Comments:

We are retired farmers who moved to Ocean View from Washington 2 years ago. In the time we have been here we have been robbed on 3 different occasions. The HPD responded within 30 minutes because they were already in the area responding to another call. Our neighbors on both sides and behind us have also been robbed since we have been here. Our property is 1 1/2 blocks from Hwy 11.

The corner lot across from us had over 2 dozen abandoned vehicles, multiple piles of trash and a frequent location for drug activity. New owners brought in a dozer and pushed everything to the edge of the property where it now lines their neighbor's property with vehicles on their sides and upside down, torn bags of trash and multiple appliances and mattresses.

Last summer our family visited. I was driving 3 blocks from our house with my 8 year old granddaughter when we saw a pack of dogs circle an elderly man on his moped and attack him when he fell off. A friend was walking 2 blocks away and was attacked by 4 dogs. Fortunately someone was near and helped run off the dogs. The injuries required several stitches in his arm and leg and follow up medical visits. Our elderly neighbor let her service dog out on her front lanai two months ago. A pack of dogs came down her driveway from the road and lethally attacked him in front of her.

Mahalo for considering SB3211. Effective laws are already in place to deal with these issues. It's a matter of having the adequate resources to enforce them.

## RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY IN RURAL DISTRICTS

The Department of Budget and Finance (B&F) offers comments on this bill.

Senate Bill No. 3211 makes an unspecified general fund grant-in-aid

appropriation in FY 23 to the County of Hawai'i (COH) for the plans, design, and

construction of a police substation to serve the Hawaiian Ocean View Estates

community, provided that COH contributes a dollar-for-dollar match.

B&F notes that the federal Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act requires that states receiving Elementary and Secondary School

Emergency Relief (ESSER) II funds and Governor's Emergency Education Relief II

funds must maintain state support for:

 Elementary and secondary education in FY 22 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for elementary and secondary education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19; and  Higher education in FY 22 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for higher education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19.

Further, the federal American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act requires that states receiving ARP ESSER funds must maintain state support for:

- Elementary and secondary education in FY 22 and FY 23 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for elementary and secondary education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19; and
- Higher education in FY 22 and FY 23 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for higher education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19.

The U.S. Department of Education has issued rules governing how these maintenance of effort (MOE) requirements are to be administered. B&F will be working with the money committees of the Legislature to ensure that the State of Hawai'i complies with these ESSER MOE requirements.

I am an Admin and/or Moderator for 5 plus animal welfare Facebook pages, regarding lost, found, or stolen pets with the mission of reuniting the pets with their owners. I monitor more than **50 Facebook pages daily** for leads and tips on lost, found and stolen animals.

I have visibility to many other issues posted on these pages. Crimes and violent crimes are very prevalent OceanView, Ka'u areas. Residents who call for assistance typically have to wait or be told their issue is not a priority.

It is critical to have a well-functioning police station central to the criminal activity occurrences. Please approve funding for a police substation in HOVE, Ka'u district which has been underserved for many years.

There is a disconnect between HPD and the community. The presence of Police Officers in a centrally located sub-station is critical to bridging the relationship and building trust between HPD and the Ka'u community, specifically HOVE.

# Testimony in support of SB3211:

My wife and I have been residents of Ocean View in the Ka'u District of Hawaii Island for eleven years. Out home has been burglarized three times and have had property stolen from our property as well for losses of over \$2,500. No one has ever been charged in any of these instances.

I have also assisted three property owners in Ocean View to have squatters removed from their private properties. It is not unusual for an owner to wait three hours for police to respond to a complaint because of a small number of officers in Ka'u and the closest HPD office is nearly an hour south of Ocean View. The process for removing squatters from private property takes days to weeks, sometimes months, to resolve and causes property owners much distress including threats from the trespassers.

There is currently a small space in Ocean View for officers to use on a very limited basis. I believe it may have a restroom inside and a desk. It used to have a desk inside and I've been told it has severely limited communications services. At any rate, the space far from being adequate for officers to use as a substation, both in size and infrastructure.

HPD needs a substation in Ocean View to adequately respond to victims of crime, conduct follow up investigations and receive training. Additional officers are also needed to increase patrol throughout the Ka'u District even though funding for additional officers was appropriated a few years ago. There is not even a Detective assigned to the Ka'u Unit of HPD.

I strongly support SB3211 to designate funds to expand the current space or build a new and fully functional HPD substation in Ocean View.

#### Comments:

Aloha, I would like to testify today in support of this bill (SB 3211), as Coordinator of the Ocean View Neighborhood Watch Group, and as an Ocean View resident since 2005. Over the years that I have lived in my area, the number of residents has increased dramatically, as has the number of crimes committed. Some unofficial estimates of the population of our subdivision alone is 10,000 people. The police officers working in the Ka'u District have to cover the area between Volcano National Park, to just north of Hawaiian Ocean View Estates, which is a huge area, and results in -- at times, very long wait times for residents reporting crimes. For many years we had only one or two officers on each shift, to respond to calls in that entire area. In more recent years we have been provided more officers per shift, but those officers still have many other challenges to deal with, including areas where cell phone coverage, internet coverage, or even basic radio coverage is not available to them. If you are not familiar with our area, the roads run roughly six miles up the mountain and three miles across. Our subdivision alone, is a huge area for police to cover. Currently our officers have a small storefront office with a table, a few chairs, and a restroom. The officers can stop there to write reports, but it is a major strech to call this a "police station". To my understanding, there is no secure internet service in this office, so communications options for officers are very limited. Once an officer makes an arrest, they have to transport the arrestee to the Naalehu Police Station (14 miles away) for booking, then the arrestee must be transported to either Hilo or Kona, which can sometimes take a huge chunk out of an officer's shift, and leaves us with one less officer to respond to calls. Please, please, keep in mind that those of us living in Ocean View, and the surrounding areas in the Ka'u District desperatly need modernization of our police department facilities. We have so many wonderful officer's who work in our district, sometimes putting their lives on the line to protect us - the very least that we can do is to provide them with the basic tools that they need to do the job.
