S.B. 497 S.D. 1 RELATING TO COMMERCIAL VEHICLES

House Committee on Judiciary and Hawaiian Affairs

The Department of Transportation (DOT) **supports with concerns** S.B. 497 S.D. 1 to prohibit commercial passenger vehicles weighing more than 10,000 pounds from using the left-most lane on any roadway with two or more lanes with exceptions for commercial vehicles turning left or exiting. Although S.B. 497 S.D. 1 has the potential to improve traffic flow and increase safety, the DOT has the following concerns on a blanket lane use restriction:

- 1. Section 291C-49(3) H.R.S. provides the authority necessary to restrict lane use through official signing;
- 2. Most roadways on Oahu were built prior to today's complete street or modern design and access management criteria. S.B. 497 S.D. 1 will decrease the safety of our most vulnerable roadway users by placing more commercial passenger vehicles in the same or adjacent space they use. Many of our multi-lane roadways do not have adequate continuous bicycle and/or pedestrian facilities.

The Department of Transportation Services (DTS) of the City and County of Honolulu (City) supports Senate Bill 497, Senate Draft 1 (SB 497, SD1) relating to commercial vehicles.

DTS **supports the intent** of SB 497, SD1, which proposes to prevent large commercial vehicles from impeding the flow of traffic by restricting their operation in the left lane of multi-lane roadways. DTS supports the exemption provided to buses and van pools operated by the counties from the bill's restrictions since City buses and Handi-Vans, which serve paratransit riders, operate on a schedule that the riders depend upon. Allowing City buses and Handi-Vans the flexibility to continue to use the left lane in order to meet the scheduled stops will best serve the general ridership.

Aloha Chair Tarnas, Vice Chair Takayama, and Honorable Committee Members:

I present this testimony SUPPORTING SB497, SD1—as amended, but with date changes which: A) Prohibits commercial vehicles weighing 10,000 or more pounds from driving in the left lane on all roadways with two lanes unless the commercial vehicle is able to maintain speed with existing traffic flow and is in the process of passing another vehicle; B) Provides exceptions for commercial vehicles turning or exiting left, or preparing to turn or exit left; and C) Prohibits commercial vehicles weighing ten thousand pounds or more from driving in the left lane on all roadways with three or more lanes with the exception of City buses and City van pool vehicles.

As a resident of Wai`anae since approximately 1997 (I was born/raised in Aiea), I have witnessed first-hand the expansion of the Hawai'i highway system between the Leeward Coast and East Honolulu. I firmly support this bill since my husband is a former long-haul trucker who hauled California produce to Florida and the East Coast AND Florida orange juice to the West Coast 2-3 times per week to pay for land in Hawai'i to farm. I noticed on many road trips with my parents and also my husband across the United States what I believe is an ideal traffic model in California that prohibits commercial vehicles from travelling in the number 3 to number 5 lanes (left to far left lanes). Any commercial vehicle was restricted to travel in the two right hand lanes (lanes 1 and 2) - only allowing for passing slower vehicles in lane 3. In the case of Hawai'i's highway system and in my experience driving between Wai'anae and Honolulu since 1989, the State needs to impose similar commercial vehicle standards so that such vehicles should NOT travel in the left lane at ALL unless: a) passing other vehicles to their right; and/or b) in the case of buses, van pool/Handivan vehicles UNLESS such vehicles can maintain the same speed as other traffic. I believe, however, any form of TRUCK should be restricted to the 2 right lanes on 3-plus-lane-roads OR 1 right lane on 2-lane roads. In my experience, these restrictions will improve traffic flow, decrease traffic congestion, and assures the safety of all highway/roadway users.

For these key reasons I urge your Committee to please pass SB497, SD 1 – and to please change the effective date to ideally 07/01/2023, BUT not later than 07/01/2024 as ALL of us who use Hawai'i's road and state highway system share an interest in improving traffic flow and reducing motor vehicle collisions as soon as possible.

This is especially important on narrower roadways or when traffic is moving fast.

My family and I have resided in Wai`anae since approximately 1989 and witnessed first-hand the expansion of the Hawai'i highway system between the Leeward Coast and East Honolulu. My experience hauling loads through all 50 States and a 1-million-milesafe-driving record exposed me to what I believe is an ideal traffic model in California that prohibits commercial vehicles from travelling in the number 3 to number 5 lanes (left to far left lanes). Any commercial vehicle was restricted to travel in the two right hand lanes (lanes 1 and 2) – only allowing for passing slower vehicles in lane 3.
