Chair Dela Cruz and Members of the Committee:

The Hawaii State Teachers Association <u>strongly supports SB 2786</u>, making appropriations for collective bargaining cost items. This bill provides appropriations for collective bargaining cost items for the members of Unit (5) and their excluded counterparts, including the cost of salary adjustments negotiated between the State and the bargaining unit representative for fiscal biennium 2021-2023.

The Hawaii State Teachers Association is the exclusive representative of the state's 13,700 public school educators and the local affiliate of the 2.2 million member National Education Association. This measure provides a vehicle to fund a collective bargaining agreement for bargaining unit (5) upon ratification of new contract.

Although BU (5) has a contract in place, there are possible upcoming negotiations for possible contract adjustments/extensions and vehicle bills may be necessary if an agreement is reached requiring an appropriation prior to the end of the legislative session.

The Hawaii State Teachers Association asks your committee to **support** this bill.
