# TESTIMONY TO THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON COMMERCE AND CONSUMER PROTECTION

Senate Concurrent Resolution 61– Requesting the Auditor to Assess the Social and Financial Effects of Mandating Health Insurance Coverage for Hearing Aids

The Disability and Communication Access Board (DCAB) supports Senate Concurrent Resolution 61. This resolution requests the auditor to assess the social and financial effects of mandating health insurance coverage for hearing aids.

Currently, private health insurance plans provide partial coverage for eyeglasses to correct vision, and some provide partial coverage for hearing aids. Hearing is an equally important sense upon which an individual depends for communication.

Hawaii Revised Statutes §23-51 requires that before a bill is passed to mandate insurance coverage for hearing aids, the auditor must prepare a report that assesses both the social and financial effects of requiring coverage. Please adopt these resolutions so that a bill may be considered by the legislature.

#### Re: SCR 61/SR 56 REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO ASSESS THE SOCIAL AND FINANCIAL EFFECTS OF MANDATING HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR HEARING AIDS.

Chair Baker and committee members, thank you for this opportunity to provide testimony on SCR 61/SR 56 which requests the auditor to assess the social and financial effects of requiring health insurers to offer coverage hearing aids.

#### Kaiser Permanente Hawaii supports this resolution.

We support asking the legislative auditor to study the social and financial impacts of this proposed mandate for hearing aid benefits. We offer for your consideration a few additional clauses that may make the auditor's study more useful.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to identify the number of residents in Hawaii in the target population who suffer hearing loss based on national prevalence rates, in order to determine who may be impacted by the cost of hearing aids; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to research public and private entities that provide coverage for hearing aids to determine what is currently being used as a standard for frequency of replacement and what, if any, cost limitations are placed on the hearing aid coverage benefit. This research should examine whether different standards are applied to adults compared to children in need of these devices. Entities for this research should

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to examine current medically necessary standards of care used to determine what type of hearing aid best suits an individual with hearing loss. An examination of the existing technology in hearing aids and possible future technology should be examined.
