RELATING TO TEACHER PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The Department of Budget and Finance (B&F) offers comments for this measure.

This measure appropriates an unspecified amount of general funds for FY 23 for the funding of 21 hours of professional development for teachers of the Department of Education.

B&F has serious concerns because this bill "puts the cart before the horse."

Appropriating funding for cost items before negotiations are complete and agreements are reached could adversely impact the collective bargaining process.

B&F also notes that, with respect to the general fund appropriation in this bill, the federal Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act requires that states receiving Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) II funds and Governor's Emergency Education Relief II funds must maintain state support for:

 Elementary and secondary education in FY 22 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for elementary and secondary education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19; and Higher education in FY 22 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for higher education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19.

Further, the federal American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act requires that states receiving ARP ESSER funds must maintain state support for:

- Elementary and secondary education in FY 22 and FY 23 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for elementary and secondary education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19; and
- Higher education in FY 22 and FY 23 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for higher education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19.

The U.S. Department of Education has issued rules governing how these maintenance of effort (MOE) requirements are to be administered. B&F will be working with the money committees of the Legislature to ensure that the State of Hawai'i complies with these ESSER MOE requirements.

The Hawaii State Teachers Association <u>strongly supports SB3209, SD2</u>. This bill appropriates funds for teacher professional development.

There continues to be a severe shortage of licensed teachers in our public school classrooms throughout the state. Each year, the Department of Education looks for approximately one thousand two hundred teachers to fill vacancies in public preschool through twelfth grade levels. This means that approximately six hundred classrooms statewide are staffed by substitutes, or emergency hires, rather than full time licensed teachers. Multiply that number by 25 (although class sizes tend to be closer to 30+ in the upper grades, unfortunately) and that would be 80,000+ students without a licensed teacher in their classroom. We need to do everything we possibly can to attract and retain our licensed teachers whom are critical for our students' learning growth.

One way we are able to help retain our teachers is for the DOE to offer professional development, and what we hope the HIDOE considers, if given this money, is to actually negotiate with HSTA and bring back the 21 hrs. for professional development that were not included in this last contract. As we all know, teachers not only want the professional development, they need the time to complete it, and they should also be compensated for their valuable time as well.

To support the retention of our teachers, the Hawaii State Teachers Association urges you to **<u>support</u>** this bill.

Aloha and thank you for the work you do for our state. I am writing to ask you to support SB3209 SD2 which will restore the 21 hours of job-embedded professional development (PD) for teachers. The 21-hours of PD provided a much needed opportunity for teachers to engage in learning to better their professional skills. I know teachers who were finally able to move up into a different class on the contract because of the 21 hours we had been granted. If you have ever taught in a classroom, you know that there are countless hours that go into planning lessons (and correcting student work). Many of our teachers work 2nd, and even 3rd, jobs to make ends meet. Many don't have the time or money to be able to take PD courses outside of work hours. Providing PD during work hours makes it doable for them.

I have been an educator since 1988. When I first taught in the classroom, we had some curricula to use but many of the lessons were created from scratch. We didn't have access to the kind of instructional practices and data that exist today. Nor did we have access to much technology. We used film projectors and mimeograph machines. Teachers now are being required to continually learn new and exciting ways to teach, as well as the technology that goes with it. During the pandemic, teachers had to master many new programs and apps while also honing their instructional practices.

Newer teachers are required to take PD courses in order to move up the pay scale but veteran teachers who are already in Class VII have little extrinsic motivation to continually take PD courses outside of school. Of course many teachers take courses even if they don't need the credit, but often it's very hard to commit to a weekly course in our already busy schedules. We may have families with young children and/or aging parents to care for, 2nd or 3rd jobs, volunteer work, papers to grade, lessons to plan, and lives to lead. I don't know of many jobs in which employees are expected to take classes outside of work, yet that is what happens with teachers. It seems very fair and sensible to offer PD embedded in the work day so that all teachers have access to paid professional development similar to what many other professionals are offered. We expect teachers to keep up with the latest educational best practices. We expect teachers to know and apply them. Please help ensure that all teachers have access to 21 hours of professional development during their work day.

