Senate Bill 3298 proposes to: 1) Establish a working group consisting of the Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources, the Director of Public Safety, and hunters and recreational shooters to determine potential locations and requirements for a shooting facility in the County of Hawaii; 2) Appropriate funds to establish the shooting facility in the County of Hawaii; and 3) Require the County of Hawaii to match funds appropriated on a dollar-to-dollar basis. **The Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) strongly supports this measure.**

The establishment of a multi-use public shooting range on Hawaii Island is much needed to provide a safe and organized facility to practice firearms safety, hunting and recreationally shooting skills. The Department's Division of Conservation and Resources Enforcement and its Hunter Education Program, and other law enforcement agencies will also benefit from this range as it will provide a space to train and maintain their firearms skills at the highest level. The Department of Public Safety (PSD) **supports** Senate Bill (SB) 3298, which proposes to establish a working group to determine potential locations and requirements for a shooting facility in the County of Hawaii; appropriates funds to establish the shooting facility in the County of Hawaii; and requires the County of Hawaii to match funds appropriated on a dollar-to-dollar basis.

RELATING TO SHOOTING FACILITIES

The Department of Budget and Finance (B&F) offers comments on this bill.

Senate Bill No. 3298: establishes a working group within the Department of Land and Natural Resources to determine potential locations and requirements for a shooting facility on the island of Hawai'i; appropriates an unspecified amount of general funds for FY 23 as a grant-in-aid to the County of Hawai'i (COH) for the development of a public shooting facility on the island of Hawai'i; requires the COH to match the appropriated funds; and requires a report to the Legislature.

B&F notes that, with respect to the general fund appropriation in this bill, the federal Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act requires that states receiving Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) II funds and Governor's Emergency Education Relief II funds must maintain state support for:

 Elementary and secondary education in FY 22 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for elementary and secondary education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19; and Higher education in FY 22 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for higher education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19.

Further, the federal American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act requires that states receiving ARP ESSER funds must maintain state support for:

- Elementary and secondary education in FY 22 and FY 23 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for elementary and secondary education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19; and
- Higher education in FY 22 and FY 23 at least at the proportional level of the state's support for higher education relative to the state's overall spending, averaged over FYs 17, 18 and 19.

The U.S. Department of Education has issued rules governing how these maintenance of effort (MOE) requirements are to be administered. B&F will be working with the money committees of the Legislature to ensure that the State of Hawai'i complies with these ESSER MOE requirements.

The Hawaii Firearms Coalition SUPPORTS SB3298.

Having a full-featured shooting range on the Big Island is long overdue. A public shooting range is needed for instructors to teach firearms safety classes, host shooting events/competitions, and ensure hunters can zero and practice with their rifles and shotguns. Our Hawaii County members constantly complain about the lack of a public shooting range where they can practice and train.

A training range is needed with the upcoming US Supreme Court decision in NYSRPA v Bruen which is expected to overturn Hawaii's ban on handgun carry permits. Nationally on average, about 5% of the adult population has a handgun carry permit. It is projected that 7,000 Hawaii County residents will obtain a carry permit and will need a place for training and practice for it. Hawaii County needs a public range capable of handling that need. The current Morita Camp range is deficient for this purpose due to the range layout, lack of classrooms, the need for private shooting areas, and logistics issues.

A shooting complex in Hawaii County would draw people from around the State and overseas to attend competitions, hunting, and training classes. This would benefit the Hawaii county economy. Firearms ownership has grown greatly across the US in the past decade and people will travel to Hawaii for these events. This project would also bring in funds from the Pittman Robertson Act which provides matching Federal funds for range construction.

Please pass SB3298 to provide a safe training area for the community. Bringing the DLNR, County of Hawaii, and firearms community together on this project is the best way forward.
