## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII STATE LESBIAN, GAY, BISEXUAL, TRANSGENDER, QUEER, PLUS COMMISSION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to title 20 to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	HAWAII STATE LESBIAN, GAY, BISEXUAL, TRANSGENDER, QUEER, PLUS
6	COMMISSION
7	§ -1 Findings and purpose. The legislature finds that
8	there is a need to establish a body to improve the State's
9	interface with members of the lesbian, gay, bisexual,
10	transgender, queer, plus community; identify the short- and
11	long-range needs of its members; and ensure that there is an
12	effective means of researching, planning, and advocating for the
13	equity of this population in all aspects of state government.
14	Accordingly, the purpose of this chapter is to establish a
15	commission to provide for a statewide program, on a permanent
16	and continuing basis, on the status of lesbian, gay, bisexual,
17	transgender, gueer, plus individuals in Hawaii.

2 "Commission" means the Hawaii state lesbian, gay, bisexual, 3 transgender, queer, plus commission. 4 "Lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, plus" includes any individual who identifies as a member of the lesbian, gay, 5 bisexual, transgender, or queer community, or any individual who 6 identifies as a member of a sexual or gender minority, including 7 intersex, asexual, or pansexual individuals. 8 -3 Hawaii state lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, 9 queer, plus commission; membership. (a) There is established 10 the Hawaii state lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, 11 plus commission within the department of human services for 12 13 administrative purposes. 14 (b) The commission shall consist of the following: 15 (1) Six ex officio, nonvoting members or their designees, 16 including the: 17 (A) Superintendent of education; 18 (B) President of the University of Hawaii system; 19 (C) Director of labor and industrial relations; 20 (D) Director of human resources development; 21 (E) Director of human services; and

1		(F) Director of health; and
2	(2)	Eight voting members who shall be appointed by the
3		governor in accordance with section 26-34; provided
4		that of these eight members:
5		(A) One member shall be from the county of Hawaii;
6		(B) One member shall be from the county of Kauai;
7		(C) One member shall be from the county of Maui;
8		(D) Four members shall be from the city and county of
9		Honolulu; and
10		(E) One member shall represent the Hawaii sexual and
11		gender minority workgroup of the department of
12		health.
13	(c)	The governor shall appoint members of the commission:
14	(1)	On the basis of their interest and knowledge in, and
15		their ability to make contributions to, the solution
16		of problems relating to the status of the lesbian,
17		gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, plus community; and
18	(2)	That reflect the diversity of the lesbian, gay,
19		bisexual, transgender, queer, plus community by
20		including individuals from different lesbian, gay,
21		bisexual, transgender, queer, plus identities.

2	annually from the eight appointed members of the commission. A
3	quorum to do business or validate any act of the commission
4	shall consist of a majority of the eight appointed members of
5	the commission.
6	§ -4 Compensation. The members of the commission shall
7	serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses,
8	including travel expenses, necessary for the performance of
9	their duties.
10	§ -5 Powers and duties of the commission. The
11	commission shall:
12	(1) Act as a central clearinghouse and coordinating body
13	for governmental and nongovernmental activities and
14	information relating to the status of the lesbian,
15	gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, plus community in
16	the State;
17	(2) Create public awareness and understanding of the
18	responsibilities, needs, potentials, and contributions
19	of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer,
20	plus community and their roles in the changing
21	society;

(d) A chairperson of the commission shall be elected

1	(3)	Recommend registrative and administrative action on
2		equal treatment and opportunities for members of the
3		lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, plus
4		community;
5	(4)	Encourage a long-range program of education of members
6		of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer,
7		plus community in their political rights and
8		responsibilities, particularly with respect to their
9		voting duties;
10	(5)	Maintain contacts with appropriate federal, state,
11		local, and international agencies concerned with the
12		status of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender,
13		queer, plus community;
14	(6)	Cooperate and collaborate with national groups on the
15		status of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender,
16		queer, plus community and arrange for participation by
17		representatives of the State in White House
18		conferences and other national conferences;
19	(7)	Administer funds allocated for the commission's work,
20		including accepting, disbursing, and allocating funds
21		that may become available from other governmental and

1		private sources; provided that all funds shall be
2		disbursed or allocated in compliance with any specific
3		designation stated by the donor; provided further that
4		in the absence of any specific designation, the funds
5		shall be disbursed or allocated to projects related to
6		any of the purposes of this chapter; and
7	(8)	Submit to the governor and legislature an annual
8		report with recommendations."
9	SECT	ON 2. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