I am writing in support of SB3209. The 21-hours of professional development is crucial for teachers to continually improve their teaching practice and to better the quality of education provided to our keiki. Currently, teachers are tasks to find and pay for professional development courses on their own. This sounds simple, but the costs of these professionald development courses can be too much for a young teacher. Some courses cost upwards of \$300, which is difficult to spare as a young person with college debt who is paying rent in Hawai'i. Even if the professional development course offerings were affordable, there are not enough course offerings to support the demand of teachers wanting to take professional development courses. In one of my first experiences trying to register for a course, I waited a single day to register because I wanted to make sure I had the time and resources to complete the course. By the next day, the course had filled up. There are only 30 seats per course and thousands of teachers. The math doesn't add up. Furthermore, sometimes the professional development courses are highly specialized and don't apply to your field. For example, I am an instrmental music teacher. Taking a professional development course in coding will not help improve my practice as a music teacher.

The 21-hours of professional development not only gives all teachers an opportunity to take professional development courses, but also allows administrators to ensure that all staff are on the same page and learning material in line with the schools vision. Previously, when the 21-hours was implemented, I had a very pleasant experience learning about Visible Learning practices with my collagaues, and it helped student achievement because all teachers were using a uniform system of learning accountability. The 21-hours is a win for all parties involved. Administrators get to unify the staff and better align teacher practice with the school's vision, teachers get opportunities to better their teaching practice without shelling out hundreds of dollars, and the students get to learn from better prepared teachers who are consistent in the learning systems being implemented.

Again, please support SB3209. This is a win-win-win for all stakeholders.

This is my 19th year in the classroom. I started teaching here while finishing my graduate degree at UH Mānoa, but even with my degrees and various certifications, I still have only made it to step 11 in the teacher salary schedule. Class movement is not readily available to me. I am still paying off my student loans from graduate school. After 19 years of teaching, I am still classified as low-income by the state. For each of the last 8 years I have had to think about switching careers and/or leaving Hawai'i because as a teacher I do not earn enough to buy an apartment, save for retirement, or even keep an emergency fund.

Every year I tell myself to keep hanging on, that the most recent teacher contracts have started to improve our situation, or that my turn for adequate compensation is coming, if I can just hold out a little longer. Our last 2-year contract which stripped away our guaranteed PD credits via the +21 hour embedded PD, came as a direct rebuke to all of my hope. If the salary compression isn't rectified soon, and without the guarantee of contract embedded PD credits, there is no way for me to continue living here and teaching our children. Many of the seasoned teachers I know are in the same position. I'm already beyond optimism, but I'm willing to beg you for a chance to keep me and my fellow teachers afloat and part of the education system. My name is Sarah "Mili" Milianta-Laffin. I teach at Ilima Intermediate School in the Campbell-Kapolei Complex, Leeward District on O'ahu. I am submitting testimony in strong support of SB 3209 SD2.

There's a dirty secret that keeps pay low for public school teachers in Hawaii. Some legislators know about this issue, and some do not. The only way to get a serious raise as a public school teacher in Hawaii is to pay for "professional development classes" that allow you to "reclassify" to get a higher pay. But, the classes teachers like me need aren't free – many of them can be quite expensive – like \$500.

I don't get paid enough to afford the classes, therefore I must hunt for the very few free options. They fill up quickly. This makes teacher poverty a "chicken v egg" situation. I don't make enough to pay for classes, that will allow me to make more money.

This bill allows my school to offer me training that counts towards my reclassification and potential raises. I would have gotten a raise this school year but HIDOE removed the 21 hours from our contract so I'm 3 hours short of a pay raise that would have really helped my family.

Please support teachers like me by supporting SB 3209 SD2 to help teachers get closer to a living wage.
