### In consideration of SENATE BILL 313 RELATING TO LITTER CONTROL

# Senate Bill 313 proposes to prohibit the intentional release of balloons inflated with a gas that is lighter than air. The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) appreciates the intent of this bill and provides the following comments.

The Department recognizes the deleterious impacts that marine debris, including balloons, has on wildlife and their habitats, leading to an alarming natural resource concern throughout the state. Marine debris harms land and ocean-based habitat through smothering and abrasion and impacts a variety of wildlife through ingestion and entanglement.

A study conducted by the University of Tasmania (research conducted outside of Hawaii) found that 1 in 3 birds out of a sample of 1,733 sea birds, representing 51 different species, had ingested plastic marine debris. Balloons, as soft plastics, posed the highest risk for the sea birds since they can cause fatal obstruction. Sea turtles, as well, were susceptible to mortality from soft plastics, due to experiencing a blockage though the gastrointestinal tract lasting anywhere between 4 to 6 months. Gut-content studies from Australia have indicated that turtles may selectively ingest balloons and other soft plastics due to their similar appearances to a species of jellyfish consumed by all species of turtles. The negative impact of ingestion is compounded by the fact that plastics of all sizes absorb and release Persistent Organic Pollutants, toxic chemicals which adversely affect the health and longevity of marine organisms.

Senate Bill 313 is identical to House Bill 1102 (2021), which was signed into law as Act 141, Session Laws of Hawaii 2021. Act 141 will prohibit the intentional release of balloons inflated with a gas that is lighter than air beginning on January 1, 2023.
