The Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism (DBEDT) supports SCR 118, SD1, which requests continuation of SCR 242, SLH 2021, to convene a creative resurgence task force required to examine and determine measures, including recommendations to establish policies and programs, which foster creativity and innovation through the arts, culture, and humanities in the state.
