Chairs Wakai and Moriwaki, Vice Chairs Misalucha and Dela Cruz, and Members of the Committees, thank you for the opportunity to testify on S.B. 3334. The Department of Accounting and General Services (DAGS) support the overall intent of this bill and offers the following comments and concerns.

DAGS appreciates the legislature's overall support of the New Aloha Stadium Entertainment District (NASED) and the additional \$180,000,000 in general obligation funding. We are concerned, however, that the proposed language in Section 11 may not achieve the desired intent to support seamless progress on the Stadium Development District's progress for the following reasons.

Revising the expending authority for the previously appropriated funds may negate the transactions undertaken for funds already delegated by the Stadium Authority to DAGS that are encumbered, especially where encumbered to existing contracts. Instead, DAGS recommends

DAVID Y. IGE GOVERNOR keeping the Stadium Authority as the expending agency, as this designation will be retained wherever they are administratively attached.

DAGS also concurs with, supports, and defers to the Stadium Authority for consideration to address their additional valid concerns as enumerated in their testimony. At this infancy stage of the New Aloha Stadium Entertainment District, the utmost care must be given to ensure the best, most professional opportunities for success are established.

DAGS will continue to coordinate closely with the Stadium Authority and stakeholders to ensure our on-going project efforts coincide with the future goals to bring benefit in the best interests of the State and its people.

Chairs Wakai, Moriwaki, Vice Chairs Misalucha, Dela Cruz, and members of the committees, thank you for the opportunity to submit this testimony with comments on SB 3334.

With much recognition and appreciation, the Stadium Authority (Authority) would like to take this opportunity to thank the legislature and the Department of Accounting and General Services (DAGS) for its many years of continuous support towards building a New Aloha Stadium Entertainment District (NASED) that includes redevelopment of its surrounding land into a vibrant and robust entertainment district. We would not be at this stage of development if not for the collective and coordinated support from these entities working together to reach project completion. Thank you for your continued support.

From a macro perspective, the Authority understands the intent of the legislature in aggregating enterprise agencies as well as centralizing land development expertise and functions under the Department of Economic Development and Tourism (DBEDT). The Authority is supportive of all efforts to continue the positive progress and momentum that has been established that will drive this project's development through completion.

The Authority greatly appreciates the \$350,000,000 in general obligation bond funding required to support the completion of the State of Hawaii's new sports and entertainment facility.

The Authority also offers the following comments on various Sections of this measure and would respectfully appreciate the legislature's consideration of these recommendations:

<u>Regarding Section 5.</u>: The Authority respectfully asks for the legislature's support in exempting the Stadium Development Special Fund from its pro-rata share of the departmental administrative assessment. As the NASED project continues on course through project completion, resources are required to provide for and ensure a seamless transition from its current operating model, through an interim decommission/demolition operation, and finally to a new NASED operating model. During this multi-phase process, the Authority recognizes that it will continue to require funding such that all efforts to increase revenue and decrease expenses/fees are imperative; this would include an exemption of the administrative assessment fee. An exemption will most assuredly help the Authority address its operating requirements and expenses related to the entire multi-phase transition management process that it now faces and will continue to face in the months ahead. Exemption from the administrative assessment fee will help reduce the need for the Authority to seek additional funding to address the transition management funding requirements.

<u>Regarding Section 7.</u>: "The Authority currently values the presence and participation of the University of Hawaii and the Department of Education as non-voting members. As regular tenants of the facility, the Authority notes that amending their participation to voting members may increase the perceived or real conflicts of interest in the execution of its responsibilities. Furthermore, there are no other regular tenants currently seated on the board; therefore, the Authority recommends that the ex-officio members from the two agencies remain as non-voting members of the Authority."

It is our understanding that, by separate measure, the Legislature is proposing to amend language in Section 109-1(a) that clarifies and identifies the total number of board members that comprise the Stadium Authority, the district in which two (2) board members represent, as well as defines the area in which two (2) members shall reside. We understand and appreciate the Legislature's support in its review and update of existing statutory language and its alignment with any proposed language that will meet Legislative intent.

<u>**Regarding Section 11.</u>**: Act 146, SLH 2021 designated the Authority as the expending authority for capital improvement projects authorized by the Act. It allowed for delegation of this expending authority, with the approval of the Governor, to other State agencies. This provision has allowed the Authority to delegate the transfer of funds and project implementation to the subject matter expert – DAGS.</u>

The proposed language in Section 11 seeks to replace the Authority as the expending agency and transfers this responsibility to DBEDT. In doing so, the Authority is concerned over whether it will be problematic with appropriated funds that have already been delegated to and encumbered by DAGS. The Authority respectfully requests that the Authority remain as the expending agency, to include its current authority to delegate implementation and transfer of funds remain unchanged. We believe this will allow the process to continue seamlessly and minimize the likelihood of delays in sorting out a new process.

The Authority defers to DAGS and the Legislature on the effectiveness of language pertaining to the lapse date for the unencumbered general obligation bond appropriation. It is the Authority's understanding that there is a technical concern with the effective date of June 30, 2024.

On behalf of the Stadium Authority Board, I thank you for your ongoing support of the NASED project and respectfully ask for your consideration of our concerns noted above. Thank you for the opportunity to provide this testimony with comments on S.B. 3334.

The Land Use Research Foundation of Hawaii (LURF) is a private, non-profit research and trade association whose members include major Hawaii landowners, developers, and utility companies. LURF's mission is to advocate for reasonable, rational, and equitable land use planning, legislation and regulations that encourage well-planned economic growth and development, while safeguarding Hawaii's significant natural and cultural resources, and public health and safety.

LURF appreciates the opportunity to express its **support of the general intent of SB 3334**.

SB 3334. LURF agrees with the introducers of SB 3334, that the effective, efficient, and appropriate development and redevelopment of state lands is an important priority, for the purposes of economic development and for the creation of new multi-use facilities and housing opportunities that are of benefit to the public. However, as SB 3334 explains, at present, the state's expertise with multi-use land development is scattered around state government in various offices and departments.

The primary intent of this bill is to consolidate the State's land development functions within DBEDT, which could centralize the State's land development expertise and thereby more efficiently use the State's limited financial resources and personnel. The stated purpose of this bill is to improve the operation of state government by: (l) In Part II, restoring the DBEDT director to the HTA Board of directors as an ex officio voting member; and (2) In Part III, transferring the Stadium Authority and the School Facilities Authority to DBEDT.

LURF's Position. LURF **supports the general intent of SB 3334** because the measure makes a significant effort to centralize the State's land development expertise, make efficient use of the State's financial resources and personnel, and implement the plans for major land development projects. However, LURF believes that the continued collaboration between the legislative proponents, departments, as well as input from all stakeholders regarding such transfers, are necessary to successfully implement this undertaking.

For the reasons stated above, LURF supports the intent of SB 3334, and respectfully urges your favorable consideration of this measure and any necessary amendments thereto consistent with these comments.

The SFA respectfully requests your committee defer consideration of part IV of the bill until such time that the SFA is well established and fully operational as the operations over the next year can better inform future decisions on the appropriate placement of the authority.
