which are now shown inadequate to our national security (please note Governor Ige's statement of December 7, 2021).

There are some technical problems with this bill which will impede its progress to its rightful completion on behalf of a grateful public.

First, the entirety of each island is over an aquifer – there is no such thing as a location one half-mile from an aquifer, even within submerged lands. What we believe is meant is a drinking water aquifer, which itself may be an inadequate definition if a potential drinking water source is not being currently used to tap water for human purposes.

The familiar rule already used to protect drinking water is to prohibit deleterious uses above the Underground Injection Control Line (UIC line). We recommend using this language.

Sadly, even this provision cannot adequately protect the Public Trust in waters of the State, as the Precautionary Principle, inseparable from the Public Trust, is not followed by the U.S. military. The general public has come to understand that the U.S. military is incapable of protecting land and water from its contaminant sources. The recommended prohibition would still allow the location of a new facility over a caprock aquifer, doubtless contributing to the already degraded waters of the South shore caprock aquifers.

We understand that the substance of this bill properly goes beyond the Governor's Emergency Order of December 7, 2021, contested by the Navy in a quasi-judicial action, but confirmed January 3, 2022 in a final Decision and Order. That decision allows for recommencement of bulk storage functions at Red Hill following an ill-defined "assessment" and subsequent "corrective actions on deficiencies". While we can presume that the Department of Health would make the appropriate determination for us, we believe that the U.S. military has demonstrated its unwillingness to abide a fundamental rule in Hawaii protecting the Public Trust. For this reason we recommend amendment of this bill to reflect

hydrogeological, political, ethical and legal realities, and heartily support amendment as follows (deleted material struck through, new material underlined, recommended amendments double-underlined and in blue):

"342L- <u>Permits near aquifer mauka of the underground control injection line prohibited. (a)</u> Beginning July 1, 2022, the department shall not issue a permit for a new underground fuel storage tank within one-half mile of the outer edge of an aquifer mauka of the underground control injection line; provided that a permit may be issued by the department for purposes of repairing or replacing removing an existing underground fuel storage tank.

(b) Beginning January 1, 2024, no person shall operate an underground storage tank within one-half mile of the outer edge of an aquifer-mauka of the underground control injection line, and no permit for an underground fuel storage tank within one-half mile of the outer edge of an aquifer mauka of the underground injection control line shall be renewed.

WHEREAS, Native Hawaiians consider freshwater, or wai, sacred to the Gods Kāne and Lono; and

WHEREAS, wai has been integral to a vibrant Hawaiian community from ancient times to the present; and

WHEREAS, vital to their survival, Hawaiians have always protected the wai for their sustenance and in order to produce the bounty of foods and forests products important to them; and

WHEREAS, the United States Navy has operated its Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility in the Pu'uloa area of O'ahu since the 1940's; and

WHEREAS, the facility includes 20 large field-constructed underground fuel storage tanks, each holding at least 12.5 million gallons of jet fuel; and

WHEREAS, these tanks are located in the area under which lies the Pearl Harbor aquifer, the largest fresh water resource on the island of O'ahu; and

WHEREAS, concern has been raised that fuel leakage from the tanks could contaminate the fresh water supply that supports the island from Maunalua to Mākua; and

WHEREAS, although initial testing has not yet found significant contamination in water samples drawn from wells in the immediate vicinity, concerns remain about continuing leakage and threats to the groundwater aquifer; and

WHEREAS, according to documents formerly classified by the Department of Defense, these storage tanks have been leaking fuel for much of the past 50 years; and

WHEREAS, in January 2014, fuel was found leaking from Tank No. 5, an amount estimated in excess of 27,000 gallons of fuel; and

WHEREAS, despite Navy denials, a former administrator for the State Department of Health (DOH) says the remaining active tanks continue to leak until today; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has signed an Administrative Order of Consent (AOC), with the State DOH, the Defense Logistics Agency, and the U.S. Navy, identifying corrective actions to be taken at the Red Hill storage facility; and

WHEREAS, this draft AOC would allow the Navy additional time to pursue best-practice technologies for addressing the leakage problem; and

