## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WILDLIFE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 195D-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
3	"(b) (1) Except as otherwise provided by law, the board,
4	upon recommendation from the department, in
5	cooperation with other state, federal, county, or
6	private organizations and landowners, after a public
7	hearing on the island affected, and upon an
8	affirmative vote of $[not]$ no less than two-thirds of
9	its authorized membership, may enter into a habitat
10	conservation plan, if it determines that:
11	(A) The plan will further the purposes of this
12	chapter by protecting, maintaining, restoring, or
13	enhancing identified ecosystems, natural
14	communities, or habitat types upon which
15	endangered, threatened, proposed, or candidate
16	species depend within the area covered by the
17	plan:

1	(B) The plan will increase the l	ikelihood of recovery
2	of the endangered or threate	ned species that are
3	the focus of the plan; and	·
4	(C) The plan satisfies all the r	equirements of this
5	chapter.	
6	In the event the board votes to e	nter into a habitat
7	conservation plan for which the m	ajority of the
8	endangered species recovery commi	ttee recommended
9	disapproval, the board may not en	ter into the habitat
10	conservation plan unless the plan	is approved by a
11	two-thirds majority vote of both	houses of the
12	legislature. Habitat conservation	n plans may allow
13	conservation rental agreements, h	abitat banking, and
14	direct payments. Any habitat cor	servation plan
15	approved pursuant to this section	shall be based on
16	the best available scientific and	dother reliable data

13	(C)	Identify the steps that will be taken to minimize
14		and mitigate all negative impacts, including
15		without limitation the impact of any authorized
16		incidental take, with consideration of the full
17		range of the species on the island so that
18		cumulative impacts associated with the take can
19		be adequately assessed; and the funding that will
20		be available to implement those steps;

1	(D)	Identify those measures or actions to be
2		undertaken to protect, maintain, restore, or
3		enhance the ecosystems, natural communities, or
4		habitat types within the plan area; a schedule
5		for implementation of the measures or actions;
6		and an adequate funding source to ensure that the
7		actions or measures, including monitoring, are
8		undertaken in accordance with the schedule;
9	(E)	Be consistent with the goals and objectives of
10		any approved recovery plan for any endangered
11		species or threatened species known or reasonably
12		expected to occur in the ecosystems, natural
13		communities, or habitat types in the plan area;
14	(F)	Provide reasonable certainty that the ecosystems,
15		natural communities, or habitat types will be
16		maintained in the plan area, throughout the life
17		of the plan, in sufficient quality, distribution,
18		and extent to support within the plan area those
19		species typically associated with the ecosystems,
20		natural communities, or habitat types, including
21		any endangered, threatened, proposed, and

1	candidate species known or reasonably expected to
2	be present in the ecosystems, natural
3	communities, or habitat types within the plan
4	area;
5 <u>(G</u>	) Include an agreement to enter into and maintain
6	an annual service contract with a stand-by and
7	response facility available to provide emergency
8	medical and rehabilitation services to native
9	wildlife affected by activities undertaken within
10	the plan area;
[ <del>(G)</del>	-] (H) Contain objective, measurable goals, the
12	achievement of which will contribute
13	significantly to the protection, maintenance,
14	restoration, or enhancement of the ecosystems,
15	natural communities, or habitat types; time
16	frames within which the goals are to be achieved;
17	provisions for monitoring (such as field sampling
18	techniques), including periodic monitoring by
19	representatives of the department or the
20	endangered species recovery committee, or both;
21	and provisions for evaluating progress in

1	i	achieving the goals quantitatively and
2	·	qualitatively; and
3	[ <del>(H)</del> ]	(I) Provide for an adaptive management strategy
4		that specifies the actions to be taken
5	1	periodically if the plan is not achieving its
6		goals."
7	SECTION 2.	Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
8	and stricken.	New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 3.	This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
