REQUESTING THE HAWAII HOUSING FINANCE AND DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE ON AFFORDABLE HOUSING PERMITTING AND TO CONDUCT A STUDY OF COUNTY ORDINANCES ON HOUSING FINANCE AND DEVELOPMENT.

HHFDC <u>offers the following comments</u> on S.C.R. 161/ S.R. 153. HHFDC recognizes the need to streamline the various existing State and county policies and procedures for affordable housing development.

Due to HHFDC's current in-house capacity constraints, we would need to contract with a consultant to facilitate a permitting process task force and conduct the requested study on county ordinances on housing finance and development. Due to the estimated time required to procure a consultant (six months) and complete the study and task-force activities (one year), a report of finding and recommendations would not be completed until the second half of 2023. The estimated funding required for a consultant contract is \$250,000.