WHEREAS, the EPA, Department of Health and U.S. Navy held an informational meeting earlier this year to receive comments from the public about the AOC; and

WHEREAS, it is uncertain when a formal response from the EPA, DOH and U.S. Navy will be announced to the public.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs at its 56<sup>TH</sup> annual convention at Lahaina, Maui this 14<sup>th</sup> day of November 2015, that we request the U.S. Navy to expedite corrective actions to the Red Hill bulk fuel storage facility and safeguard Oahu's drinking water; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the U.S. Navy is hereby requested to take all actions necessary to relocate these fuel tanks to sites that do not lie over groundwater resources; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the U.S. Navy is hereby urged to immediately remediate the release of fuel from the Red Hill bulk storage facility which has occurred over the past 60 years; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the DOH and the State Commission on Water Resource Management are hereby asked to uphold their kuleana (responsibilities) to protect the safety and quality of our island's fresh water resources by ensuring that all underground storage facilities, including those of the U.S. military, are regularly inspected and that all fuel resources are accounted for to ensure prompt leak detection and repair; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be transmitted to the Governor of Hawaii, State Senate Committee on Hawaiian Affairs, State House Committee on Ocean, Marine Resources, & Hawaiian Affairs, The Office of Hawaiian Affairs Chair of the Board of Trustees, members of Hawaii's congressional delegation, the Commander Navy Region Hawai'i, the Director of the Defense Logistics Agency, the Administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the Director of the State Department of Health, the Chair of the Commission on Water Resource Management and Mayor Kirk Caldwell.

The Windward Coalition supports **AMENDMENTS** SB2172, which seeks to protect our islands' most precious resource from fuel contamination. Our water is precious and we all have a duty to protect our islands' source of life for present and future generations.

The Windward Coalition is a voluntary community action group with the mission of improving the quality of life of Windward residents by addressing environmental issues affecting our neighborhoods. We are not affiliated with or part of any political party, government entity or other organization.

While the windward aquifer is not directly impacted by the Red Hill fuel leakage, all the aquifers are linked underground (refer to BWS Ernest Lau's description of the aquifers as underground sponges). Pollution can seep from one aquifer into another, threatening the quality of the water supply elsewhere. Furthermore, if the aquifer below Honolulu is not drinkable, the BWS will be forced to draw water from other aquifers and ration water, as the supply of water will not be sufficient to support the island's population.

This is a major crisis which requires immediate action to salvage Oahu's aquifer and drinking water for the present and the future. The Red Hill facility has been the site of multiple fuel spills going back decades and the patchwork repairs have not fixed the problem. Recently reported new data from the U.S. Navy shows heightened levels of fuel contaminants in the soil and groundwater around the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility last May and January (2021). Petroleum ingestion is a health hazard.

Without safe drinking water, our island's ability to support the ecosystem, our population, the military bases and national security interests is in very serious jeopardy. Yes, relocating the fuel tanks will be very expensive. Other states in similar situations have shut down leaking fuel tanks, ensuring local environmental security without risking National Security. The Navy must be Pono and take responsible, immediate action to stop further damage.

We are heading down a path that will soon be irreversible if the tanks aren't permanently shut down and relocated. Healthy drinking water is fundamental to the very essence of our life on this

I SUPPORT WITH AMENDMENTS SB2172, which seeks to protect our islands' most precious resource from fuel contamination. Our water is precious and we all have a duty to protect our islands' source of life for present and future generations.

According to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in this <u>linked document on ground water</u> <u>contamination</u>, underground fuel storage tanks are one of a number common ground water contamination sources, and this contamination is often caused by leaks and lack of maintenance. The article mentions distancing potential sources of contamination, just as this bill recommends, as well as maintaining storage tanks. The article also mentions that pollution that reaches groundwater often starts as a plume that moves slowly, as does the ground water itself, and tends to move downhill with the topography of the land. Time, mixture with greater amounts of water, and soil absorption can all help dissipate pollutants naturally; however cracks, fissures, and pores in rocks (as is common with the igneous rock surrounding our aquifer) can all make pollution containment and cleanup difficult. Additionally, pumping water between aquifer areas can spread pollution too.

