## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ABANDONED VEHICLES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the number of
  abandoned and derelict vehicles on public streets throughout the
  State remains a major issue. Abandoned vehicles present a
  widespread environmental hazard and are a public eyesore that
  create unsafe and unhealthy conditions for Hawaii's residents.
  Abandoned vehicles further adversely impact the availability of

- 9 stems from the ease of abandoning vehicles, leading to

legal parking in many areas of the State.

- 10 individuals having multiple abandoned vehicles registered under
- 11 their name. The counties are inundated with complaints about
- 12 abandoned and derelict vehicles and are often burdened with
- 13 fronting the cost of towing and disposing these vehicles, with
- 14 no means to recoup the costs. The legislature additionally
- 15 finds that more needs to be done to deter and curtail
- 16 individuals from abandoning their vehicles by expanding
- 17 penalties for those who have multiple abandoned vehicles.



1 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to make a person 2 who is the registered owner of a vehicle that was deemed 3 abandoned or derelict subject to a tiered fine system. 4 SECTION 2. Chapter 290, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended by adding a new section to part III to be appropriately 6 designated and to read as follows: 7 "\$290- Abandoned vehicles; repeat offender; penalty. A 8 person who is the registered owner of a vehicle that was deemed 9 abandoned or derelict pursuant to this chapter shall be subject 10 to a fine for each vehicle as follows: 11 (1) For the third violation, a fine of no more than 12 \$; 13 (2) For a fourth violation within years of a previous 14 violation, a fine of no more than \$ ; and 15 (3) For a fifth or subsequent violation within years 16 of the last violation, a fine of no more than **17** \$ ." 18 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 19 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 20 begun before its effective date. 21 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

1 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
