I strongly support SCR33.

I was up to 10 gallons of blood donated in 2000 when the FDA sequestered those of us who had been in Germany (Army) in the mid to late '80's due to a fear of Mad Cow Disease.

Several years ago now the FDa lifted the ban because no one in that group has gotten sick, and there is no test to confirm contamination.

There are hundreds of us (military and Retired military) who fall into this category. As Red Cross Volunteer for over 14 years, I know for a fact Red Cross who manages the blood supply on the mainland has lifted this ban (as recommended by FDA several years ago no), while Blood Bank Hawaii has not and is sandbagging in the middle of a severe Hawaii Blood shortage. I am O+ ... as many of us and we are universal donors.

As a Monopoly, BBH is remiss and irresponsible NOT to comply with FDA guidance to enhance our blood supply. I have been down several times only to be refused because I am honest and acknowledged being in Germany '83 to '86. By the way - the Germans are donating blood.