Pollution remediation efforts listed by the article include the following and are chosen based on the geography of the affected area:

- Containing the contaminant to prevent migration.
- Pumping the water, treating it, and returning it to the aquifer.
- Leaving the ground water in place and treating either the water or the contaminant.
- Allowing the contaminant to attenuate (reduce) naturally (with monitoring), following the implementation of an appropriate source control.

I worry that due to the porous nature of the rock surrounding our aquifer that pollution can more easily contaminate our entire islands' water supply. I am unaware of the financial cost of cleanup, but I do hope the U.S. Navy is held accountable for the spill at Red Hill and does act pono, cleaning the fuel spill at whatever the required cost. The health of our island community and environment is too precious to negotiate on this.

Please amend this measure by:

I am an environmental consultant with a PhD in geology from UH and more than 30 years of experience in environmental consulting in Hawai'i. While the motivation behind the bill is understandable given the Red Hill incidents, this bill would provide consequences that may not be initially recognized.

The use of the term "aquifers" without qualification would essentially ban all underground storage tanks (USTs) in the State, since the entirely of the islands are underlaid by aquifers. The bill would force the closure of commercial gasoline stations where above-ground storage of fuel is not practicable and, in cases where above-ground storage may be physically feasible, would introduce visual blight and aboveground spill and fire/explosion hazards to the surrounding community. The impact to small business gasoline stations should also be considered.

Aquifers are characterized by several sources. For example, about 30 years ago, the Water Resources Research Center at UH-Mānoa published a series of documents identifying and classifying the aquifers on all islands. They characterized aquifers as to their vulnerability to contamination and their significance as drinking water sources. Not all aquifers are classified as drinking water sources and should not be considered as such.

The Hawai'i Department of Health's Safe Drinking Water Branch (SDWB) has established an "Underground Injection Control" (UIC) line on all islands. In general, aquifers above (mauka of) the UIC line are considered potential drinking water sources and injection of wastes is prohibited. However, using the UIC line as the demarcation for banning USTs, would mean closure of or major modifications to numerous community gasoline stations throughout the islands that lie mauka of the UIC line but don't threaten public drinking water sources.

The SDWB already encourages the removal of USTs and onsite sewage disposal systems as part of their Wellhead Protection programs. More emphasis on and funding for meaningful wellhead protection would be worthwhile.

A practical and meaningful approach may be to define a drinking water capture zone around public drinking water sources and to prohibit USTs above a certain size in those zones. A 100-gallon size limitation as proposed in the draft legislation is likely unnecessarily conservative in all capture zones. Application of an informed scientific approach to crafting this legislation would improve its viability and potentially reduce its adverse economic impacts.

Due to the likely significant and potential adverse impacts of this proposed legislation, I urge the committee to defer this bill until the groundwater science is further evaluated and the consequences of such a ban are further considered.

Chairs Keohokalole and Gabbard and members of the committees: I support the intent of this bill, but as presently written suffers from serious deficiencies of deadlines we cannot afford, as the present situation is, (as described by the Department of Health Hearing Officer David Day), "a ticking time bomb". As you are aware there is a huge risk of a catastrophic, permanent disaster of contamination of the entire aquifer.

Under subsection (a), new permits may be issued for new underground tanks July 1, 2022. This section should be changed to read "effective immediately", to prohibit any new installations near the aquifer.

Under subsection (b), the Navy could continue to operate Red Hill until 2050 without any repairs or remediation unless the Navy voluntarily complies with the Dept of Health's order.

The wording needs to be changed to: "effective immediately, unless permission is received from the Department of Health and/or the governor to continue operation for no more than 90 days...(or similar deadline)"

The Navy's refusal to agree or acknowledged State jurisdiction over this facility and its refusal to release the full report of investigation of the 2021 leaks demonstrates that immediate action to force defueling and relocation must be taken by the Legislature.
